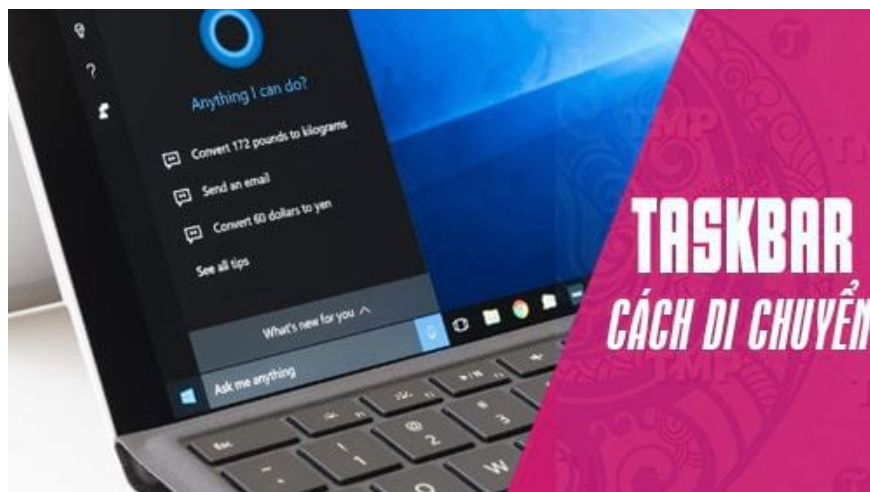


# How to move the Taskbar to the top, right, or left

The Taskbar is one of the most useful toolbars on Windows, not only in previous versions but also in Windows 10. In this article, we'll explore how to move the Taskbar to the top, left, or right according to user preference.

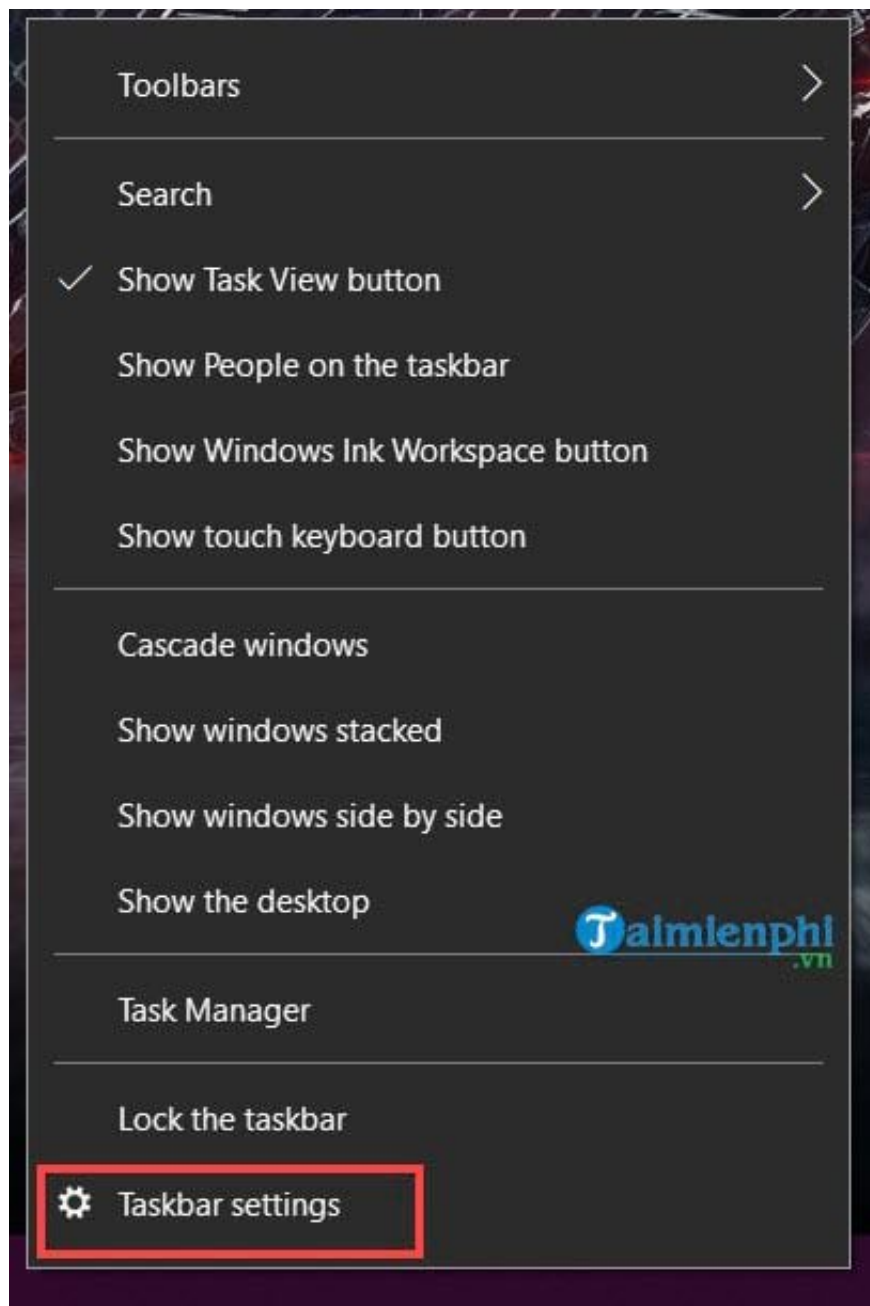
In fact, **moving the Taskbar up, left, or right** is a completely simple trick, but this is also a common question among many office computer users who encounter this "error." Due to some oversight, users unintentionally move the Taskbar up or to the left or right, not in the correct format.



