

How to copy bookmarks on the Safari browser

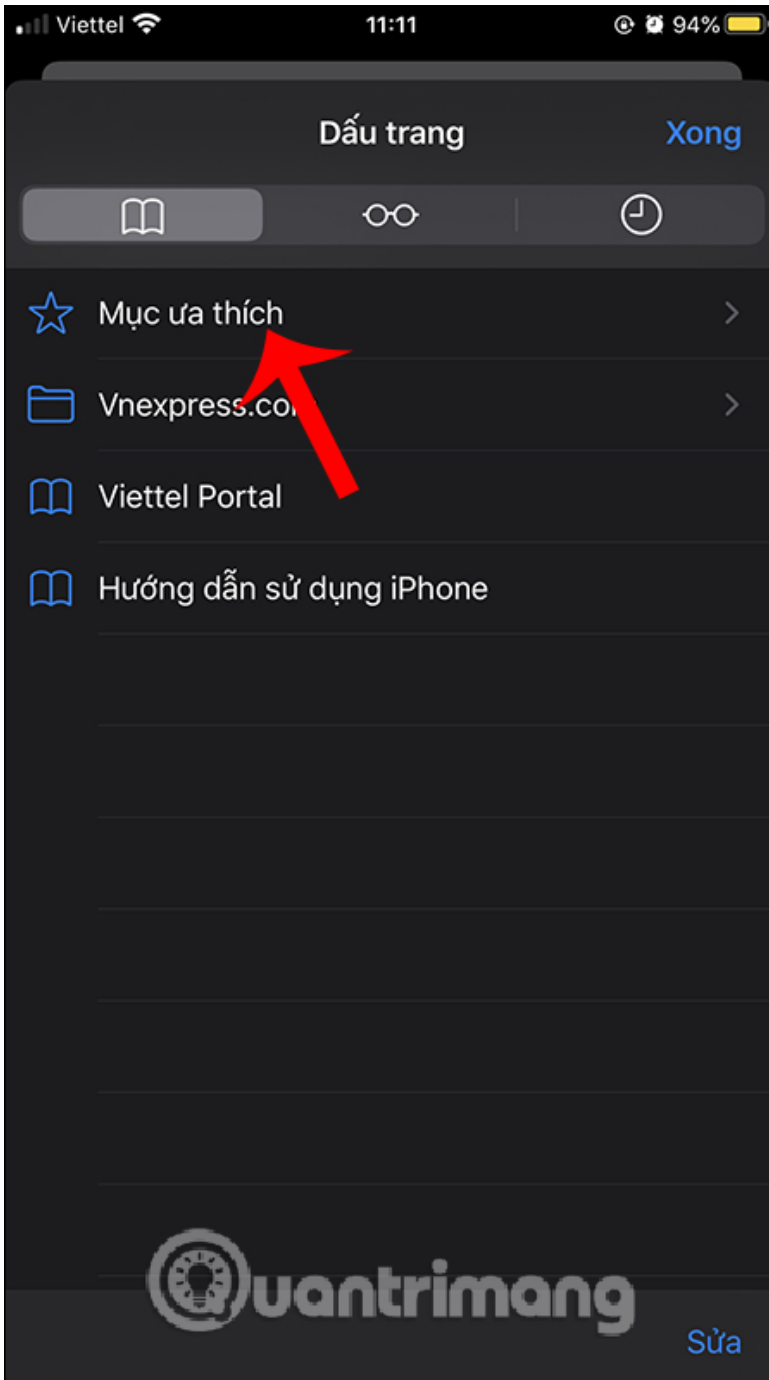
Favorite pages on Safari can be copied and saved to another interface when saved.

