

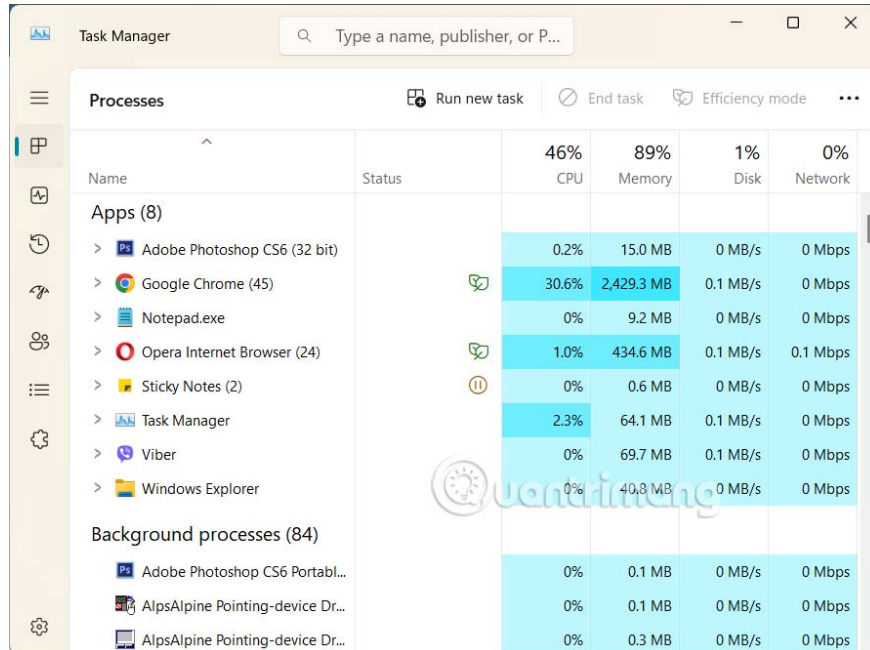
How to return to the old Task Manager interface on Windows 11

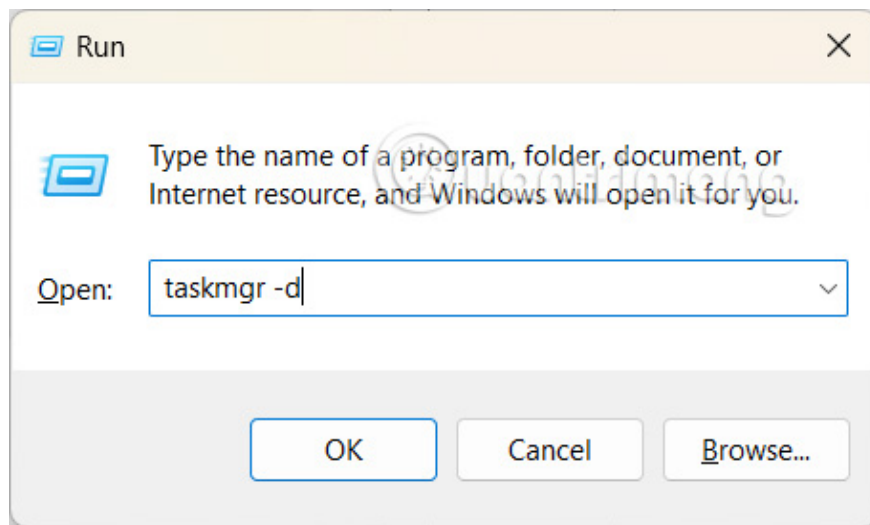
Instructions for installing the old Task Manager interface on Windows 11

Here's what the new Task Manager looks like on Windows 11.



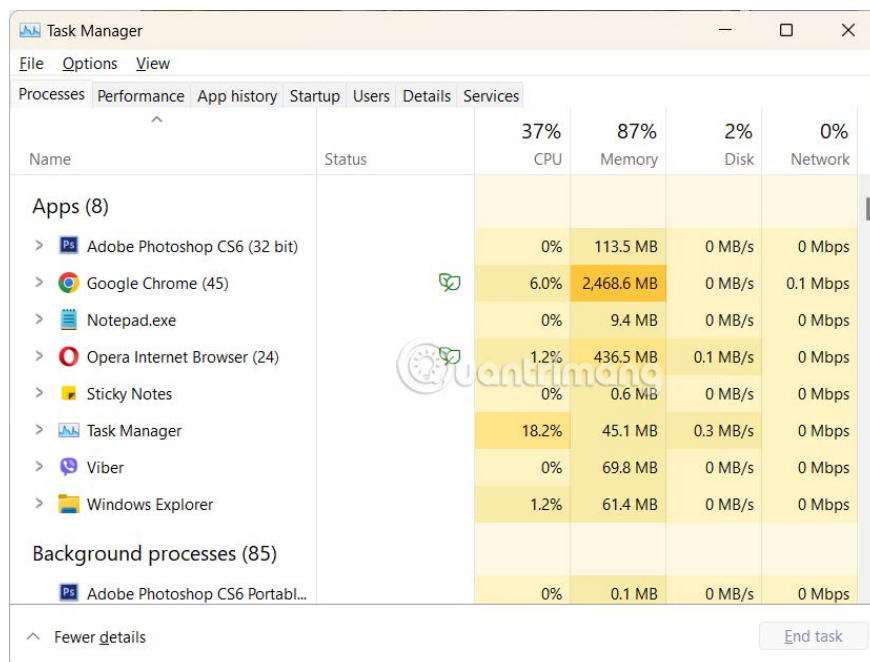
Step 1:

