

# How to integrate pictures into text in PowerPoint

Inserting images into text in a slide or incorporating images into text in PowerPoint will create an attraction for presentation slides.

Images inserted into PowerPoint have many different presentation styles such as inserting images under the text of slides, inserting text into images in PowerPoint, or blurring images in slides. 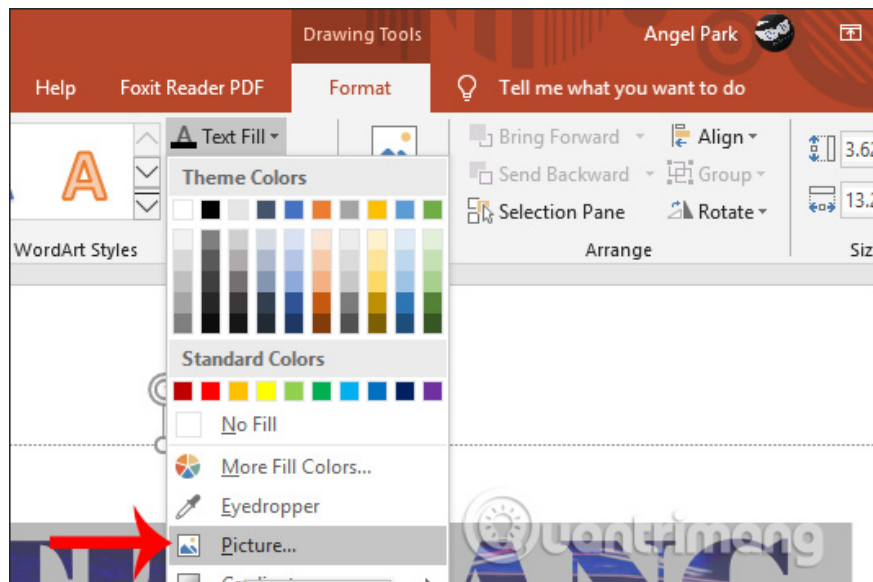
## Instructions to put text into pictures in PowerPoint

### Step 1:

Firstly, the user **enters the text in the slide** with an optional font but the size is large and the format is in bold. Then **black out the entire text** using the mouse and black out.

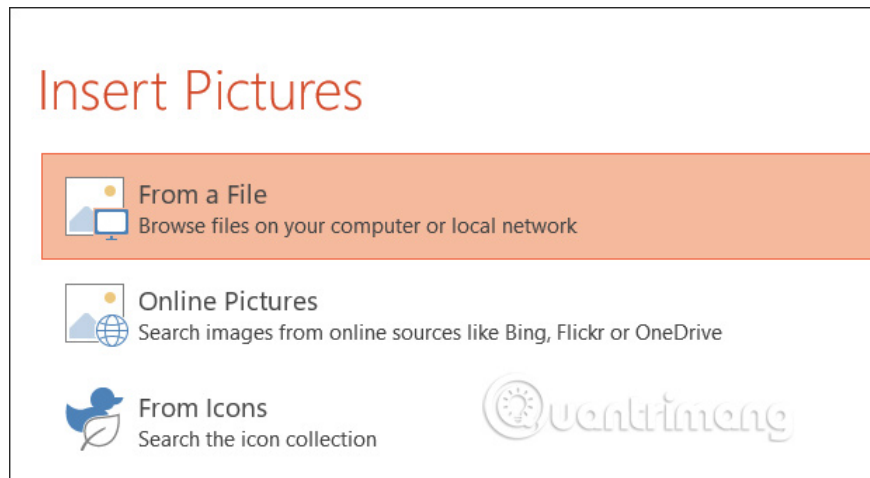
### Step 2:

Click on **Format** and look down **Word WordArt Styles** group, then select **Text Fill** . When the selection menu is shown as below, click **Picture** .



### Step 3:

Display the Insert Picture interface and **select the image location** . Here I will choose the image included in the computer, so I will select From a File.

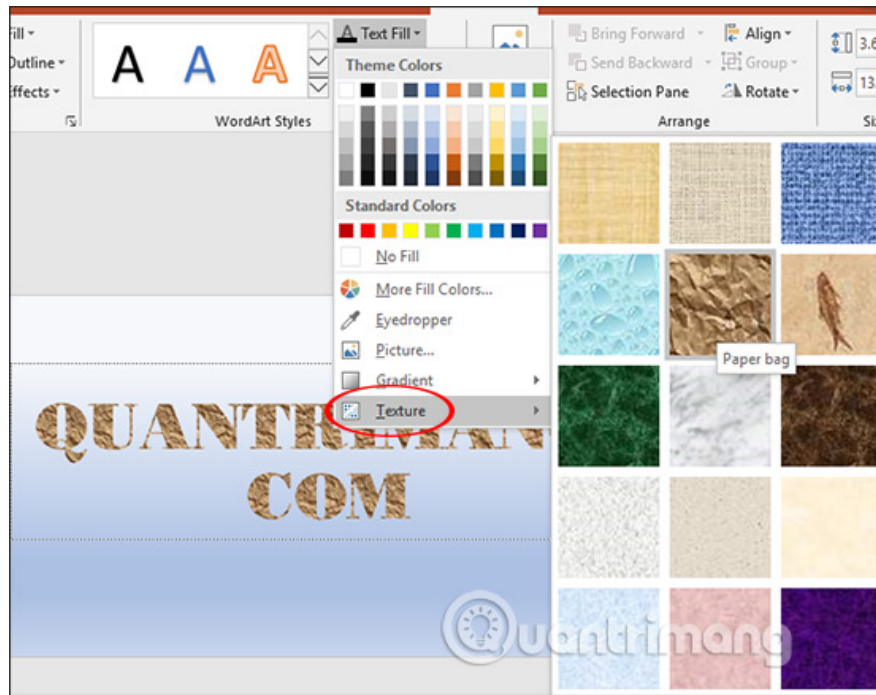


#### Step 4:

**Click the image you** want to integrate into the text in the PowerPoint slide and then **click Insert** to insert. As a result, we have the text line with the image as below.



So in addition to choosing colors to color the inner border for text, you have the option of incorporating images for text with a simple way. In addition, the **Texture** also supports some other background colors.
