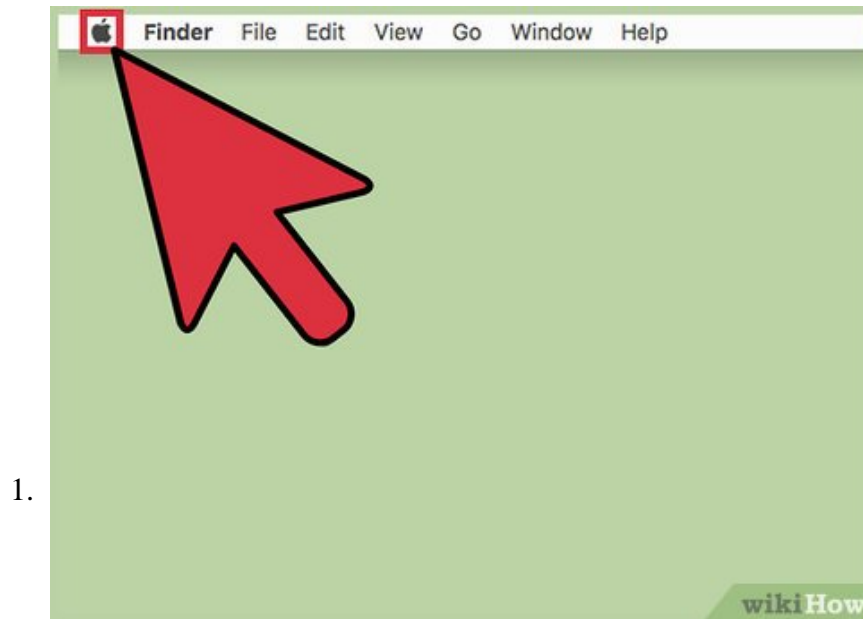


# How to Change the Color of Menu Buttons on a Mac

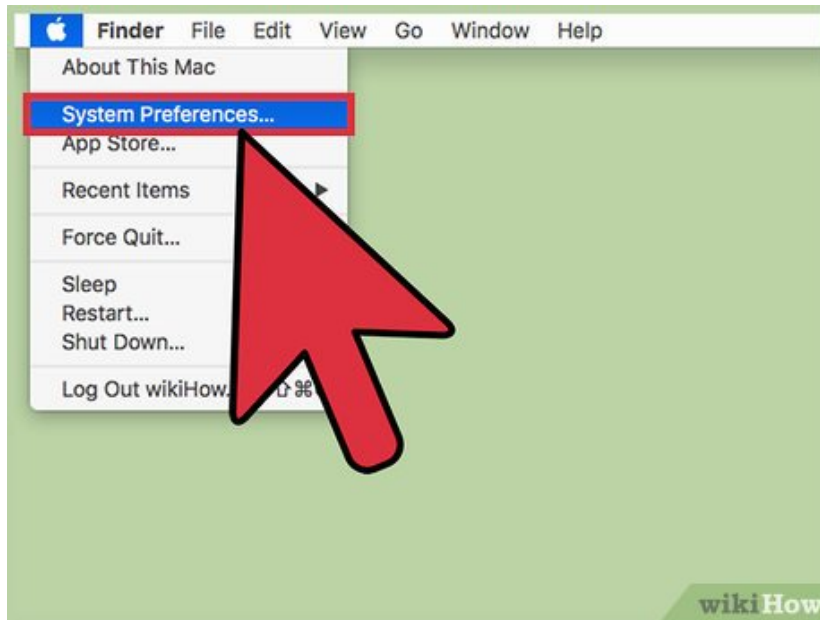

**Click on the Apple menu.** It's the apple logo at the top left of the menu bar.



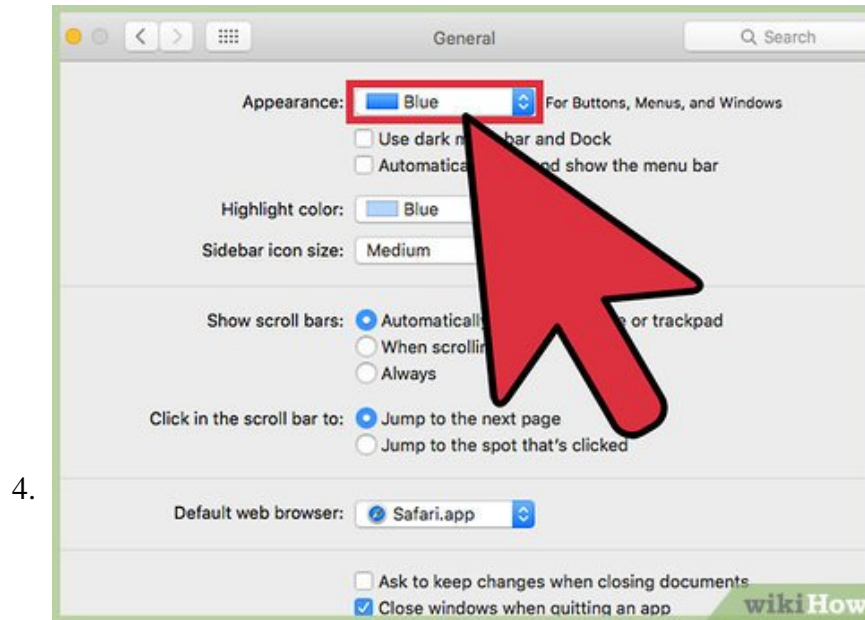