Press **Win + R** to open the Run dialog box and **enter the command taskmgr -d** to launch Task Manager without the new XAML user interface.



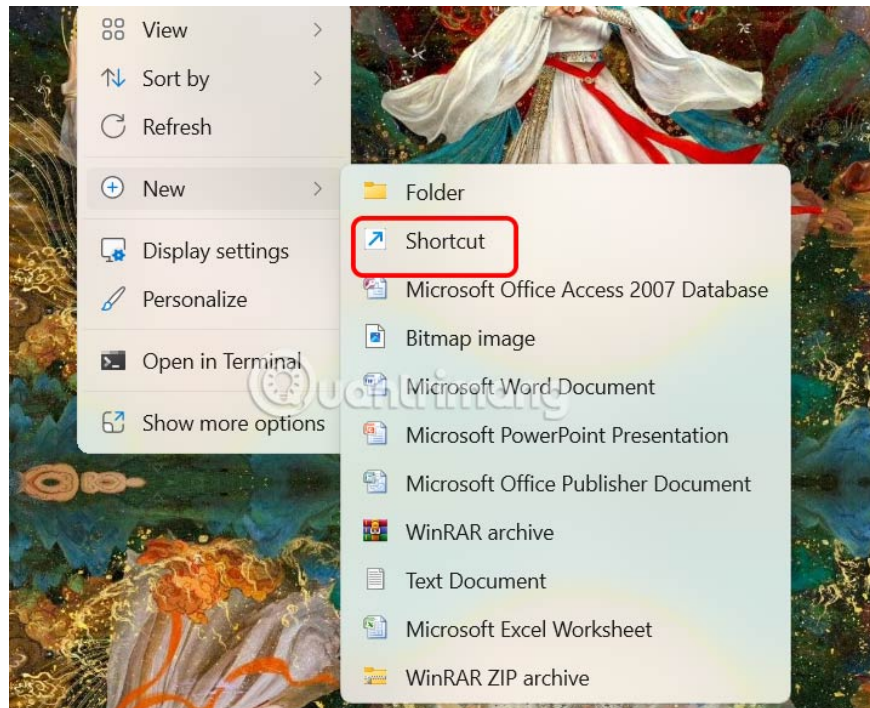
Step 2:

Then you will see the old Task Manager interface on Windows 11 as shown below.



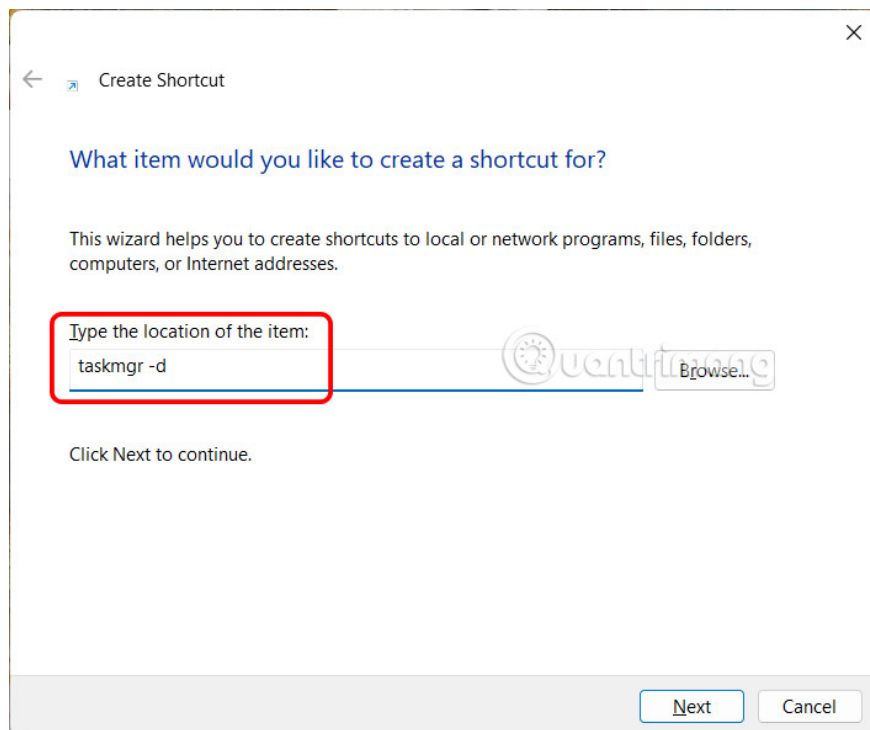
Step 3:

