

How to recover or reset a lost Windows 10 user account password

In this article, TipsMake.com discusses some of the ways you can recover or reset passwords on Windows 10 and earlier Windows operating systems.

Forgetting your password can be a nightmare for any Windows user. This can happen if you are setting up a new installation for the first time and you have created a password without thinking carefully about what you are creating, or the password for an account you do not normally use. piercing.

Recover lost Windows passwords

Password hint

The first thing to start before trying any stronger measures is to use the password hint feature. When you first create an account and password, you are also prompted to create a suggestion, which can be used to help remember it. If this doesn't work, move on to the next step.

Password hint

Log into another admin account on the system and reset the account

If you have multiple accounts on the system, please log in to another account and reset the password for the user account you forgot. Keep in mind, this will require you to know the password or know someone who has an account on the system with admin rights.

1. Press the **Win + R** key .
2. Enter: **control userpasswords2** .
3. Press the **Enter** key on the keyboard.
4. Select an account, then press **Reset password**.
5. Enter the new password and confirm it, then click **OK**.

Reset your Microsoft account

Resetting a password is ideal, but what if you don't have another account set up with admin rights on the PC? If you already use a Microsoft account, try this tip. You will need access to **Microsoft Account Settings** . So the first thing you need to do is visit [here](#).

Then select **I forgot my password** , then click **Next**.

Enter your email address then enter the captcha code that appears.

Choose your preferred method of sending code then click **Send Code**.

When the code is sent, enter the code and click **Next** to recover the account.

What to do if the above options are not available?

The next best option would be to perform a custom Windows installation, create a new account and password you can remember. Proceed with the recovery of individual files from the Windows.old folder, as well as reinstall the applications and drivers. This is how you do it:

1. Boot from the Windows setup media.
2. Select **Language, Time and Keyboard Method** , then click **Next**.
3. Click **Install now**.
4. Wait while the installation process begins.
5. Accept the license terms and click **Next**.
6. Click on **Custom**
7. Select the primary partition and then click **Next**.

You will receive the following warning:

The partition you selected might contain files from a previous Windows installation.

(The partition you selected may contain files from previous Windows installations. If so, these files and folders will be moved to a folder named Windows.old. You will be able to access information in Windows.old, but you will not be able to use the previous version of Windows).

Click **OK** and wait while Windows installs.

Once the setup is complete, you can browse the root directory of your system drive and restore individual files from the Windows.old folder.

Browse the root directory of the system drive and restore individual files from the Windows.old folder. At the time of this writing, older functions like the **Create password reset disk** no longer work in Windows 10 or Windows 8x. If you're running an older version of Windows like Windows 7 and you're not in a situation where you need to recover your password, now would be a good time to create a password reset drive.

Ways to avoid losing your password

The article should also mention ways to avoid this situation is to create a passphrase you can remember for your Microsoft account. After installation, you can use a simple 4-digit PIN instead of a password. To know more about that read one of the following articles:
