Download your file to a new and secure location to complete the recovery process.

Part 3: How to Recover Deleted Excel Files without Software?

Alternatively, you may try recovering your excel files without Software, but these steps are often limited to recently deleted or non-corrupted files.

Solution 1: Using Recycle Bin

The recycle bin is a special folder the Windows operating system uses to keep deleted items safe. To use the recycle bin to recover your excel file, try the following steps:

1. Click open the recycle bin
2. Select the Excel file
3. Restore your computer by right-clicking on the deleted file and selecting the "Recover" option.

Solution 2: From your Backups

If you regularly back up your files to cloud storage or any other third-party storage, you will find Backup a helpful solution; if you do not, it will not be as beneficial. To begin recovery from your backup:

1. Go to the file recovery pathway on your Windows computer; you can find this by searching for Backup restores in the taskbar search icon.
2. Search for your file in the file history and select the version you would want your file recovered
3. Click "Restore" to restore the deleted Excel file.

Solution 3: Using the Restore function

There is also a last option that can help how to recover deleted files in excel, which is by using the Restore function applicable to Windows. It includes the following steps;

1. Open the folder where the Excel file was saved.
2. Right-click and select the restore to previous version option

1. Select a preferred version to recover from the possible available multiple versions.

Finally, on how to recover deleted files excel, you can try the advanced Windows restore function if the first method does not apply to recovering your deleted file.

1. Go to the control panel to begin.

1. Select the System and Security tab
2. Follow up the previous step by selecting "System Protection."
