2. How to securely protect your Samsung Galaxy A12

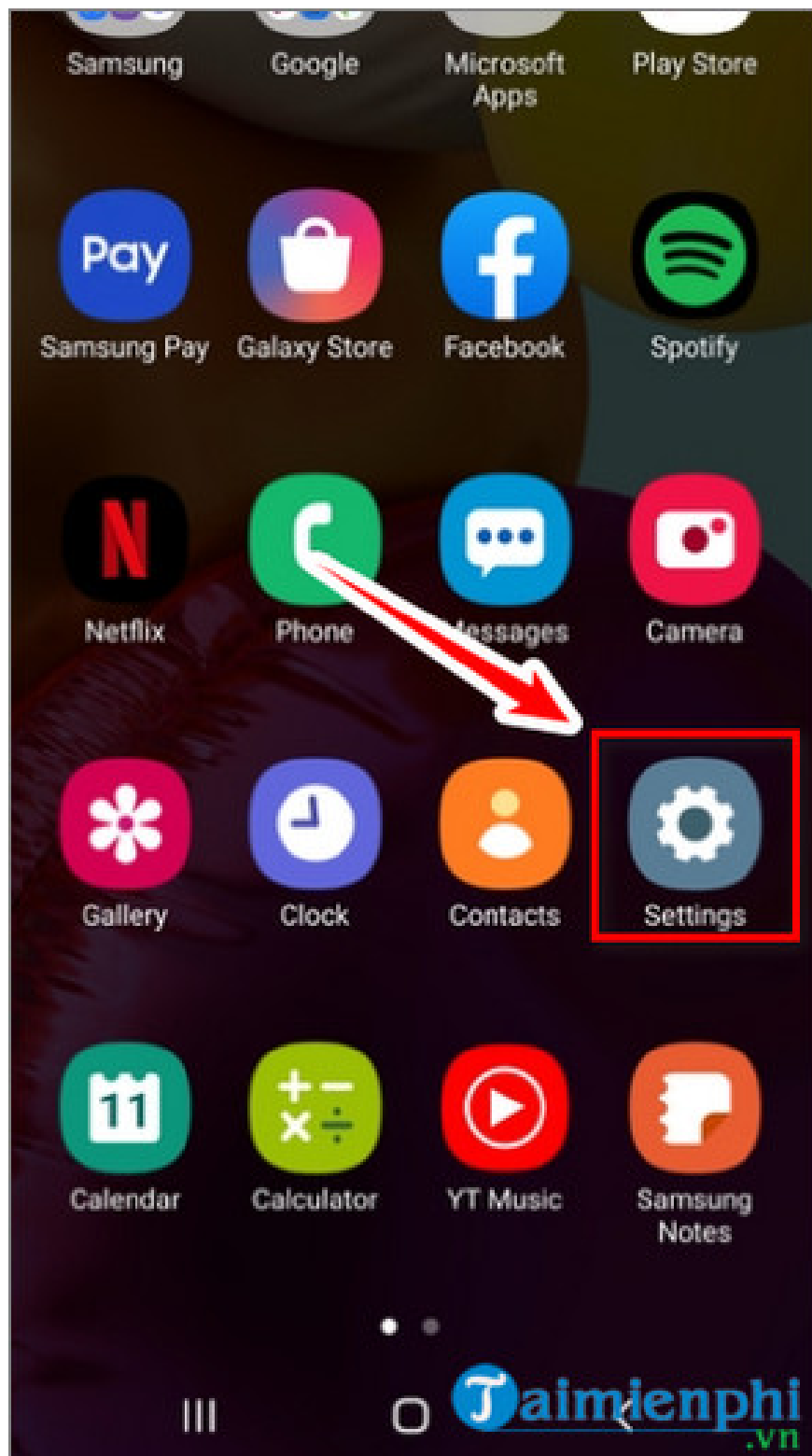

To ensure the best security for your Galaxy A12, users can refer to some of the solutions below:

