

How to create device management shortcuts on Windows

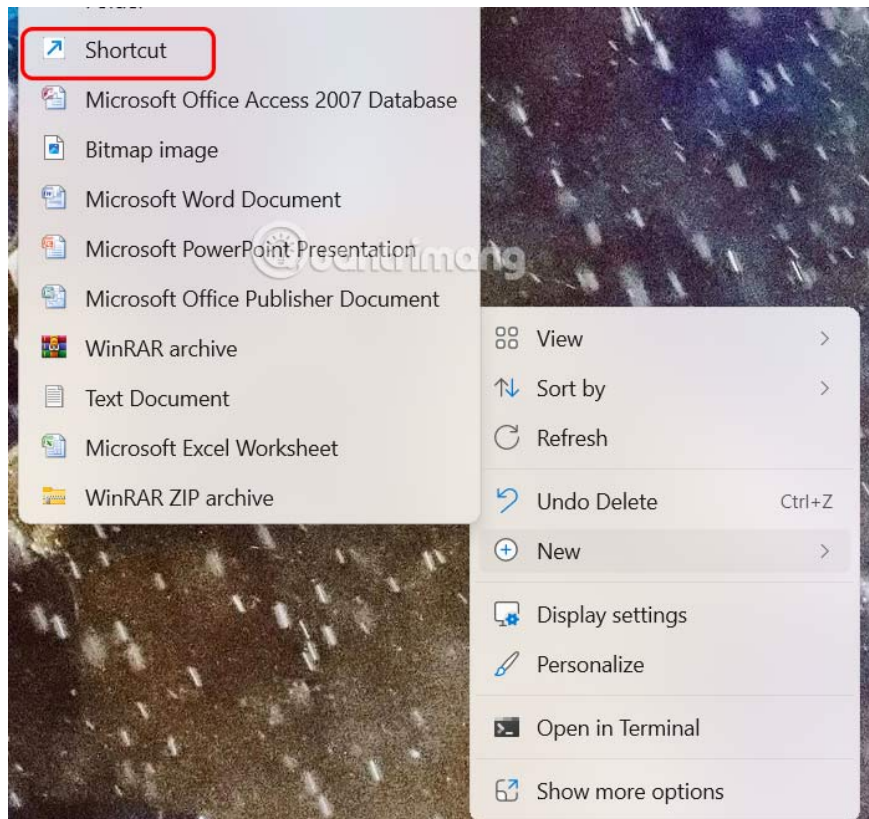
Microsoft provides many ways to access the device manager, but creating a shortcut makes it easier for us to launch the tool.

Instructions for creating Windows device management shortcuts


Step 1:

Right-click on an empty space on your computer and select **New > Shortcut**.



Step 2:

Display the new interface at **Type the location of the item** you enter **devmgmt.msc** then click Next below.



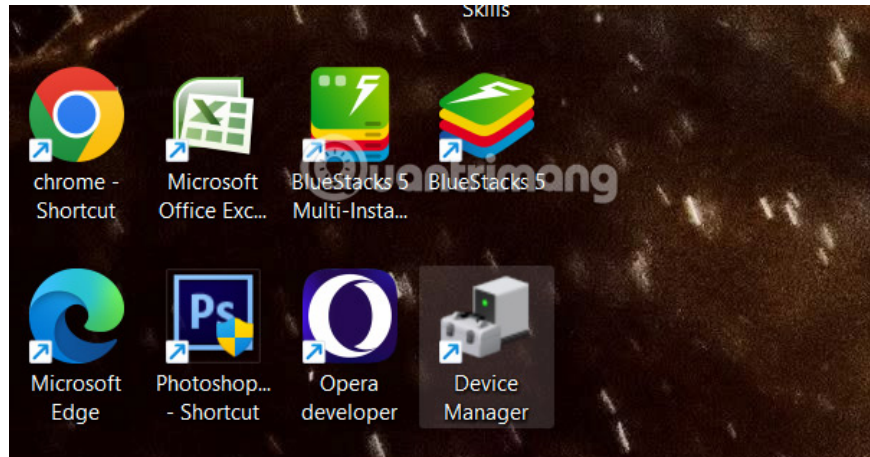

Click Finish to create the shortcut.

