

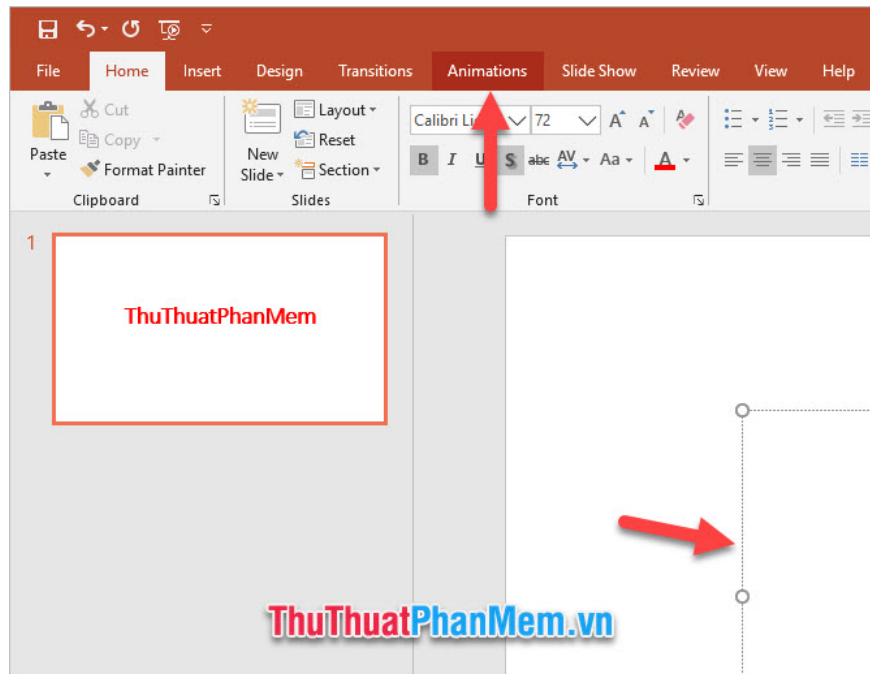
How to create multiple effects for an object in PowerPoint

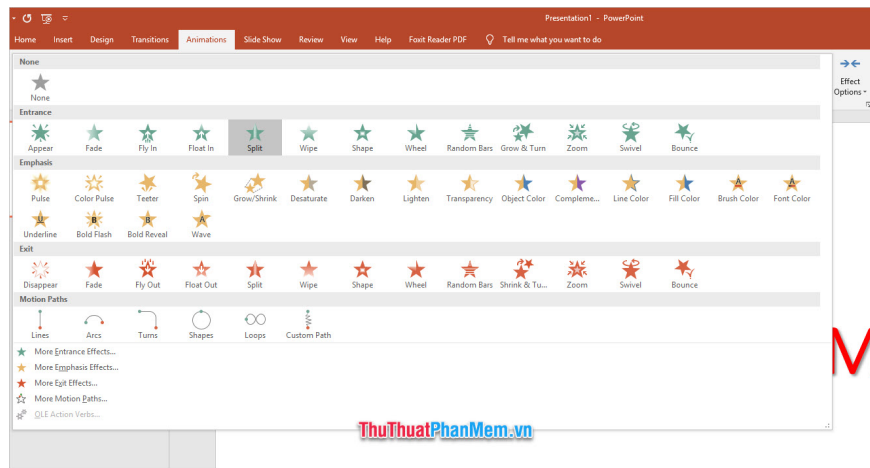


First, to create many effects for an object of Slide, you must click on that object and open the ribbon **Animations** on the toolbar.