The issue of changing the Taskbar position is a common occurrence for Windows computer users and isn't a serious problem. ## How to move the Taskbar to the top, right, or left

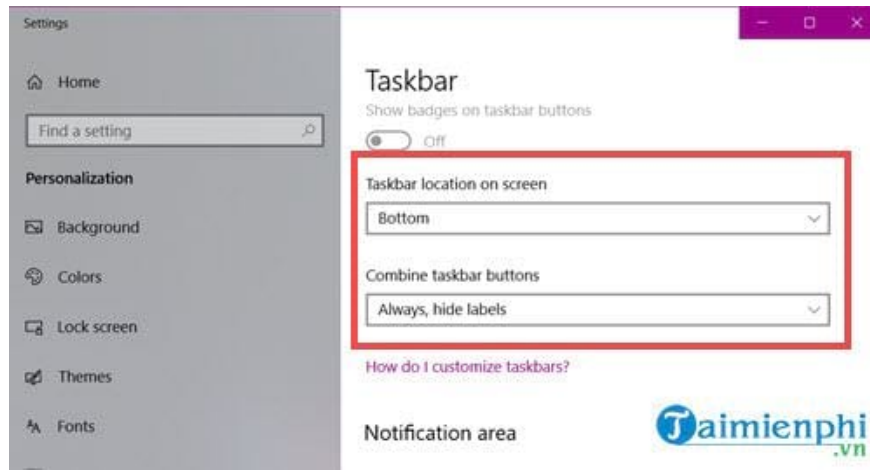
*Step 1:* Moving the Taskbar up, left, or right is extremely simple; users just need to **right-click** on the Taskbar and then select **Taskbar settings** .



