

How to fix a Word file showing 'Read Only,' disable Read Only mode, and enable editing.

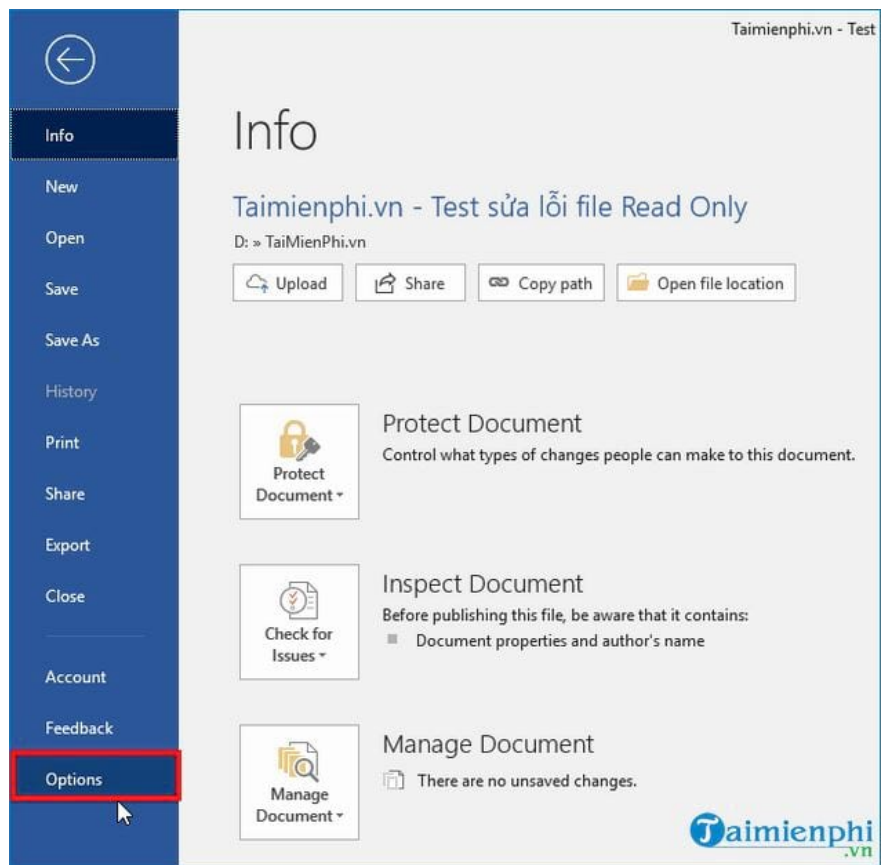


A Word file showing "Read Only" could be due to an error or a user-defined setting.

Instructions on how to fix a Word file that shows "Read Only"

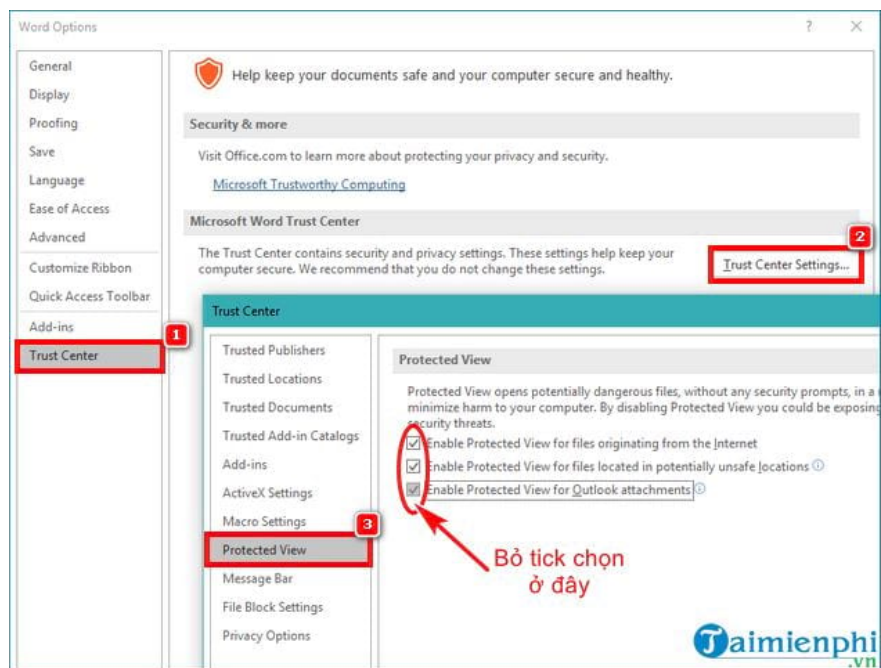
Reason 1: Due to Protected View settings

- Open the Word file -> Select **File** -> **Options** .



- Select **Trust Center** -> **Trust Center Settings** .