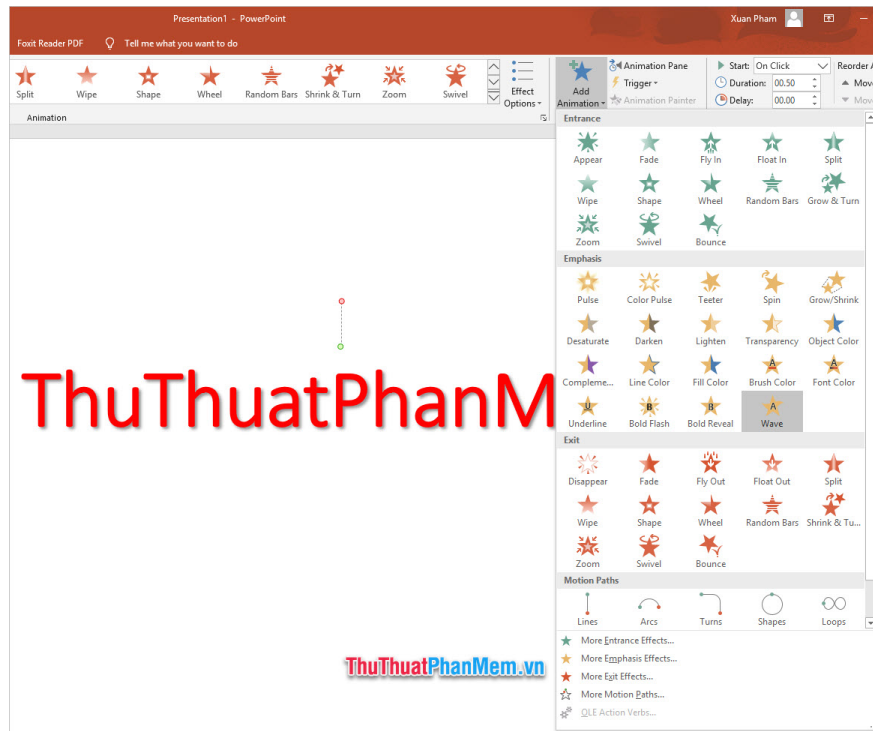


Next you can choose an effect in the list of effects of PowerPoint. Where **Entrance** is the appropriate effect when the object appears, **Emphasis** is the effect that emphasizes the attention of your object, **Exit** is the effect for the object to disappear.

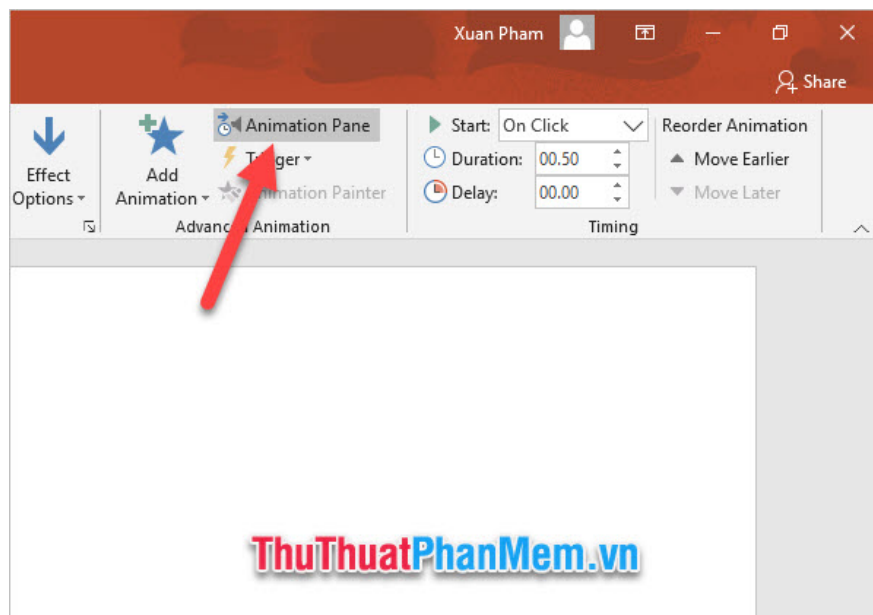
So for the first effect, you can choose an effect from the **Entrance** list .



Once you've selected an effect that is done, you continue to choose other effects by clicking on **the Add Animation** under **the Advanced Animation** of ribbon **Animation** . There is also a list of options like the previous one for you to choose. You can choose an effect, then continue to choose more effects after that.



After you've selected all the effects you want, click **Animation Pane** in the same section.



You will then see a list of the selected effects in this newly opened **Animation Pane** , in the order you have selected.

You can click on each effect to install additional custom.

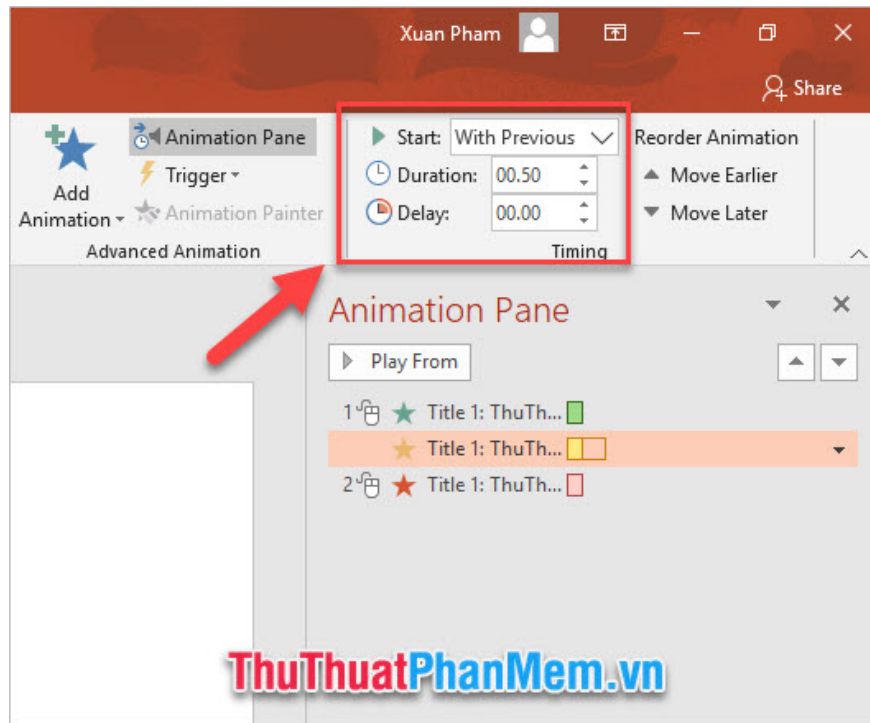
With the option in the **Timing** section , you can adjust:

