

How to disable Windows Mobility Center on Windows 11

How to disable Windows Mobility Center using Local Group Policy Editor

Windows Mobility Center can be a great tool if you need quick access to some key settings, but it can also take up system resources and slow down your computer's performance.

If you're looking to turn off Windows Mobility Center, you can use the Local Group Policy Editor. However, it is important to note that this tool only works with Windows 11 Professional and Enterprise editions.

In other words, if you use the Windows Home edition, you won't have access to Local Group Policy. For this to work, you must first enable the Group Policy Editor in Windows Home.

To disable Windows Mobility Center using the Local Group Policy Editor, follow these steps:

1. Open the Local Group Policy Editor.
2. Then navigate to the following path:

Computer Configuration > Administrative Templates > Windows Components > Windows

3. Select the Windows Mobility Center folder from the left pane, then double-click **Turn off Windows Mobility Center**.

4. In the pop-up dialog box, select **Enabled**.
5. Once you have made the changes, click **Apply > OK** to save them.

After completing the above steps, restart your computer to apply the changes.

How to Disable Windows Mobility Center Using Registry Editor

Alternatively, you can disable Windows Mobility Center through the Windows Registry. The process is pretty simple, but make sure you follow the instructions carefully, because even a small mistake in the registry can lead to serious damage.

If you decide to go this route, be sure to back up your registry. Here are the steps you need to take to turn off Windows Mobility Center:

1. Open the Registry Editor.

2. Next, go to the following path:

HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\Microsoft\Windows\CurrentVersion\Policies

3. On the right side of the window, right-click on an empty area.

4. From the context menu, select **New > DWORD (32-bit) Value** .

5. When generating the DWORD key, name it **MobilityCenter** and save it.

6. Now double click on the key you just created and a pop-up window will appear.

7. Set **Value data** to **1** and **Base** to **Hexadecimal**.

8. When you're done making these changes, click **OK** to save them.

After completing the above steps, exit Registry Editor and restart your computer.

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
