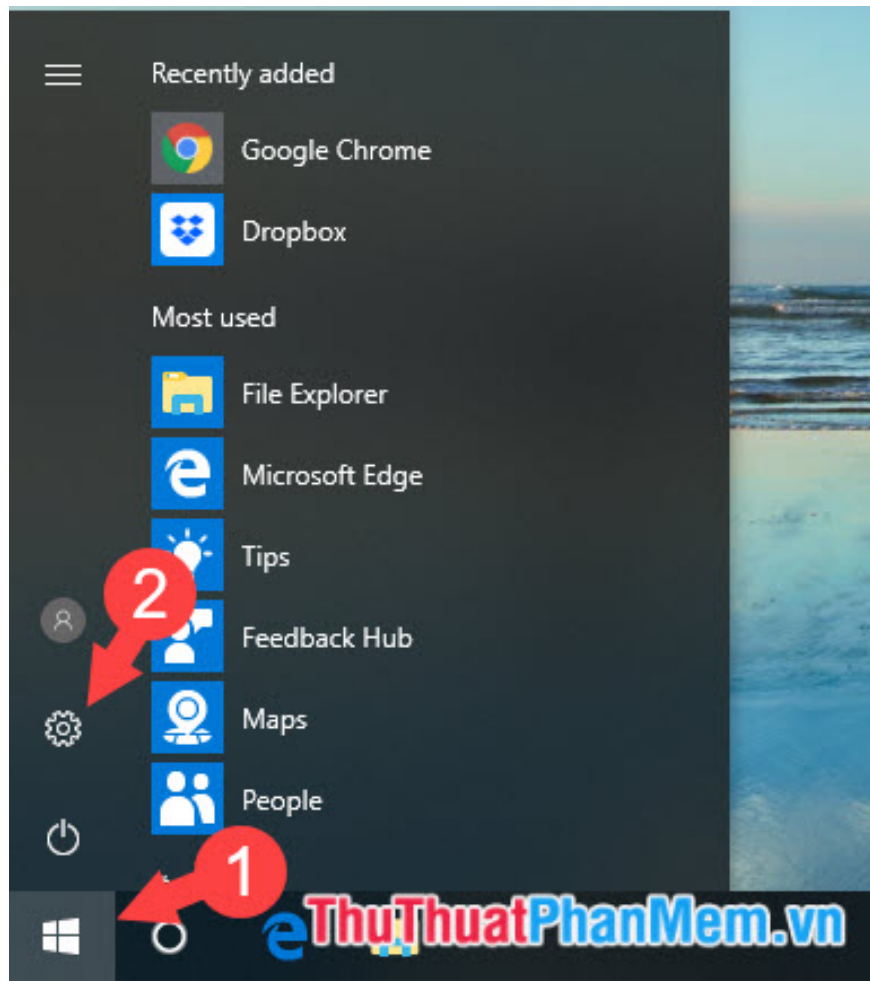

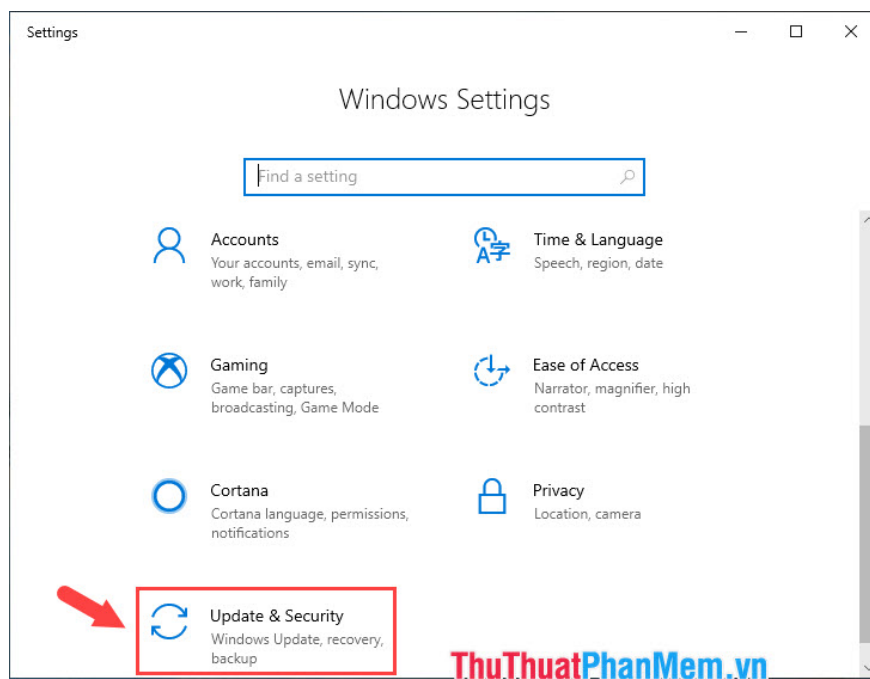

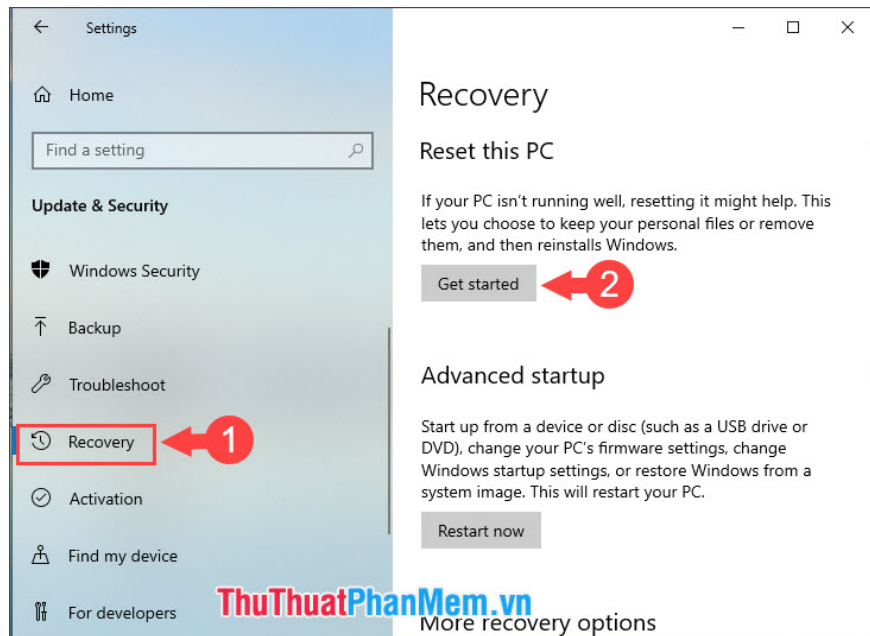
