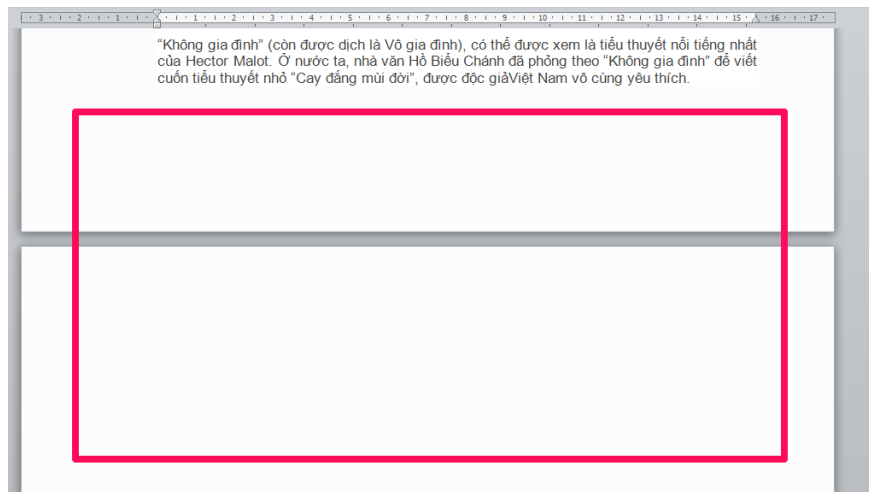


# How to delete blank pages in Word is simple but not everyone knows

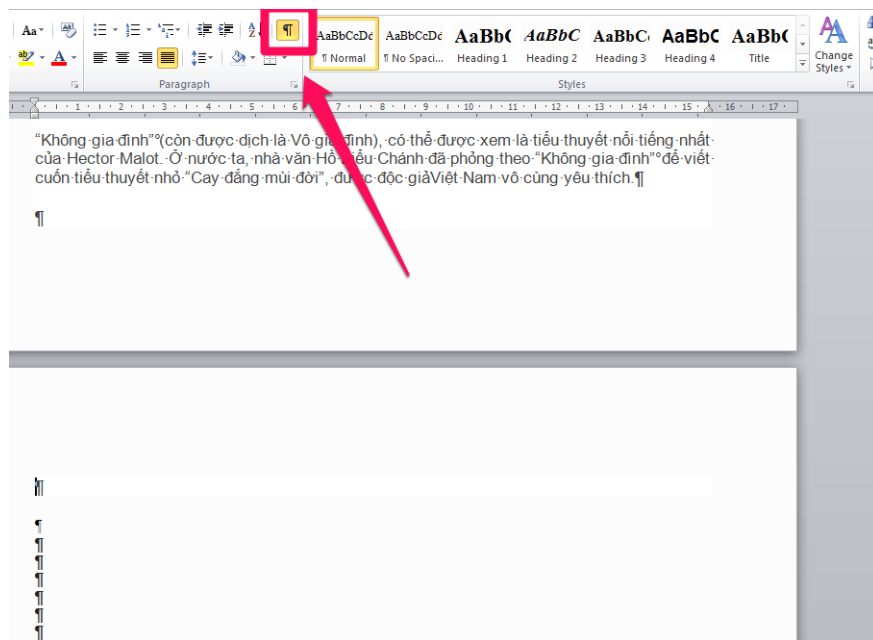
When editing text in Word, sometimes blank pages will appear between text sections. This error is simple, but not everyone knows how to handle it.

This error can be said to be quite common and can be found in any version of Word from 2003, 2007, 2010 to the latest versions such as 2013 and 2016. 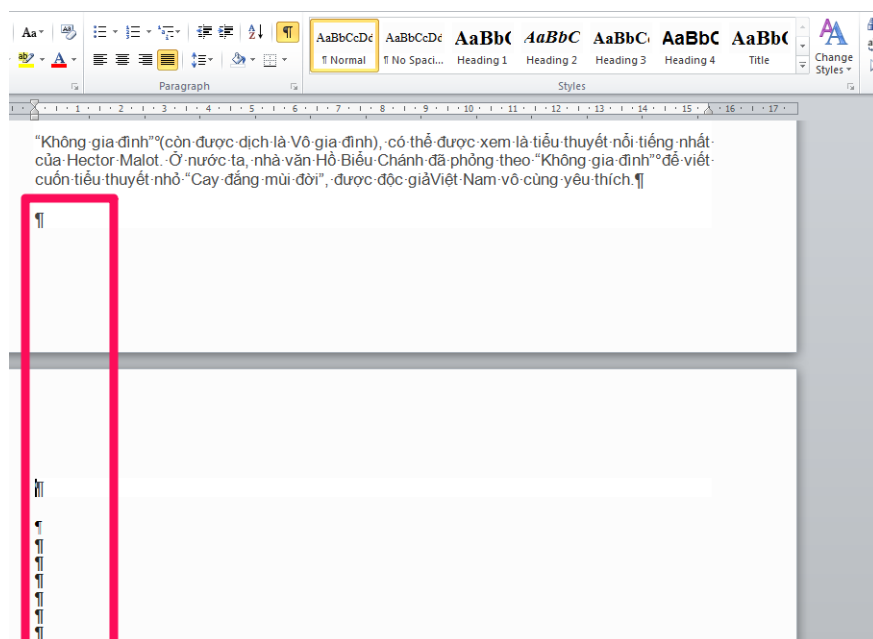
## Delete blank pages in Word using the Paragraph tool