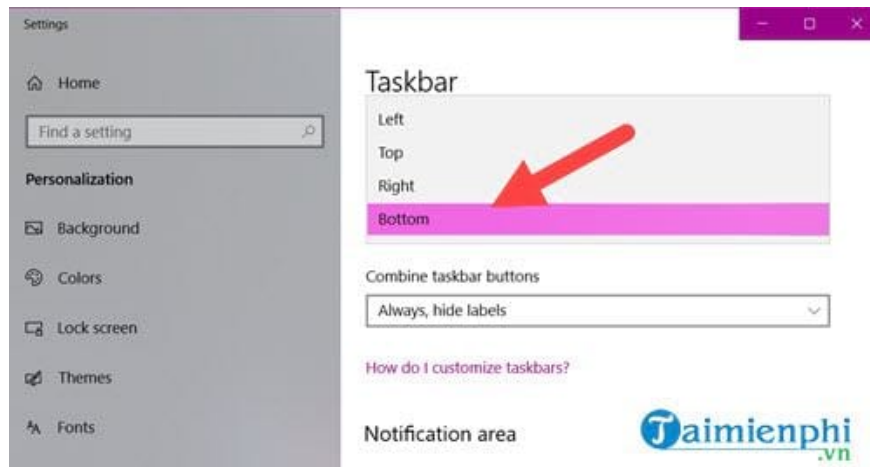
*Step 2:* In the Taskbar section, scroll down to the bottom where you'll find two options: **Taskbar location on screen** and **Combine Taskbar buttons** .

- **Taskbar location on screen** : This is the section that allows us to move the Taskbar to the top, left, or right as desired.

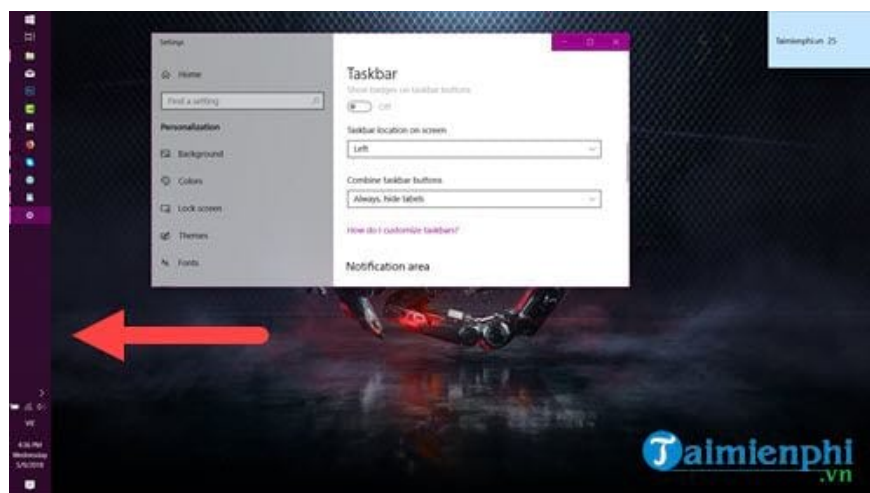
- **Combine TaskBar buttons** : This section allows us to hide or show the taskbar, or merge folders or keep them separate. Of course, this feature is not the topic we're discussing in this article, so TipsMake will skip it and address it in a future article.



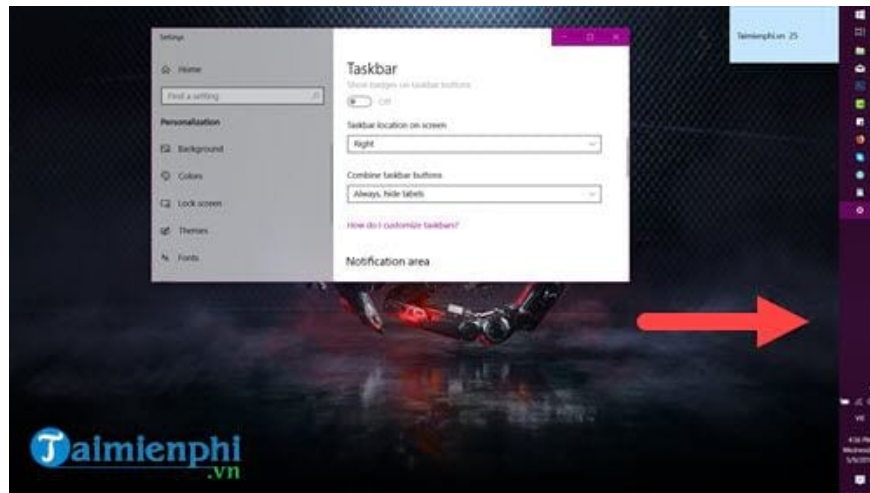
Step 3: Therefore, let's focus on the **Taskbar location on screen** to learn how to change the Taskbar. Here, there are four values ??you can easily familiarize yourself with: **Bottom** (default), **Right** , **Top** , and **Left** .