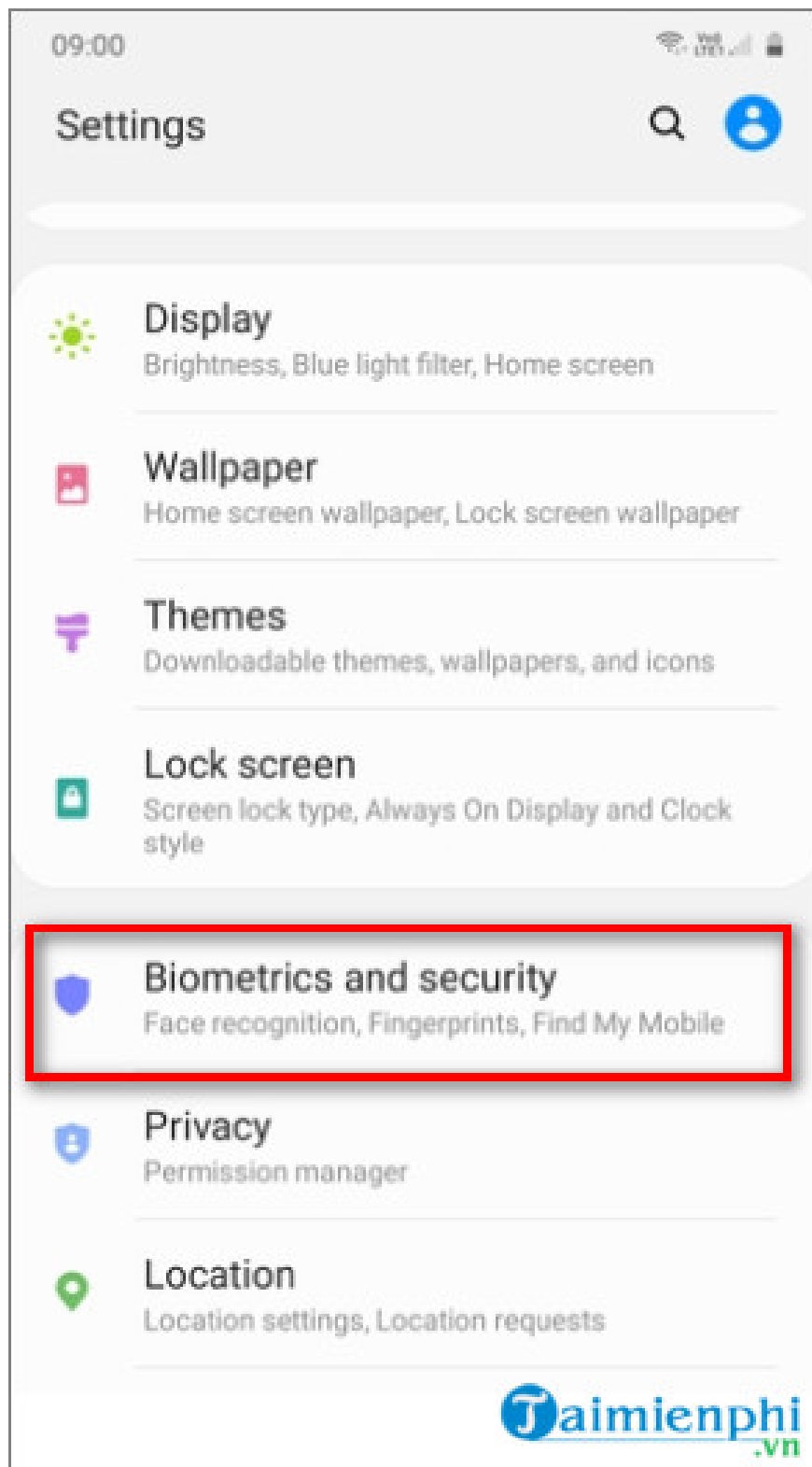
Method 1: Change SIM PIN

Step 1 : Swipe up from the bottom of the screen to access the main menu interface of the Samsung Galaxy A12.

