

How to increase the bass in a song using Audacity

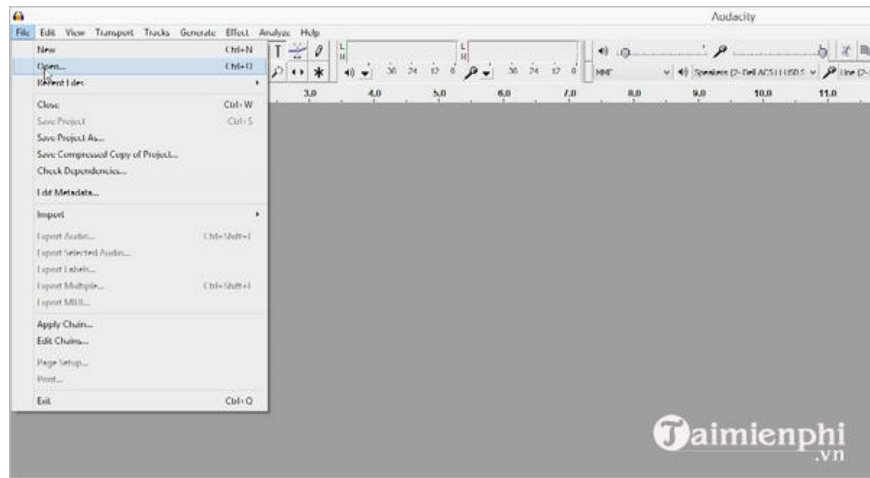
How to increase bass using Audacity

Step 1: Download Audacity and complete the installation process on your computer.

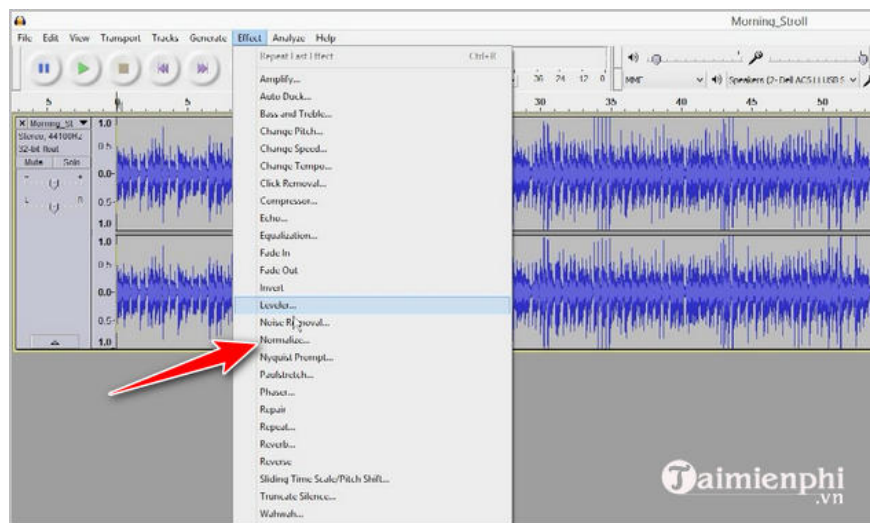
Download the latest version of Audacity here:

After downloading the software, refer to the instructions on how to install Audacity here and follow the guidelines to install the application.

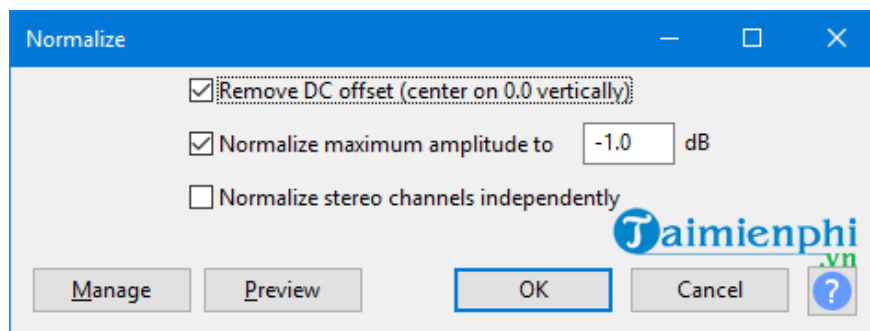
Step 2: Import the song you want to boost the bass for into Audacity by clicking **File > Open** and selecting the desired song or audio file.



