

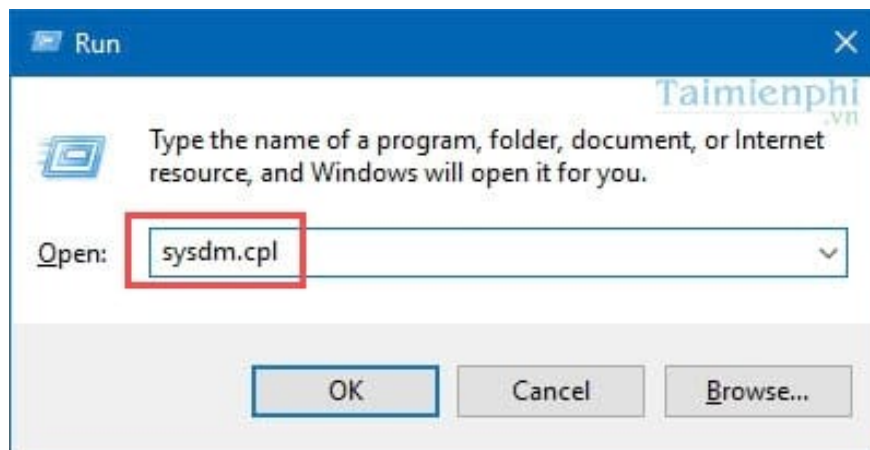
# How to fix 'Dotted Circle Animation Not Showing' error when turning off screen on Windows 10?