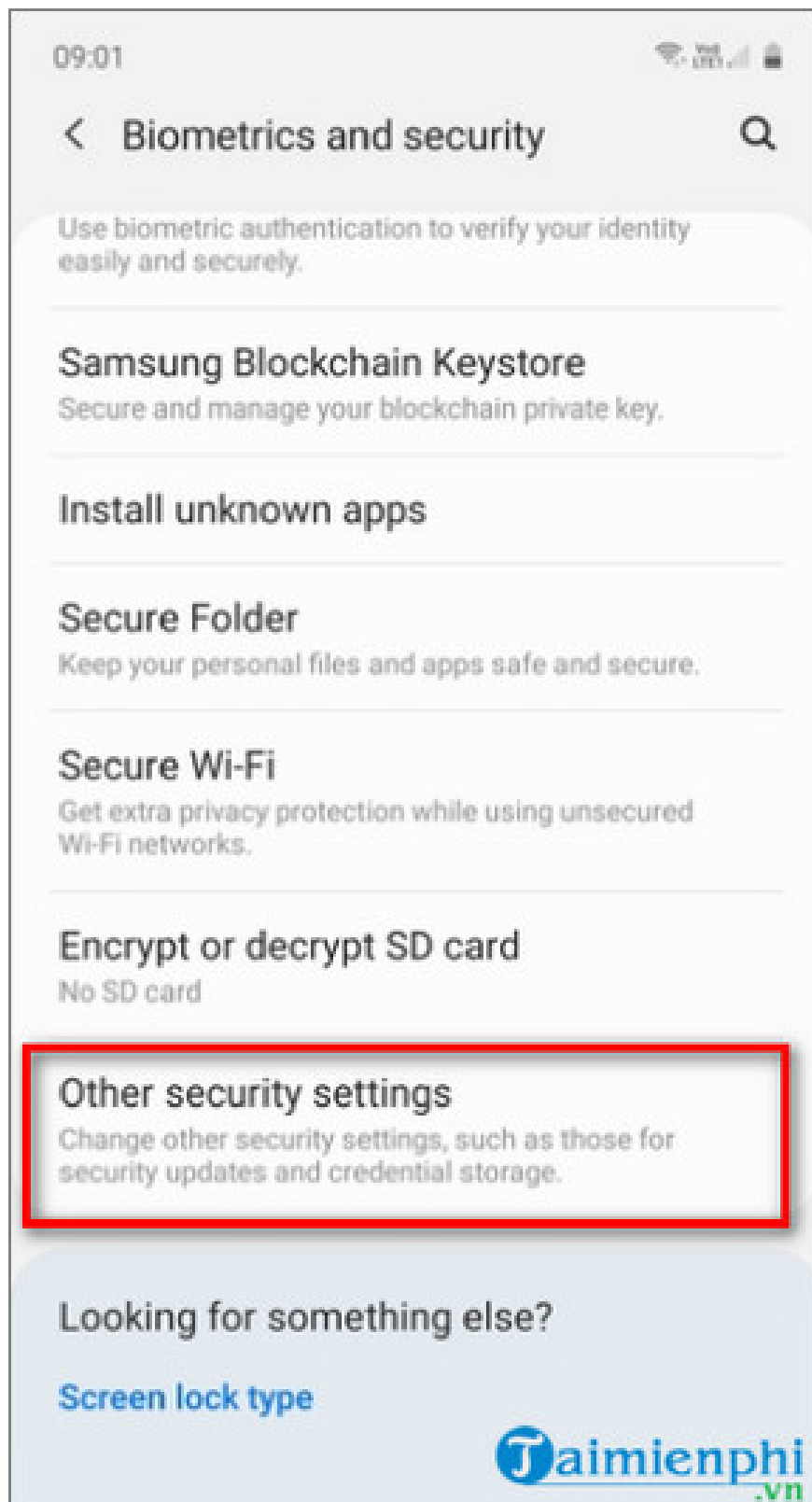
Step 2 : Open the Settings app .