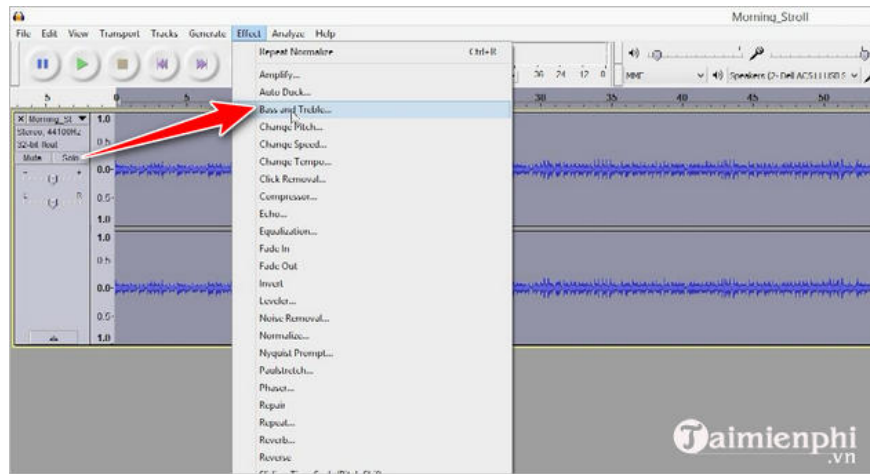
Step 3: Click on the **Effects** menu in Audacity and select **Normalize**.



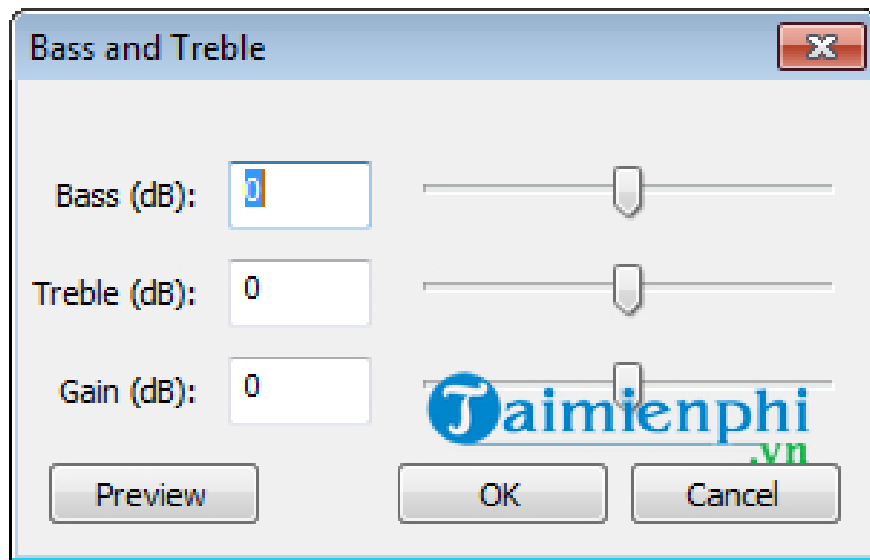
Step 4: The **Normalize** window that just appeared gives you options for the level of audio normalization you want. The most common settings here are from **-9.0** to **-15.0** . If these levels don't suit your needs, adjust them until you reach your desired level and click **OK** . The sound waves will now appear quieter than when you first imported the song into Audacity.



Step 5: Next, to increase the bass for the song, click on **Effects** again and select **Bass and Treble**.



Step 6: In the **Bass and Treble** window that just appeared, you have several options to adjust the bass and treble of the song. Keep the treble at **0** and adjust the bass to suit your needs. You can always click the **Preview** button to listen to a preview before clicking **OK** to save the changes.



Finally, simply export your new audio file by going to **File > Export** . Then, select your desired format and click **Save** . This will save your newly bass-boosted audio file. Now you can close Audacity and listen to your new song.

Besides boosting the bass, you can also try using Audacity to filter out noise for better sound quality.