Step 1: You open the **Start Menu => Settings** .



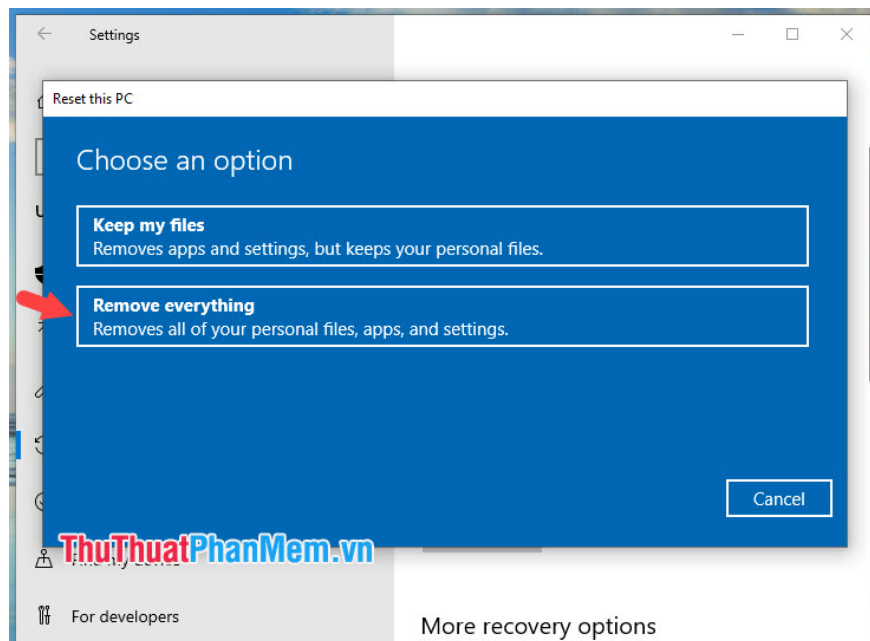
Step 2: Select Update & Security .