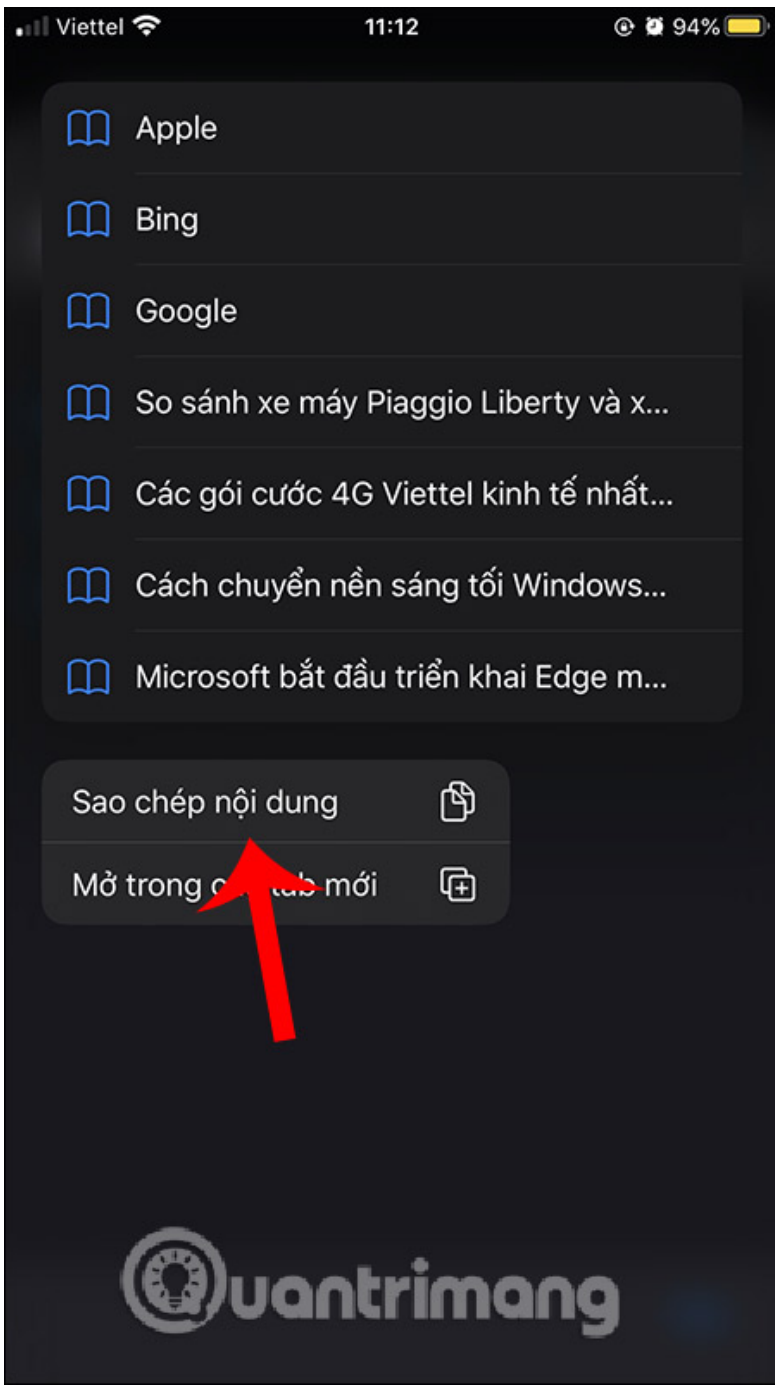
When you surf the web on Safari you'll find great websites and want to save. Those bookmarks we can completely copy and paste to any interface like Notes application to use. Also by default, the bookmark is saved in favorites, but users can completely change to another saved folder to your liking. These new Safari browser features have all been updated from iOS 13 onwards, used for both iPadOS and Mac OS. The following article will guide you how to copy bookmarks on Safari.

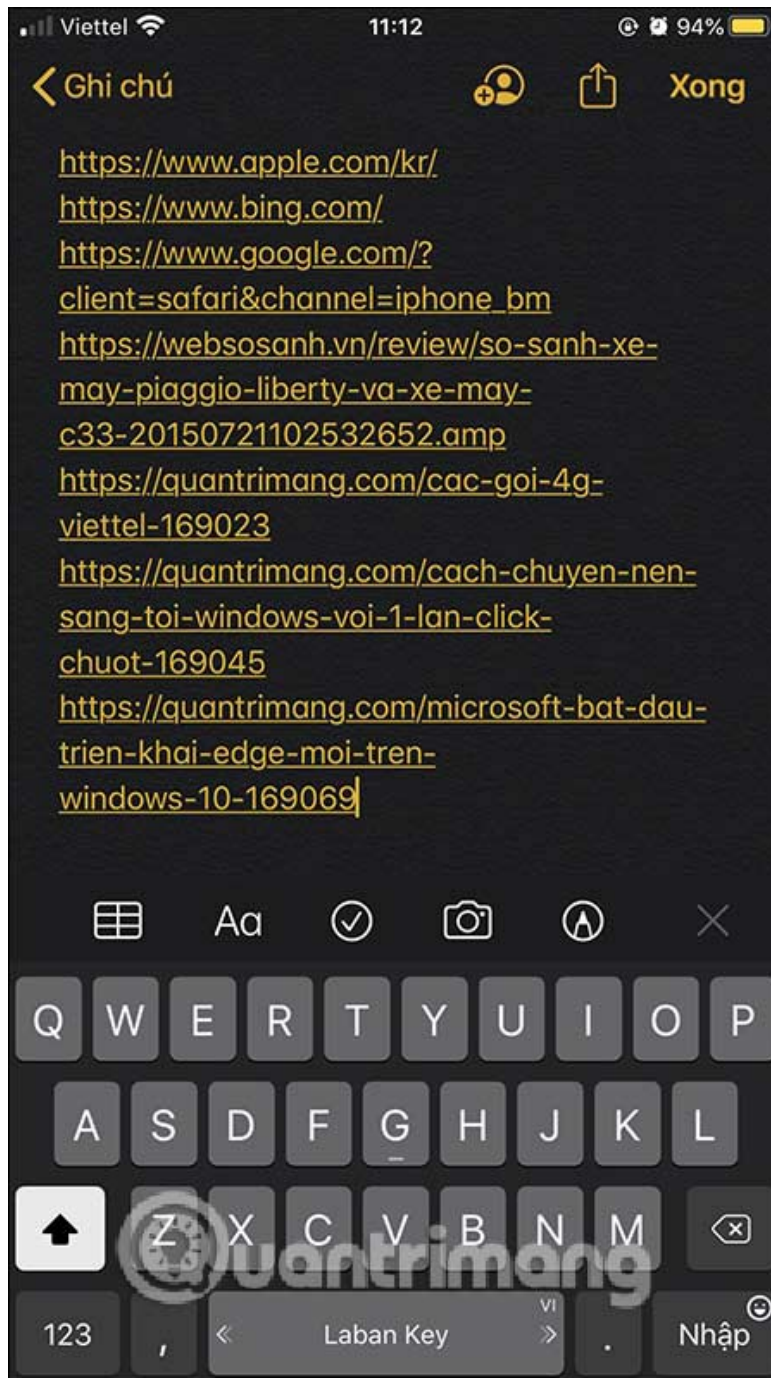
Instructions for copying bookmarks on Safari