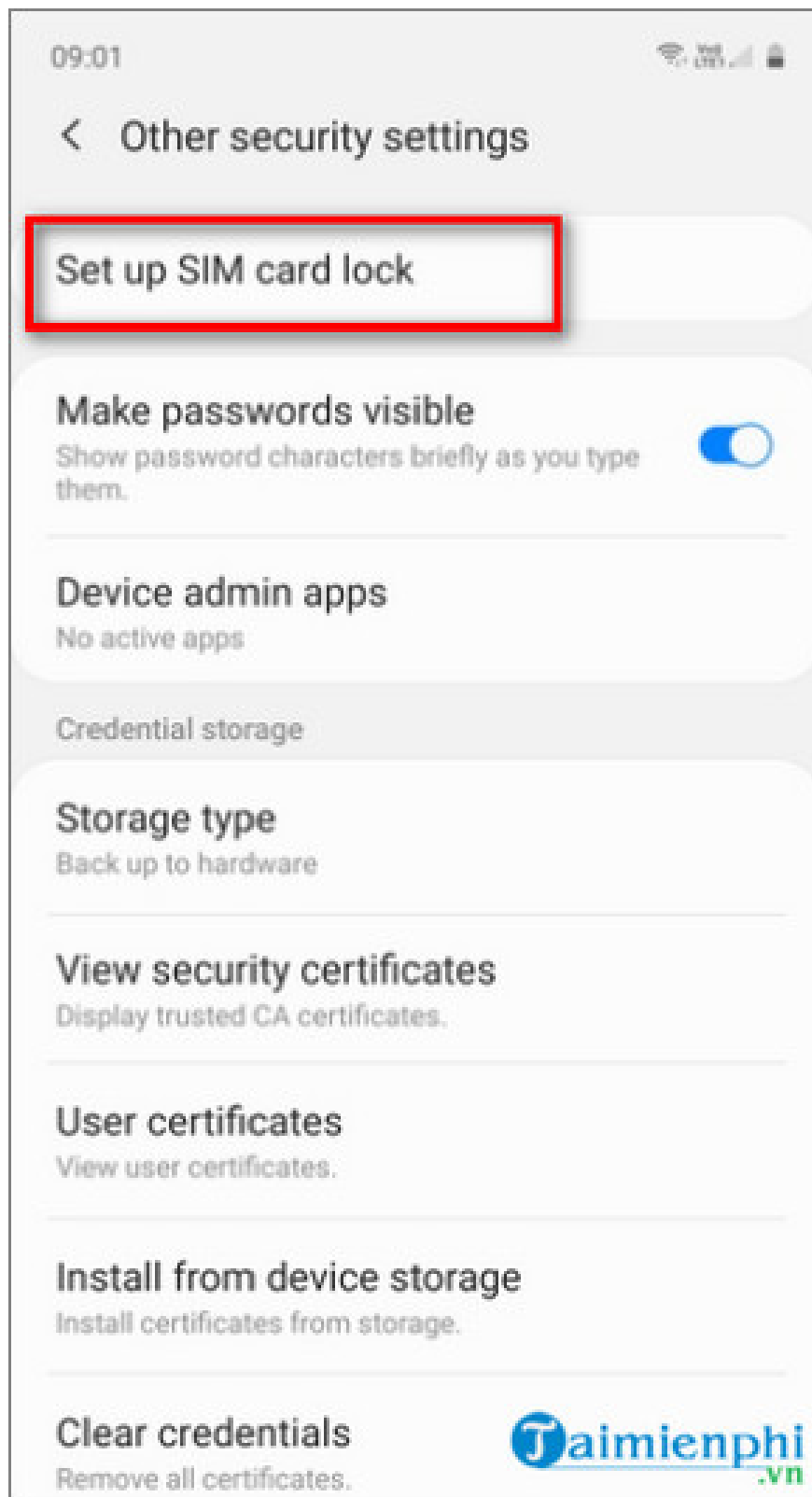
Step 3: Scroll down, find and select **Biometrics and Security** .