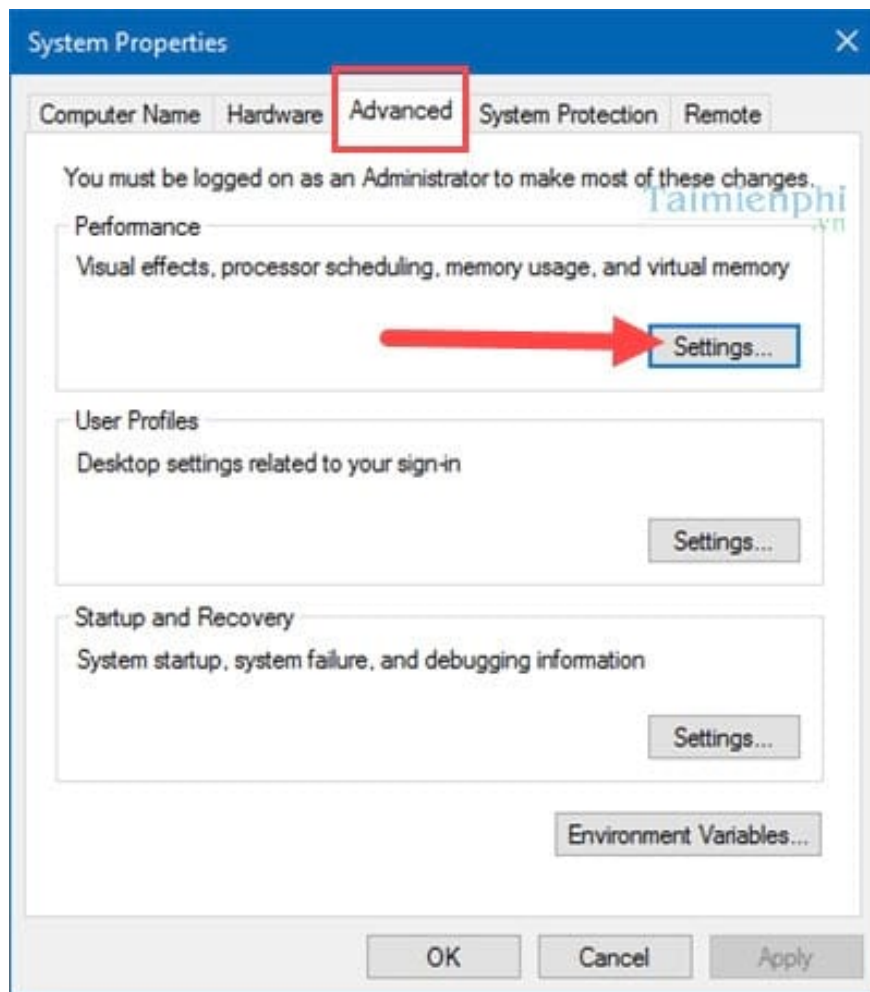

## How to Fix Dotted Circle Animation Not Showing Error on Windows 10

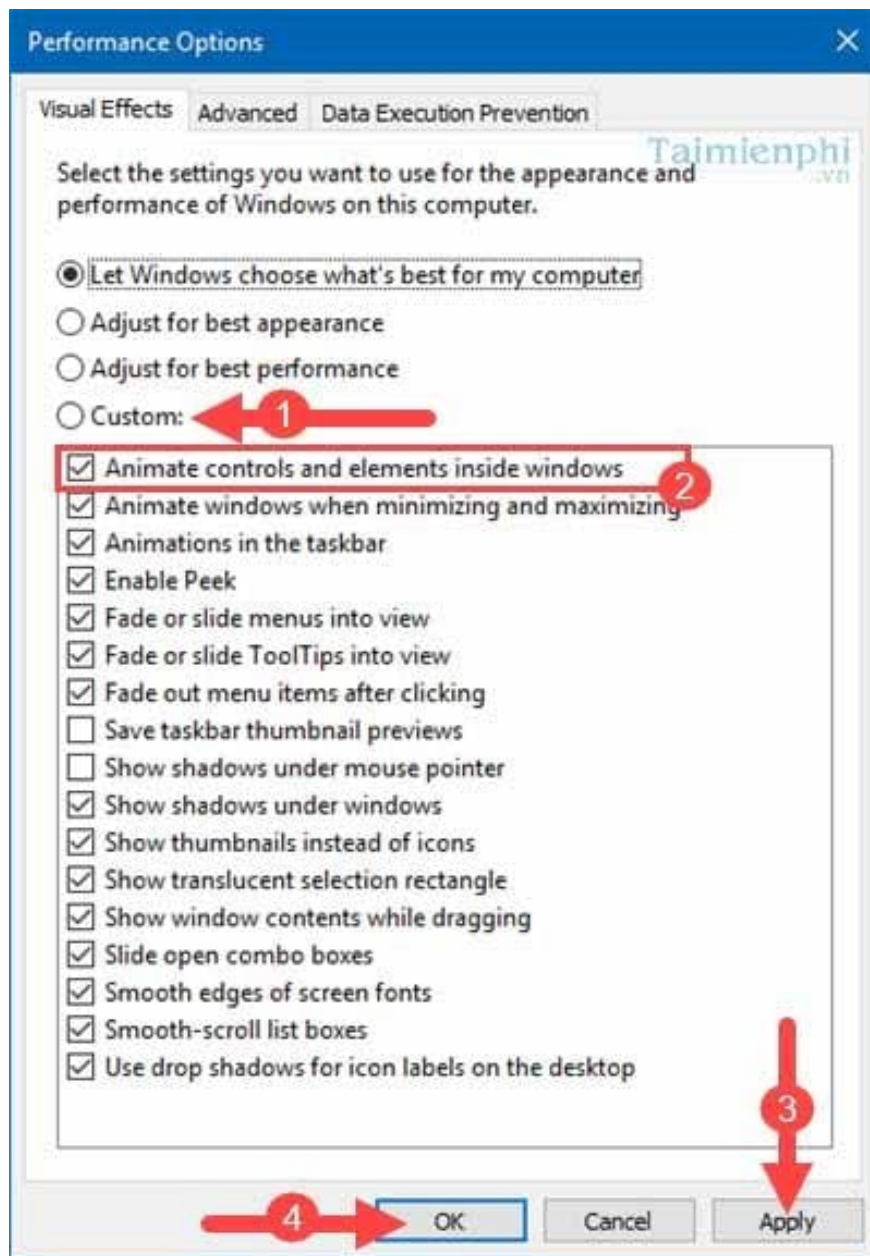
*Step 1:* Press the **Windows + R** key combination, enter the command **sysdm.cpl**, then press OK to access System Properties.