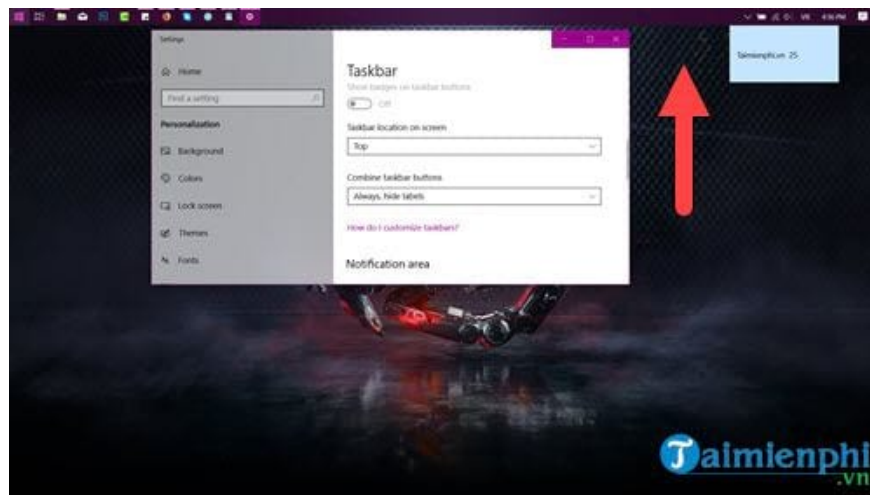
If we **select Left** , the Taskbar will automatically move to the left side of your screen.



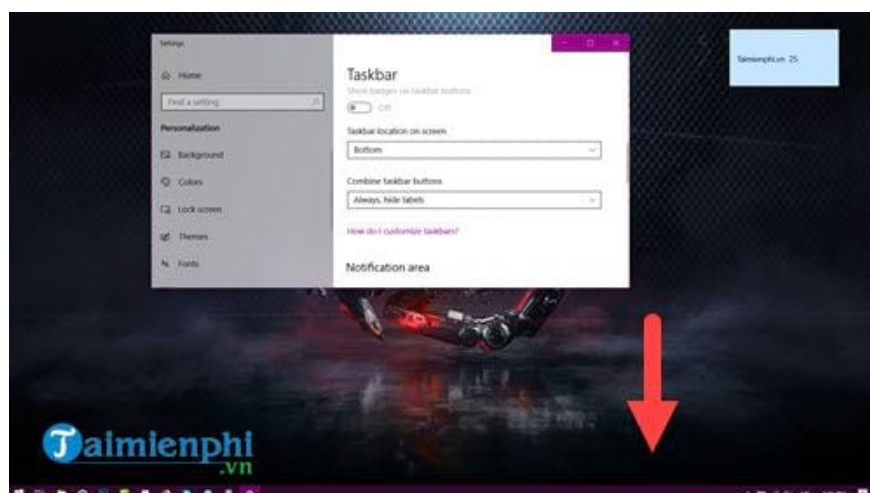
If we **select Right** , the Taskbar will, of course, be moved to the right side of the screen.



As **for Top**, it corresponds to the value that moves the Taskbar to the top of the screen, the opposite of the Taskbar's default position.



Finally, if you don't like it, return **the value to Bottom** to move the Taskbar back to its default position in Windows.