Click **System Preferences**.

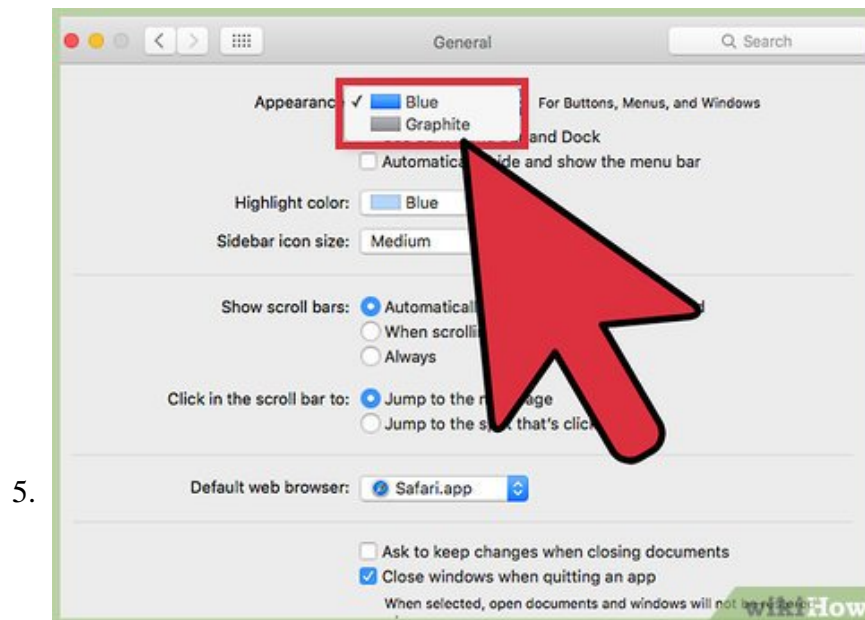

Click the "Appearance" drop-down menu.

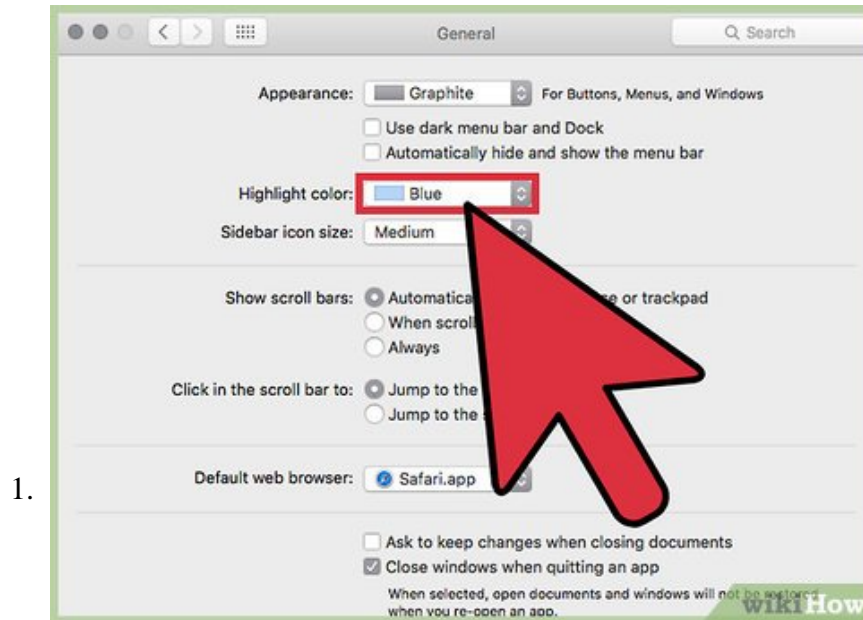


Click on a color. You can choose from either Blue or Graphite.

