Detailed instructions on how to preview a Word file without opening it.

1. In File Explorer, select File
 2. Click Change folder and search options
 3. Switch to the View tab.
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1. Find the Show preview handlers in preview pane section
 2. Check this box.
 3. Click Apply and OK

This setting allows Windows to display text content in the preview pane instead of just showing the file icon.

Step 4: Preview the content of the Word file

Once the setup is complete, you just need to:

1. Open the folder containing the Word file.
2. Click on the .doc or .docx file .

Immediately, the text content in the document will appear in the Preview Pane on the right. You can expand the preview pane to read the content more clearly.

Some common errors when previewing Word files.

Although this feature is quite convenient, users sometimes encounter errors that cause the preview frame to malfunction. Below are the most common problems and how to resolve them.

Error 'This file can't be previewed.'

This is a fairly common error when previewing Office documents. The message usually appears saying: 'This file can't be previewed because of an error in the Microsoft Word previewer.'

The most common causes may include:

1. Word Preview is malfunctioning.
2. Conflict with Microsoft Office version
3. Missing preview handler

According to Microsoft's support documentation, this error occurs when the system is unable to initialize Word's preview element to display the document content.

How to fix: If you encounter this error, you can follow these troubleshooting steps:

1. Restart File Explorer
2. Update Microsoft Office
3. Reinstall Office if necessary.

The Preview Pane does not display any content.

In some cases, you may have enabled Preview Pane, but the file content still won't display.

The causes are usually:

1. The "Show preview handles in preview pane" option is not enabled.
2. The file is corrupted.
3. The file has not been fully downloaded from the cloud storage service.

To fix this, you should check the settings in Folder Options as instructed above.

Cannot preview files downloaded from the Internet

Some recent Windows updates have enhanced security by restricting previews of files downloaded from the internet. This is to prevent the risk of information leaks or exploitation of security vulnerabilities. In this case, you need to fix it using the following steps:

1. Open the file once to confirm it's safe.
2. Alternatively, you can unblock the file in its Properties.
3. After that, the preview feature will work normally.

Some things to keep in mind when previewing Word files.

To use this feature effectively and avoid errors during use, you should keep the following important points in mind.

Only basic content is viewable.

The Preview Pane primarily displays basic text content. Some complex elements in the document may not be fully displayed, such as:

1. Advanced Formatting
2. Macro
3. Embedded objects

Therefore, when you need to check formatting details or edit a document, you should still open the file using Microsoft Word.

The document cannot be edited.

The preview pane only displays the content. You cannot directly edit a Word file in the Preview Pane. If you want to edit the document, you need to open the file using Word or compatible software.

Suitable only for quick document browsing.

This feature is especially useful when:

1. Quick check of file contents
2. Filter documents in a large folder.
3. Preview before sending the file

However, this is not a complete replacement for Microsoft Word.

You should update Windows and Office regularly.
