

# How to enable website web apps (PWA) in Firefox

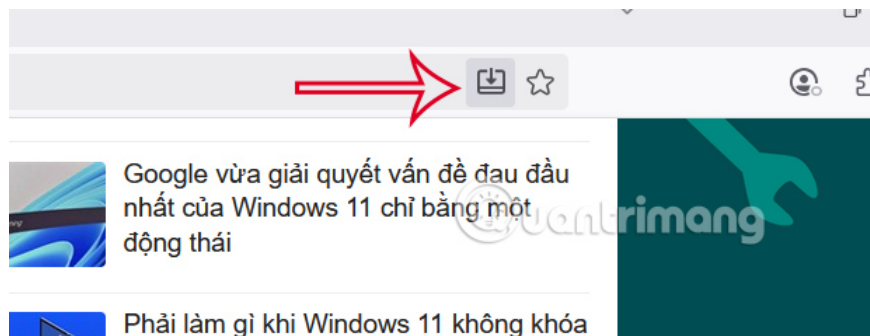
Progressive Web Apps (PWA) are now installed on Firefox so you can turn any website into a system app shortcut on your desktop, taskbar, or start menu.

## How to enable progressive web apps (PWA) on Firefox

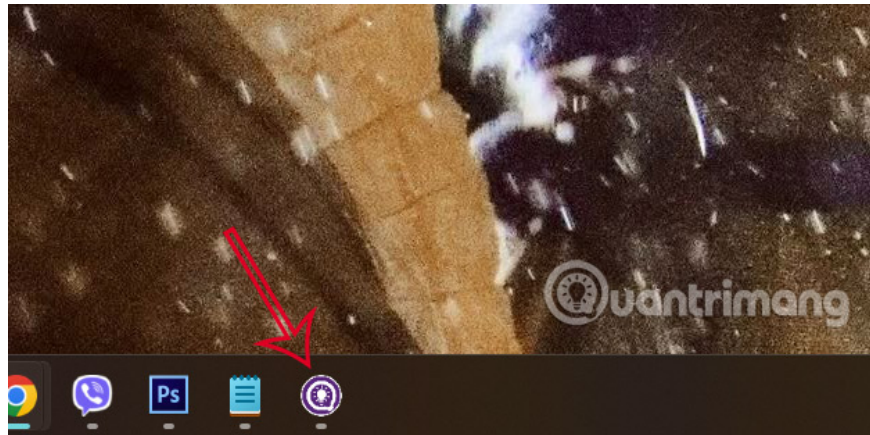
### Step 1:

You need to update Firefox browser to the latest version and access any website. Then you will see a **small download icon** on the right of the address bar. This is the PWA installation icon.



### Step 2:

Click the icon to install the website as an app. The website will turn into an app and display a new icon on the taskbar.

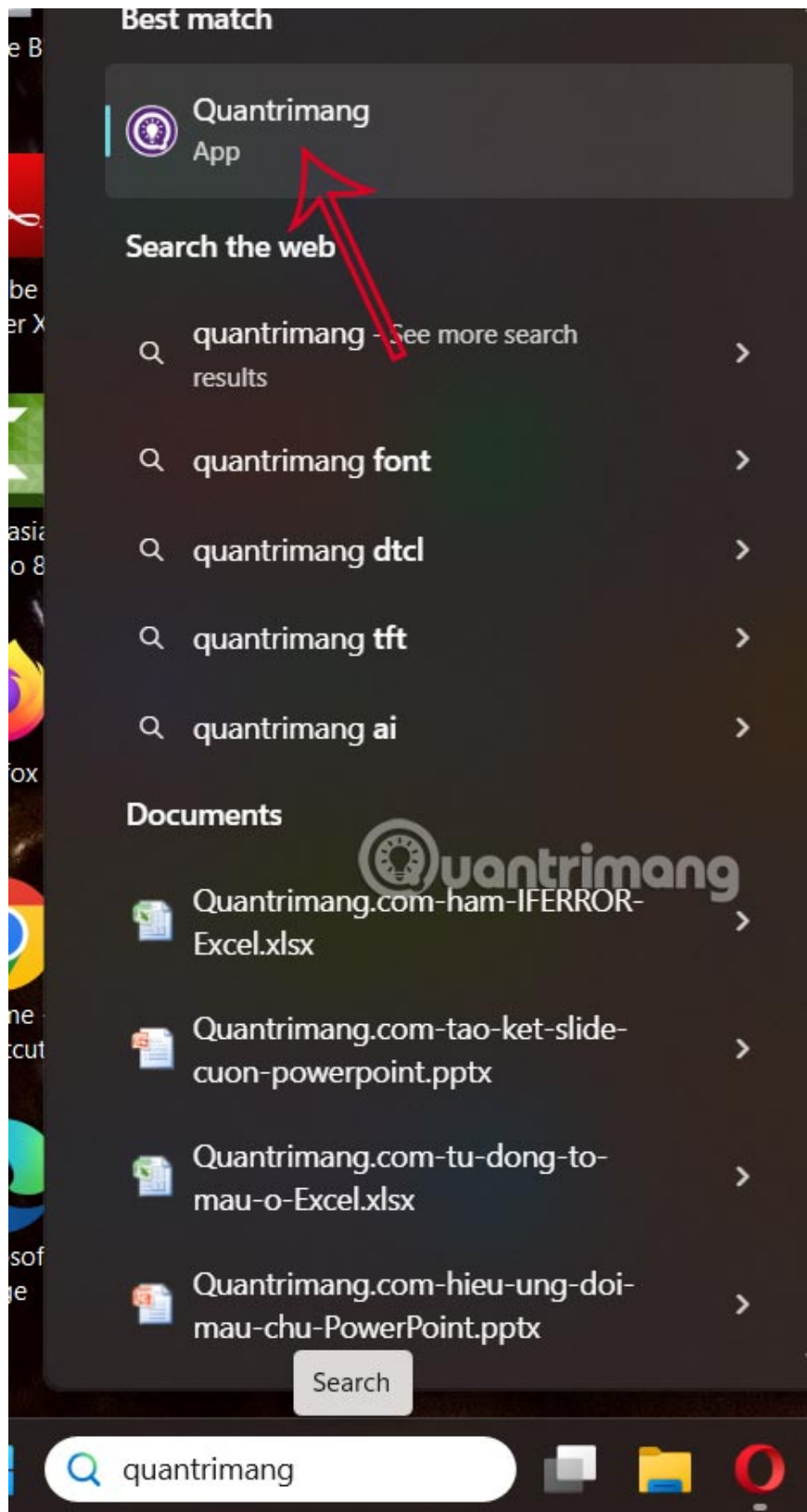


Click on this icon to access or access in another way.



### Step 3:

You can access this site instantly as an app from the start menu by searching for it. You can also pin it anywhere you want.