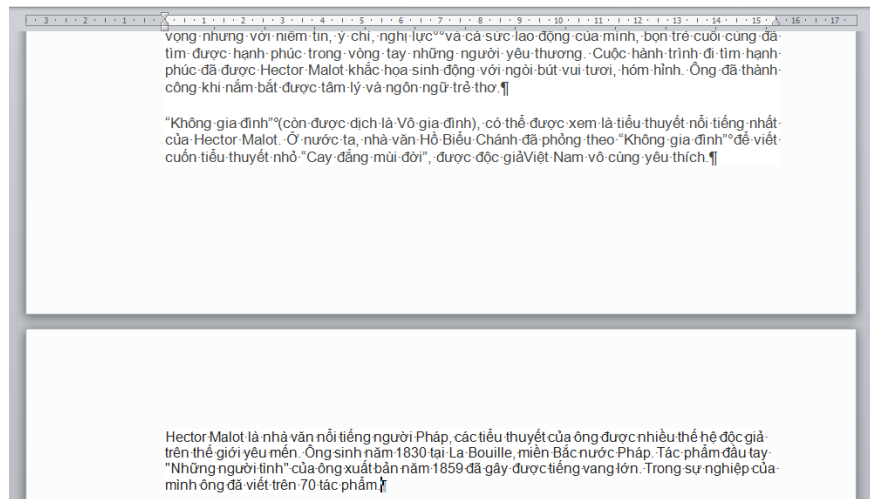
Step 1: Look at the toolbar and you will see the **Paragraph** icon . We will use this tool to mark all blank pages in Word.



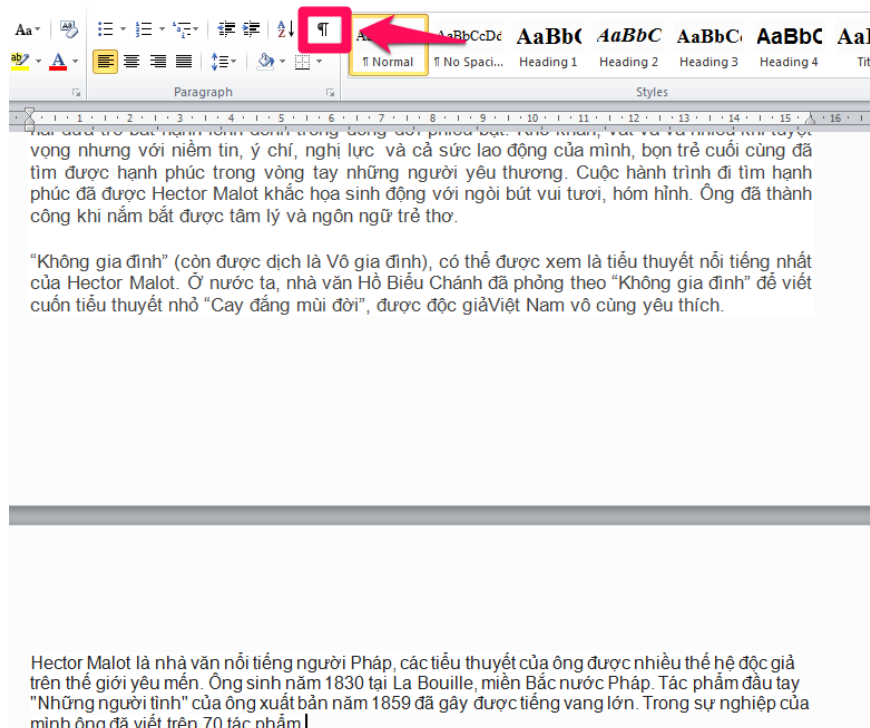
Step 2: Highlight all blank pages appearing by Paragraphs **and** press **Delete** to delete blank pages in Word.



Step 3: After deleting, you will see that the blank pages have been completely deleted.

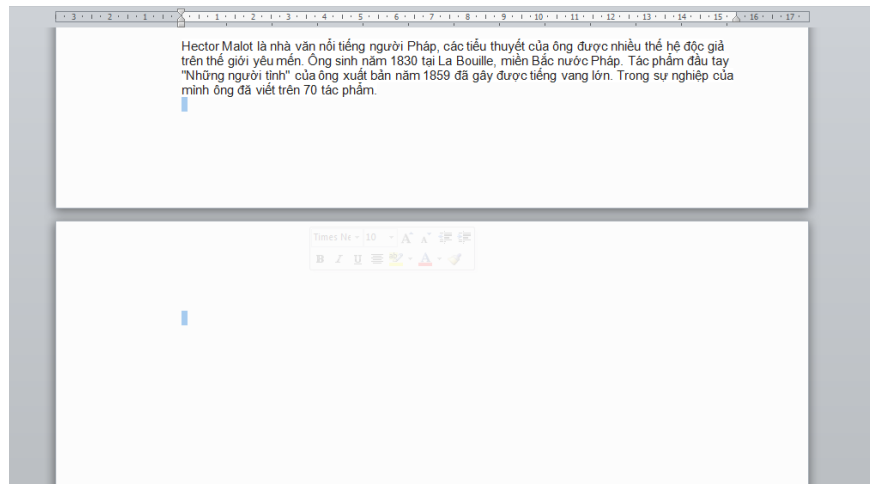


Step 4: Remove **Paragraph** to return the text to normal after deleting blank pages in Word 2016, 2013, 2010 and 2007.



## Delete blank pages directly on Word

If the number of blank pages is small, only 1 to 2 pages, we can delete directly on Word right in the text editor. You just need to open the word file with the blank page, then just do the simplest operation, which is to click the mouse cursor on the part with text at the bottom of the page. Next, you can press delete or select backspace, the entire blank page will be deleted.