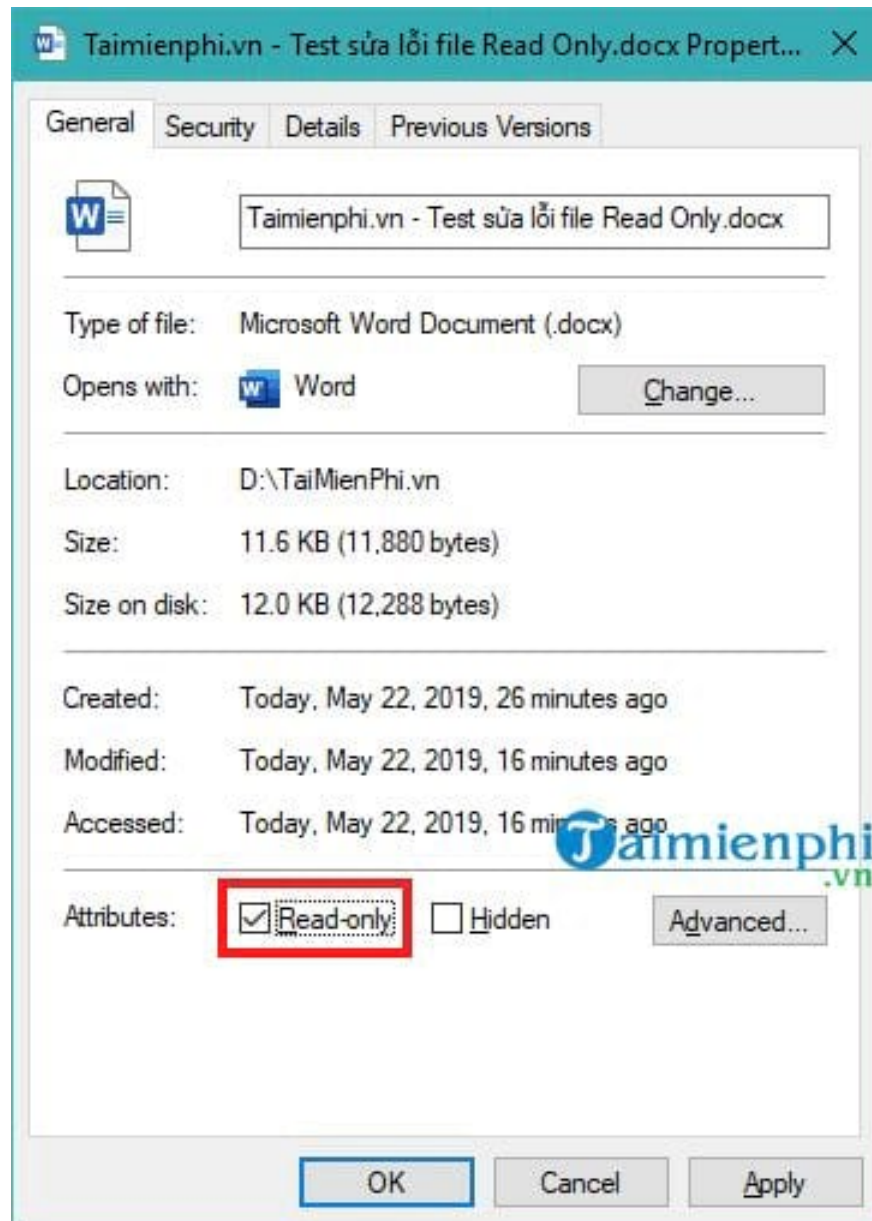
- Go to **Protected View** -> Uncheck the corresponding 3 boxes -> Click **OK** to save.



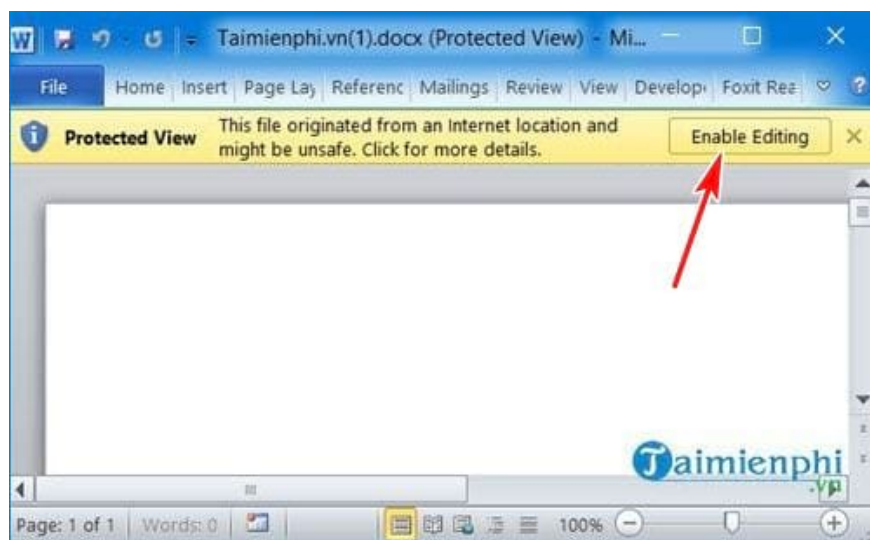
Reason 2: The file has read-only permissions.

When a file is set to read-only, you can only view it, not edit it. To fix a Word file showing as read-only in this case, do the following:

- Right-click on the Word file -> Select **Properties** .
- Uncheck the **Read-only** option -> Click **OK** .



If you receive a "Protected View" message when opening a Word file , simply click **Enable Editing** to be able to edit it.



Reason 3: The computer is infected with a virus that changes the properties of the Word file.

Viruses can change the properties of a Word file, preventing you from disabling read-only mode. In this case, to fix a Word file showing as read-only, use **antivirus software** to scan and restore the original data, allowing you to edit normally.

Above are the causes and solutions for the Read Only issue in Word files, along with instructions on how to disable Protected View mode. If you encounter this problem during use, immediately apply these three Read Only fixes to resolve it quickly.

In addition, to ensure this situation doesn't happen in the future, you can take some preventative measures. First, regularly update your antivirus software and perform a full system scan to detect and remove potential threats. Second, ensure that you always store Word files in secure locations, avoiding unwanted permission issues.