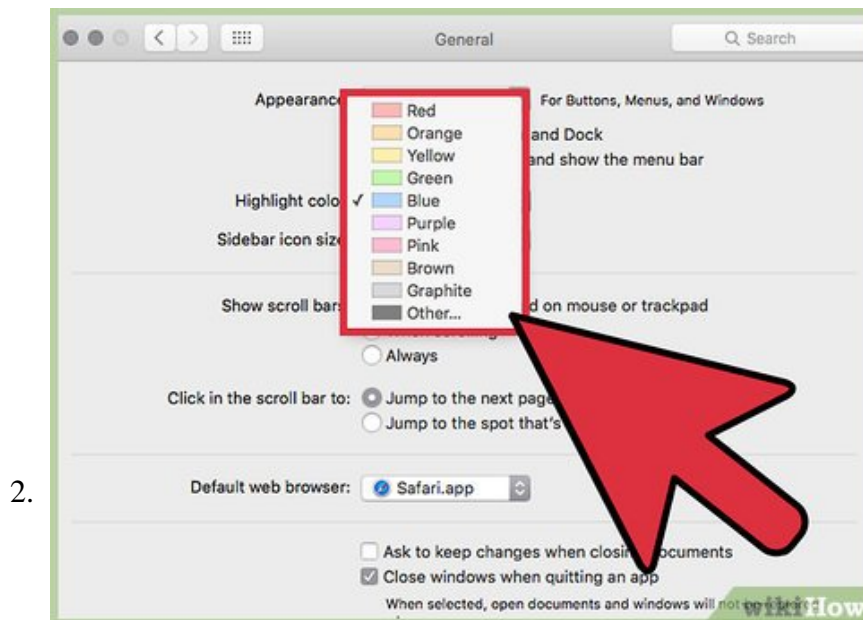
1. This change will affect the color of buttons, menus, and windows.

## Changing the Highlight Color

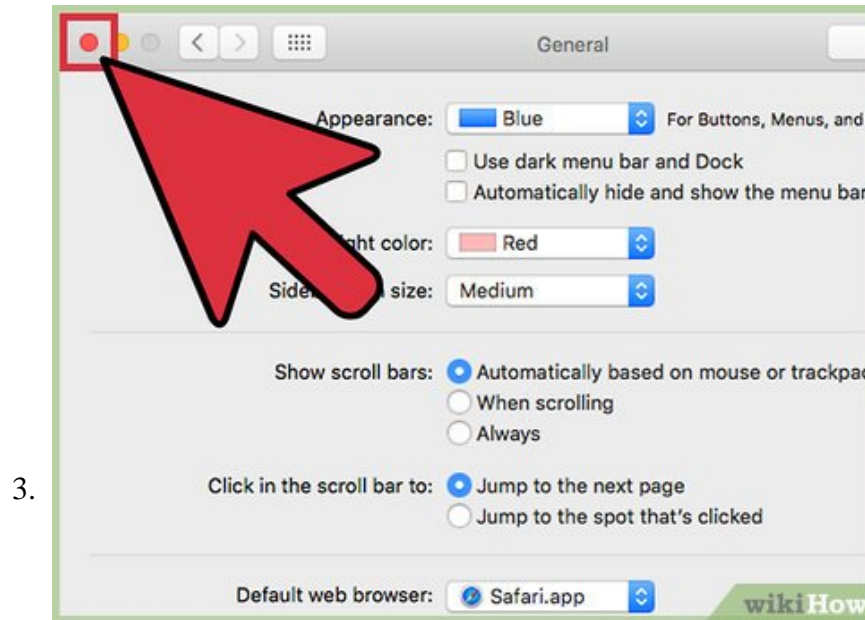


**Click the "Highlight color" drop-down menu.**