Start : The beginning of the effect, including **On Click** (starts with the click of the mouse), **With Previous** (starts at the same time with the instant top effect), **After Previous** (starts right after the end of the instant effect)

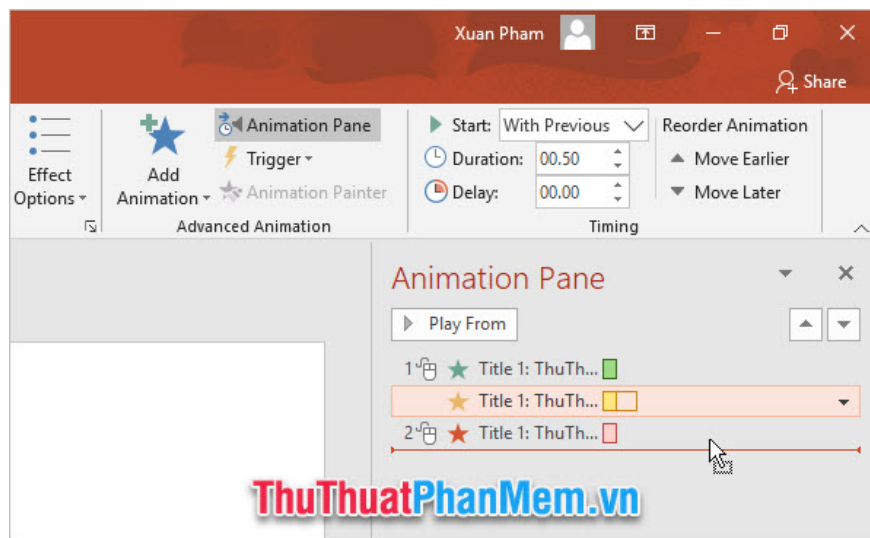

Duration : Time to execute an effect

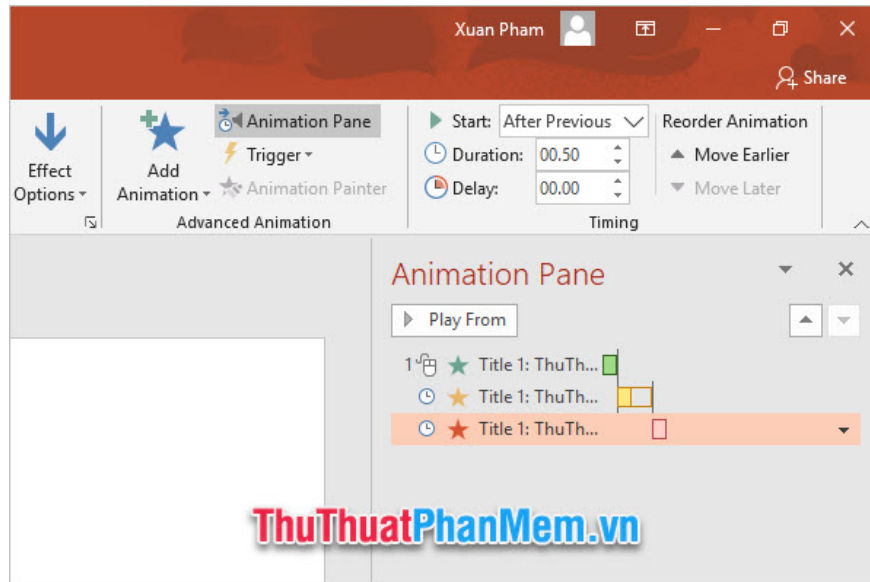
Delay : Time delay from the **start** until the effect actually starts



You can also adjust the order of effect by clicking on the effect list and hover to move it up or down, forming the most appropriate order you want.



After adjusting the options in Timing you will see the rectangular block on the right has a certain shift according to change. That is an indication of the effect time line. According to the example below, from left to right is the motion timeline of the effect. Moving out the blue effect will result in the yellow effect and finally the red effect.



If you know how to combine properly you can create a beautiful consecutive effect. As the animation below is a simple motion effect effect **TipsMake** has created based on three movements.