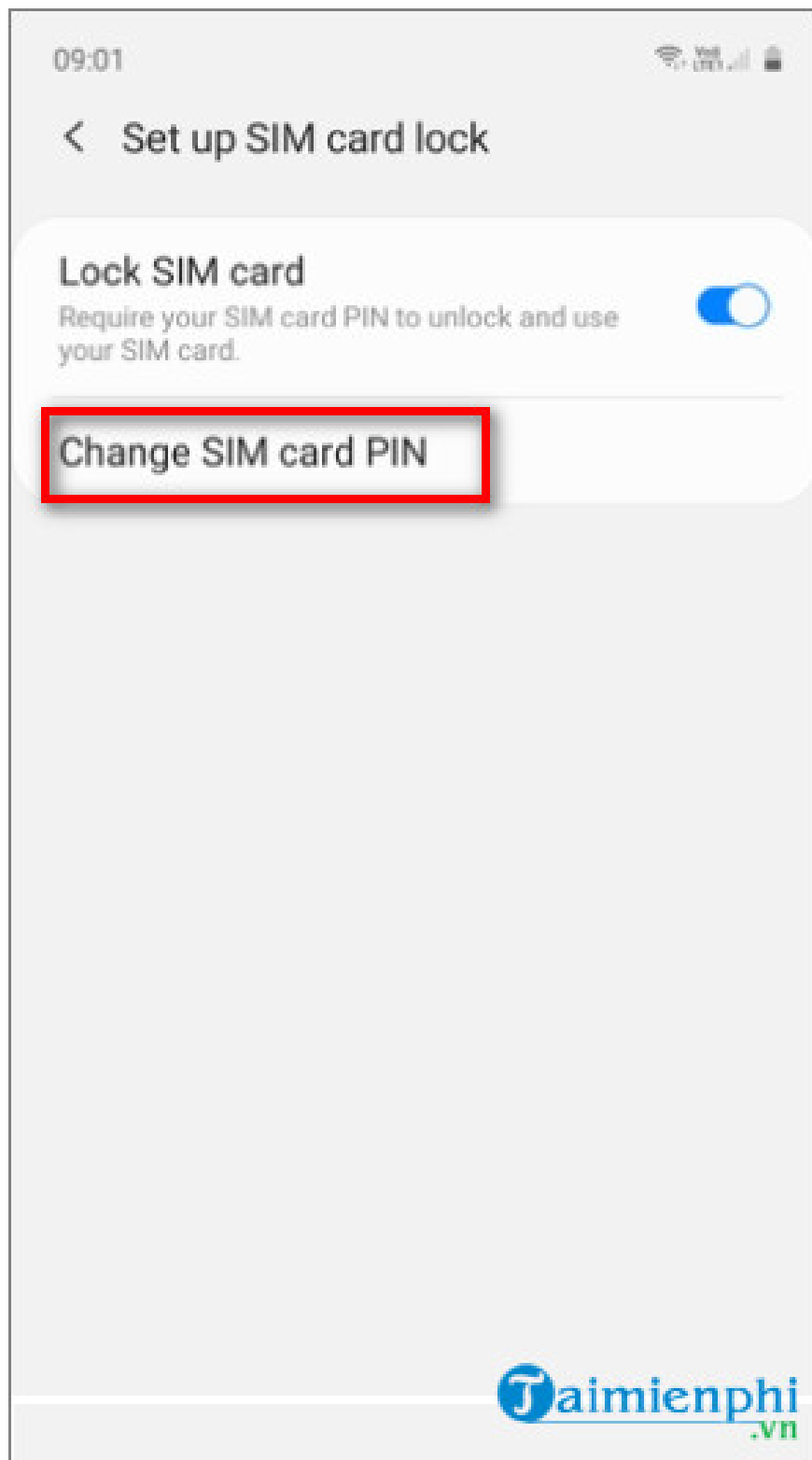
Step 4 : In the window that appears on the screen, select the "**Other security settings** " option.



Step 5: Select Set up SIM card lock .



Step 6: Select the option **Change SIM card PIN** (or change the SIM card PIN).



Step 7: In the window that appears, enter your old PIN and then press **OK**.