To pin the old version of Task Manager to the taskbar, right-click the desktop and select New > Shortcut.

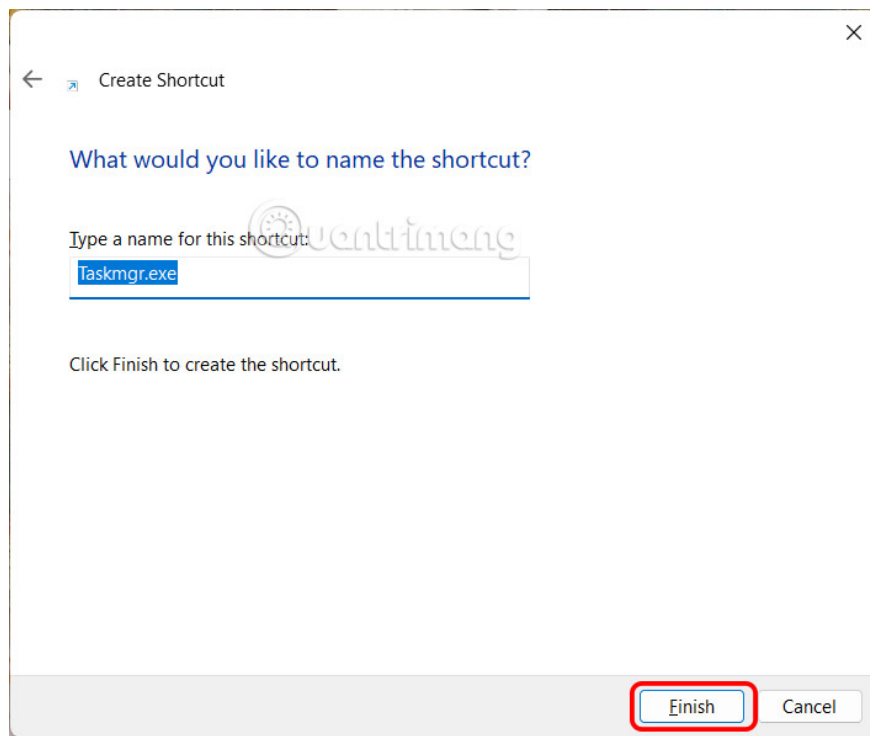


Step 4:

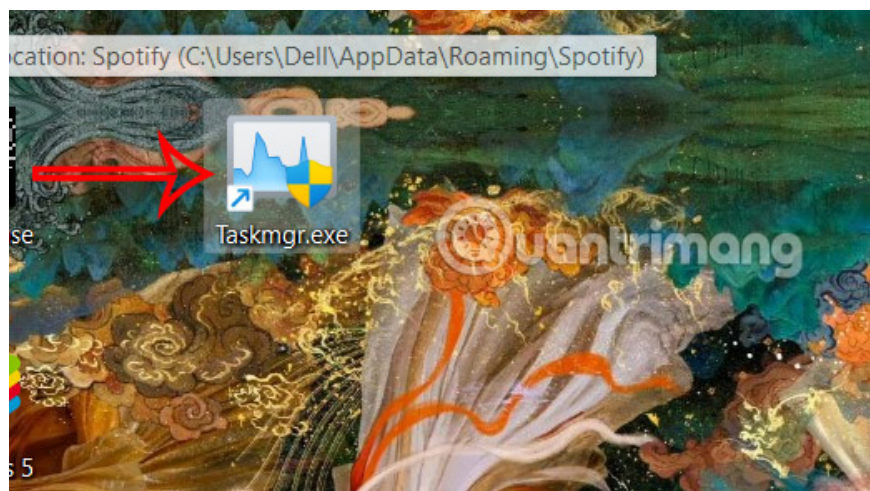
Now enter **the command taskmgr -d** in the Type the location of the item box and click Next below.
