How to make Mid-Autumn Festival masks using paper

Step 1: Prepare the ingredients for the face mask.

1. Colored cardboard.
2. Scissors, drawing pens, crayons, double-sided tape.
3. Elastic band.

Step 2: Draw the image on the Mid-Autumn Festival mask.

Choose a piece of cardboard in your child's favorite color or one that matches the animal they've chosen. Use a pencil to draw the animal shapes on the paper. If that's difficult, you can print out a template from the options provided below by TipsMake.com.

You should estimate the size of the animal to fit the child's face. After completing the animal shape with a pencil, you should use a marker to trace over it, so that the animal's shape looks clearer.

This step is quite simple; you can guide your child to freely express their creativity with the shapes they like.

Step 3: Mark the baby's eyes, nose, and mouth on the mask.

After completing the outline, try the mask on your face and mark the positions for the eyes, nose, and mouth. Draw the eyes, nose, and mouth for the animals and color them to make them lively and adorable. For the eyes, cut out the openings so the child can see through them.

Step 4: Cut the mask out of the cardboard.

Use scissors to cut along the outline of the animal shapes to remove the excess paper.

Step 5: Thread the string and complete the sheet mask.

Punch two small, symmetrical holes on either side of the mask, about 1.5cm from the edge, and thread the mask straps through them. Once you've checked the fit, tie a knot in the strap.

You can also make hats for babies by cutting a strip of paper about 3-4cm wide, rolling it into a circle, estimating the circumference of the circle to fit the baby's head so it won't fall off when worn, and then gluing an animal shape onto it. If making a hat, you can skip the step of cutting small holes for the eyes.

You can cut out pieces of cardboard in different colors and glue them in place of the eyes, nose, mouth, ears, etc., to decorate the mask and make it look cuter.

If you're more skilled with your hands and know how to sew, you can make masks for your child to wear during the Mid-Autumn Festival using thin felt fabric.

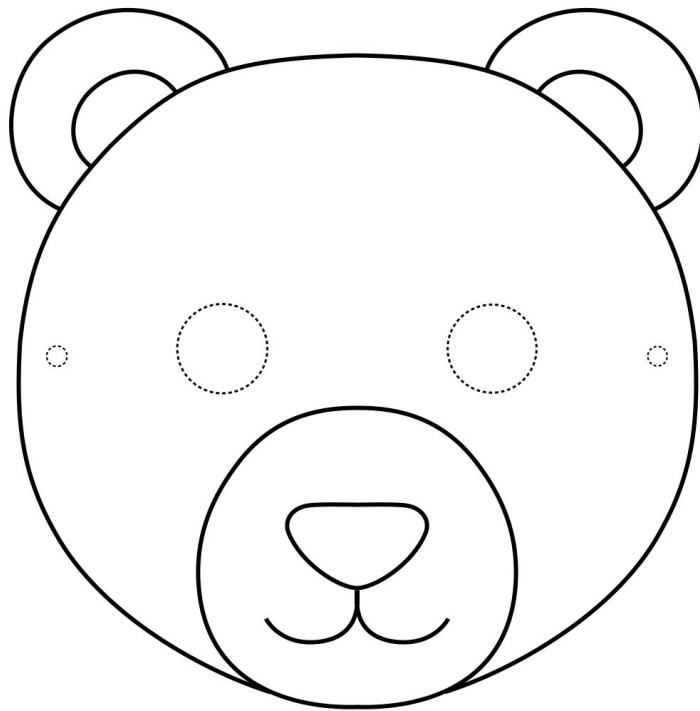


Making Mid-Autumn Festival masks from felt fabric (Photo: Internet source)