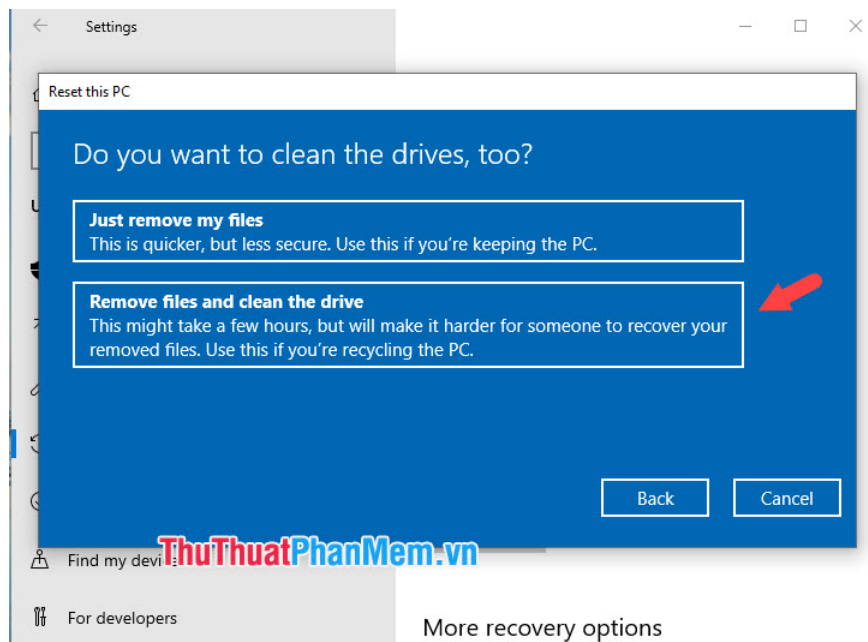
Step 3: Select **Recovery** => You go to **Reset this PC** and select **Get started** .



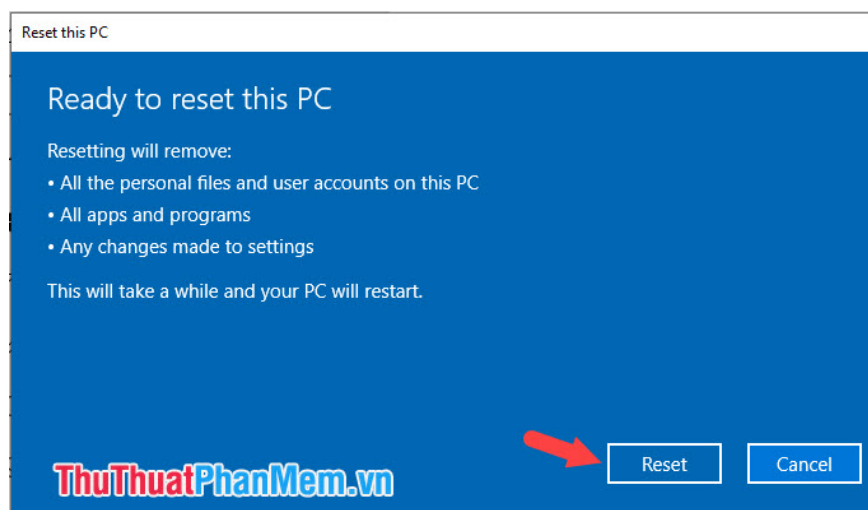
Step 4: Choose **Remove everything** .



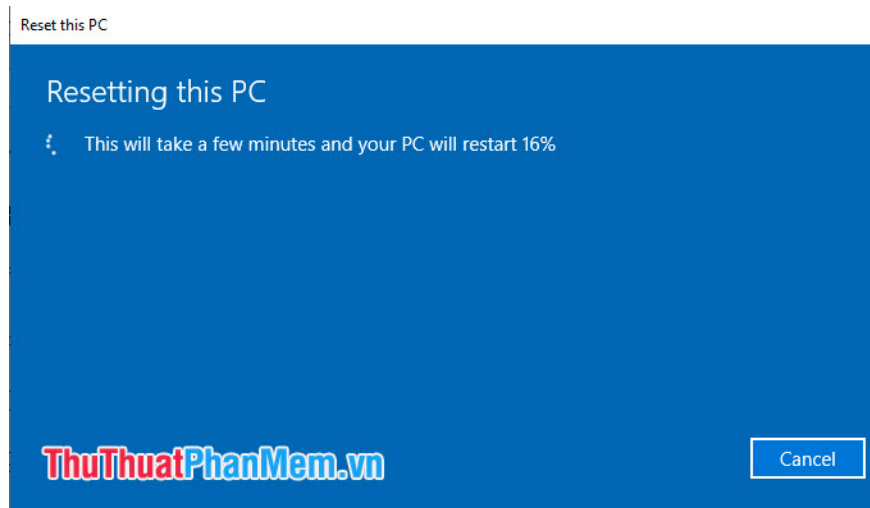
Step 5: Choose **Remove files and clean the drive** .