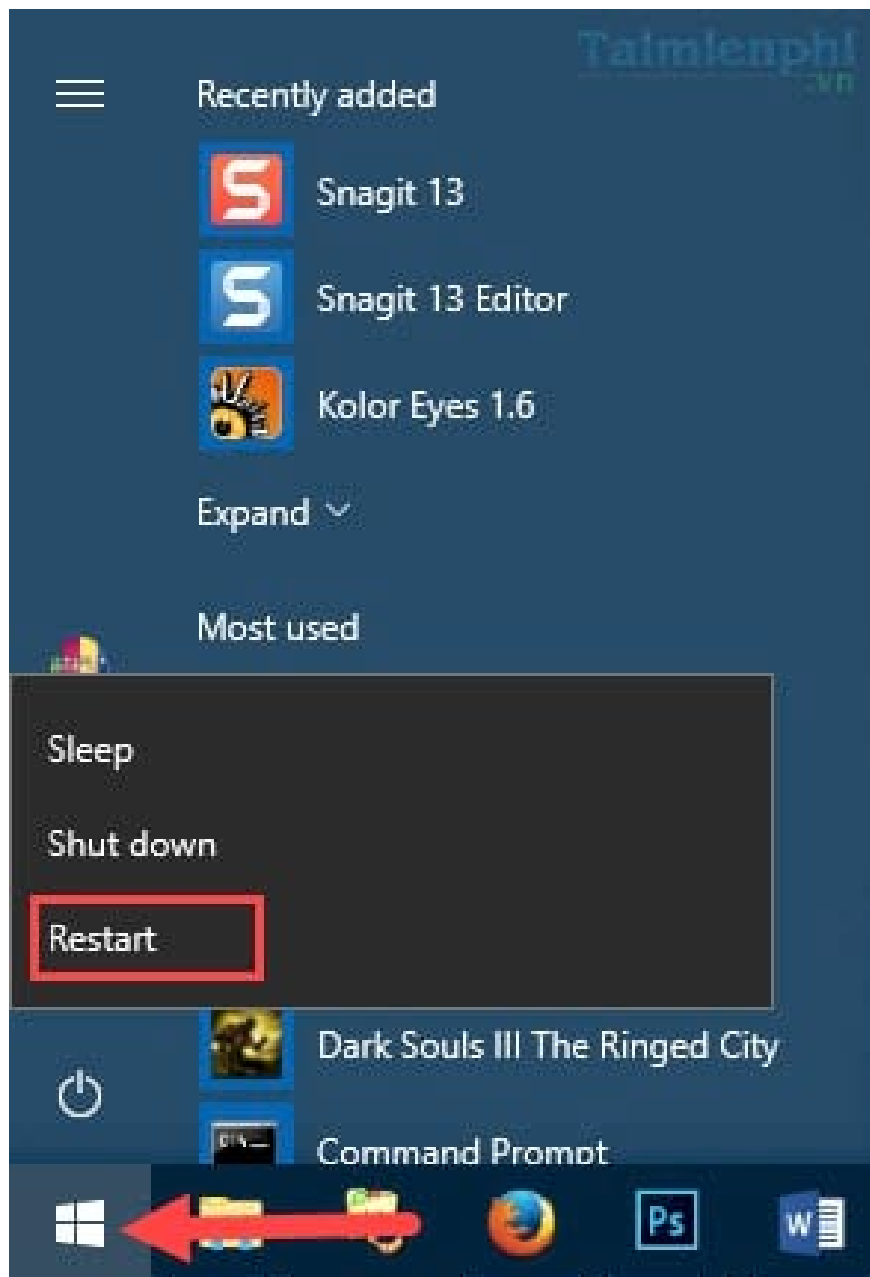
*Step 2:* In System Properties, select the **Advanced** tab, look at the **Performance** box and select **Settings** to set up.



*Step 3:* In the **Visual Effects** section , switch from **Let Windows choose what's best for my computer** to **Custom** mode , then check **Animate controls and elements inside windows** , then click **Apply** and **OK** .



*Step 4:* After closing **System Properties** , select **Restart** to restart the computer and complete the error correction process.



With the above instructions, you can easily fix the Dotted Circle Animation Not Showing error on Windows 10 without causing any harm to the system.