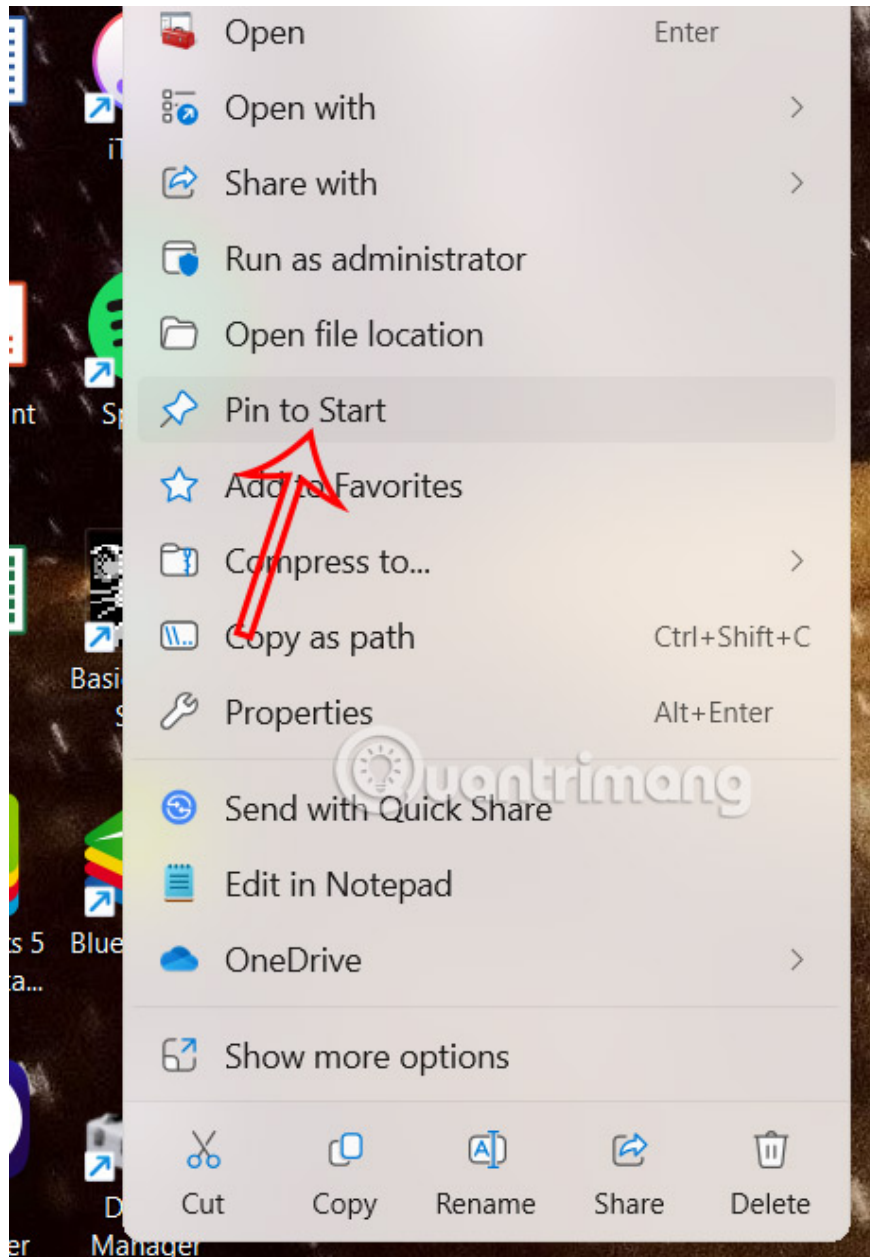

As a result you should see the device manager shortcut on your computer screen.



Step 3:

You can also pin the device manager shortcut to the taskbar. Right-click on the shortcut and select the Pin to taskbar option to pin it to the Taskbar.



You can then quickly access the device manager from the Taskbar, or via a desktop shortcut.