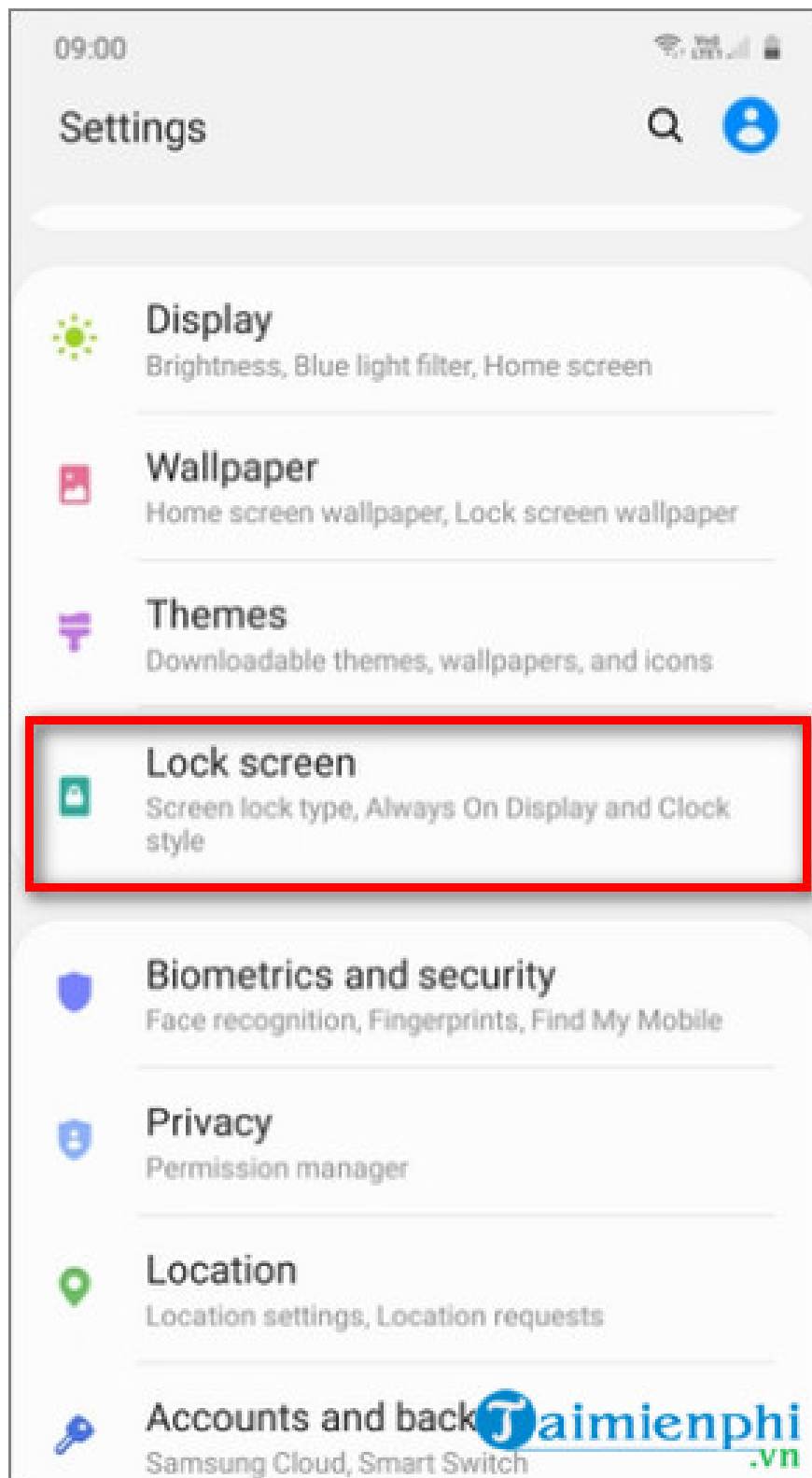
Step 8: Then enter the new PIN you want to change to and press **OK** again.