Step 1:

In Safari we click on **the book icon** to enter **the bookmarks interface** on the browser. Here you **press and hold on Favorites** . We will then see all the pages we have clicked, along with two different options. Click on **Copy content** . Now **open any interface** and then **click paste** to finish. The URL of the preferred web page to display.





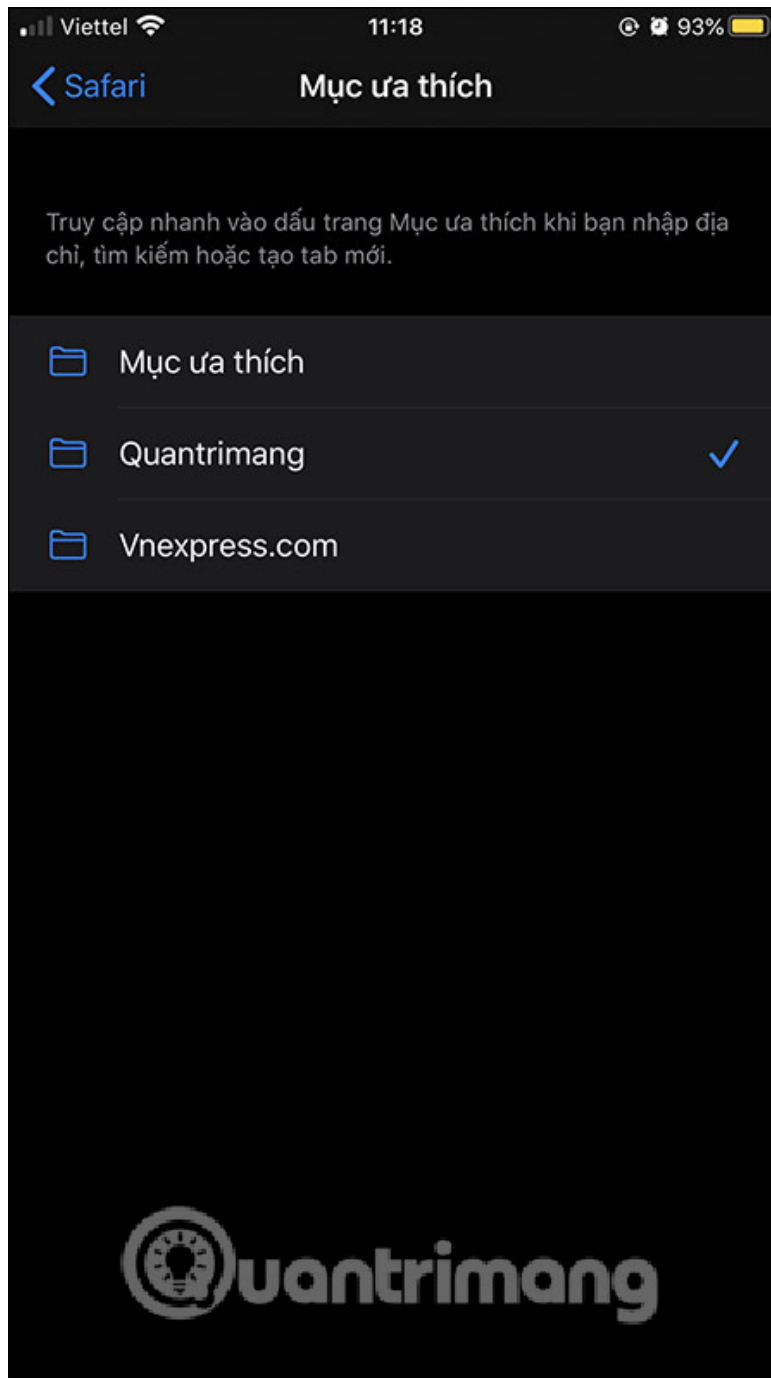


Step 2:

To **change the folder that stores bookmarks list** in Safari, we change the device's settings. Users go to **Settings** on the device and then select **the Safari browser** . Next we click on **the Favorites section** . Then we just need to **tick the folder hosting site is new** .
