

How to name storms in the Pacific

In the Pacific Northwest and the South China Sea, the names of the storms are taken alternately from the list proposed by the countries in the region.

The name of the storms in Vietnam is set according to its ordinal number during the year but in the world they are often named. In the Pacific Northwest and the South China Sea, the names of the storms are taken alternately from the list proposed by the countries in the region.

There is a list of 140 special names for storms selected by countries in the region such as China, Japan, Vietnam and Cambodia. When there is a storm, the old names will not be selected and replaced by a new name. The number of names that can be used is unlimited for one calendar year.

Only tropical cyclones at storm level or above can be named and taken sequentially from top to bottom. For example, if the first storm of the year is called Cimaron, then the next storm will be named Jebi.

The most recent storm was named Sonca, the next storm in the Pacific and South China Sea will be named Nesat.

If in that year, the list of names of storms is used up, another list will be added with 10 names and given before the storm season begins.

The Philippines is also one of the countries that give names to international storms. But when a tropical cyclone entered the country's surveillance area, the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) will use its own list of storm names with 25 names to give to it. .

A tropical cyclone in the Pacific Northwest with winds of about 73-148 km / h will be classified as a storm. The storms with winds of 149 km / h or more will be classified as super typhoons.

The purpose is to name tropical cyclone to make it easier to alert. Clearly, calling the storms by name is easy to remember, easy to use in exchanging information and attracting the attention of the community for storm warnings more than using terms and numbering.

The name of a storm will be removed from the list and replaced by another name when it causes too many human and property casualties. In the history of the names of famous storms were removed in this way Tracy (Darwin, 1974), Mitch (Honduras, 1998), Katrina (USA, 2005), Sandy (USA, 2012), Haiyan (Philippines, 2013)

10 names of the Vietnam Meteorological Administration are selected by the Storm Committee of the region including: Conson, Saola, Songda, Sontinh, Lekima, Sonca, Bavi, Tramy, Halong, Vamco.
