

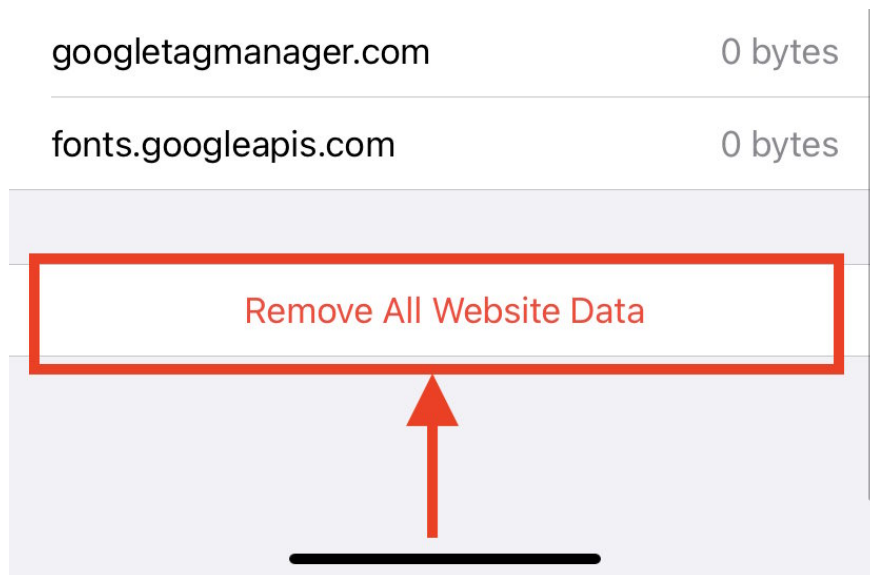
How to clear iPad cache to increase storage capacity

During the time of using applications on the iPad, temporary folders help the website to work quickly when you open. This will sometimes affect the speed of use or if the cache is corrupted, it can lead to the application crashing error. Below is a guide to clearing the iPad cache.

How to Clear iPad Safari Browser Cache

You access the **Settings application** then click on **the Safari browser** to proceed to clear the cache. In the browser interface, scroll down below, **select Advanced** then click **Remove All Website Data** below the interface and **select Remove Now** to perform.

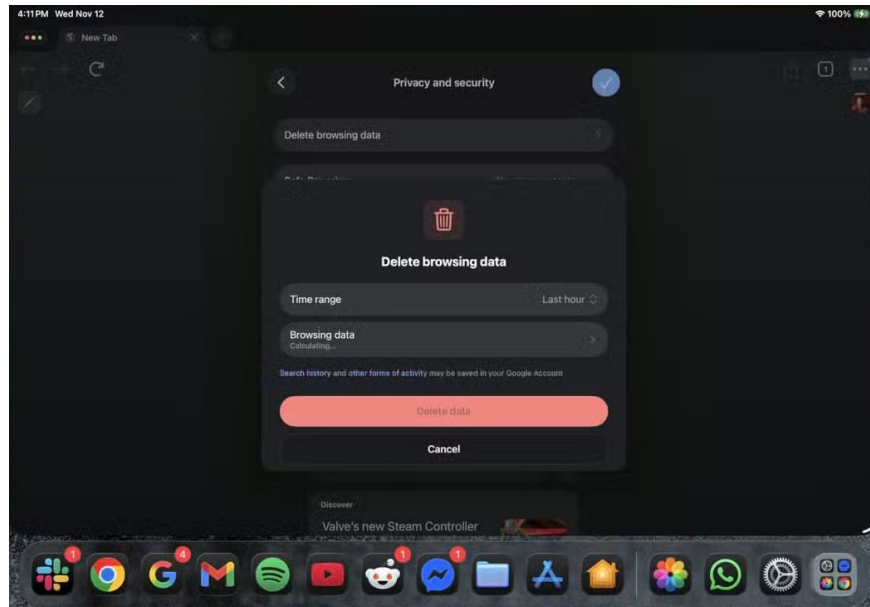


Instructions for clearing Chrome browser cache on iPad

You open the Chrome browser then in the right corner, we click on **the 3 dots icon** . Now the user clicks on **the gear icon** and selects **Privacy and security** .

Here you **select Delete browsing data** then select **delete All time** to remove cache from the past until now.

In the Browsing data section, select the data you want to delete, including Cached images and files, and probably Cookies to remove the Chrome browser cache on iPad.



Restart your iPad device

There is no specific software or option that can easily clear the iPadOS cache, but you can try restarting your device once a month or even once every two months. If your iPad is running slow or lagging, you can restart it once a week.