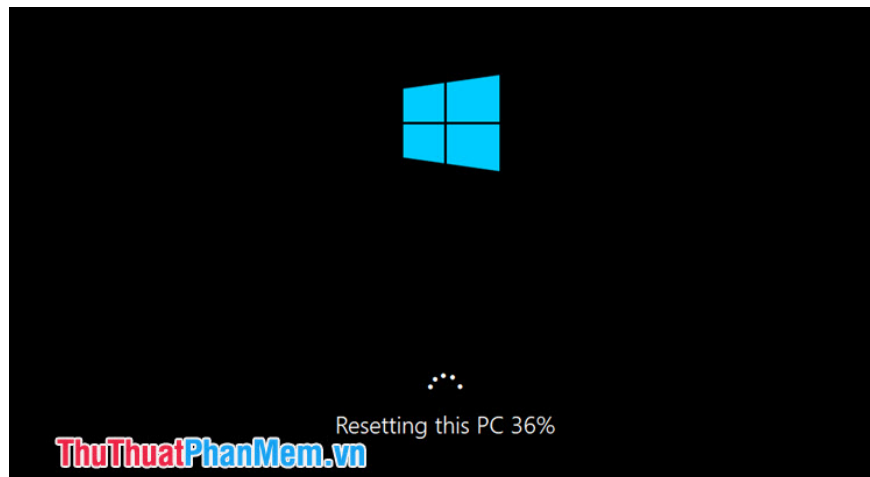
Step 6: Click on **Reset** to restore the computer from the beginning.



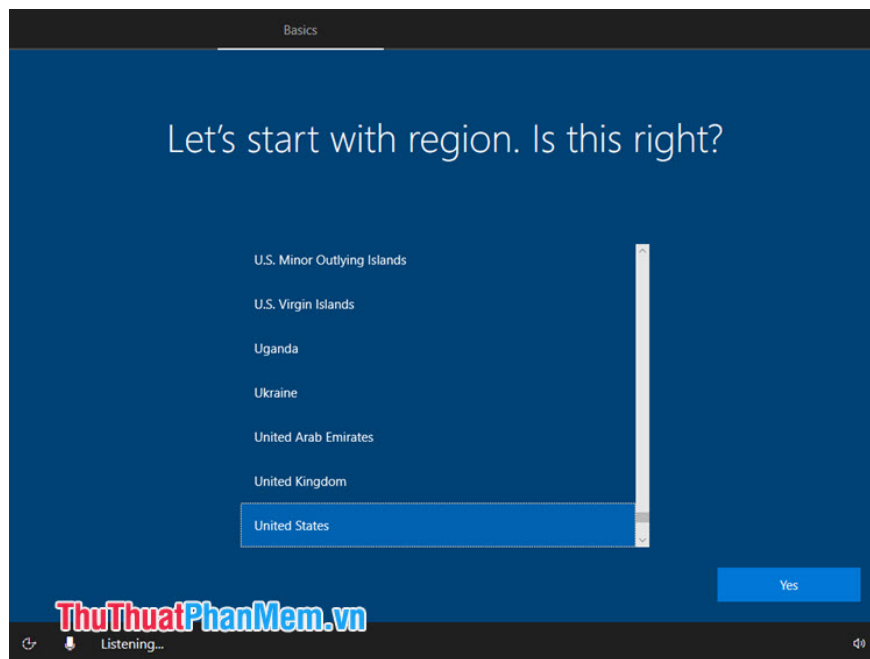
Then the system begins to delete data and restore from the beginning. The recovery time depends on your computer configuration and the amount of data stored on your hard drive.



And the recovery process starts, it will take about 15-30 minutes.



Step 7: After the restore is complete, the computer will automatically restart and the first Windows installation interface will display and provide instructions to the user.



And this is the result after the Windows 10 computer is restored to a newly installed state.