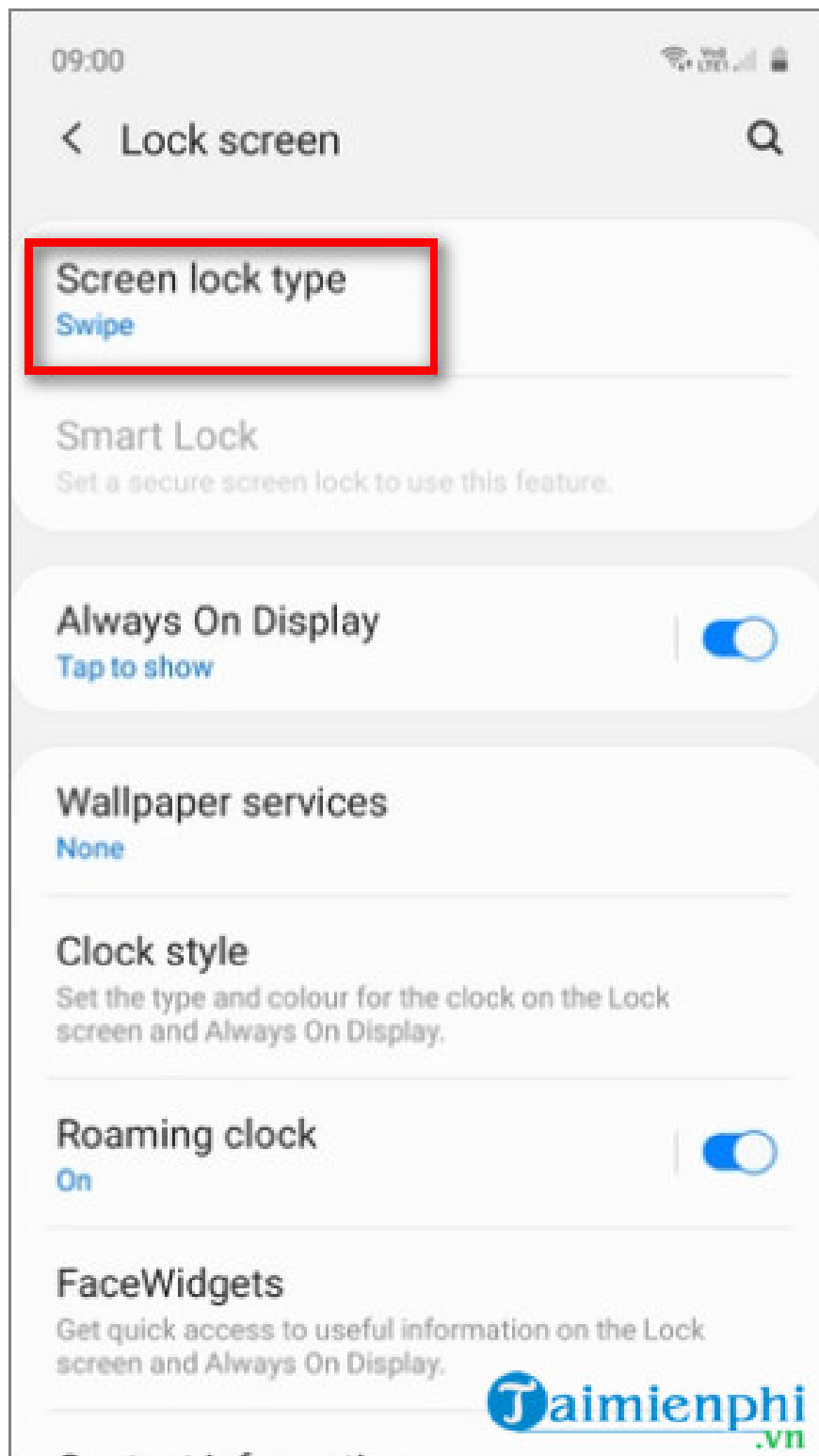
Step 9: Re-enter the new PIN to confirm, then press **OK** to save the changes.

Method 2: Set up screen unlock using a pattern.

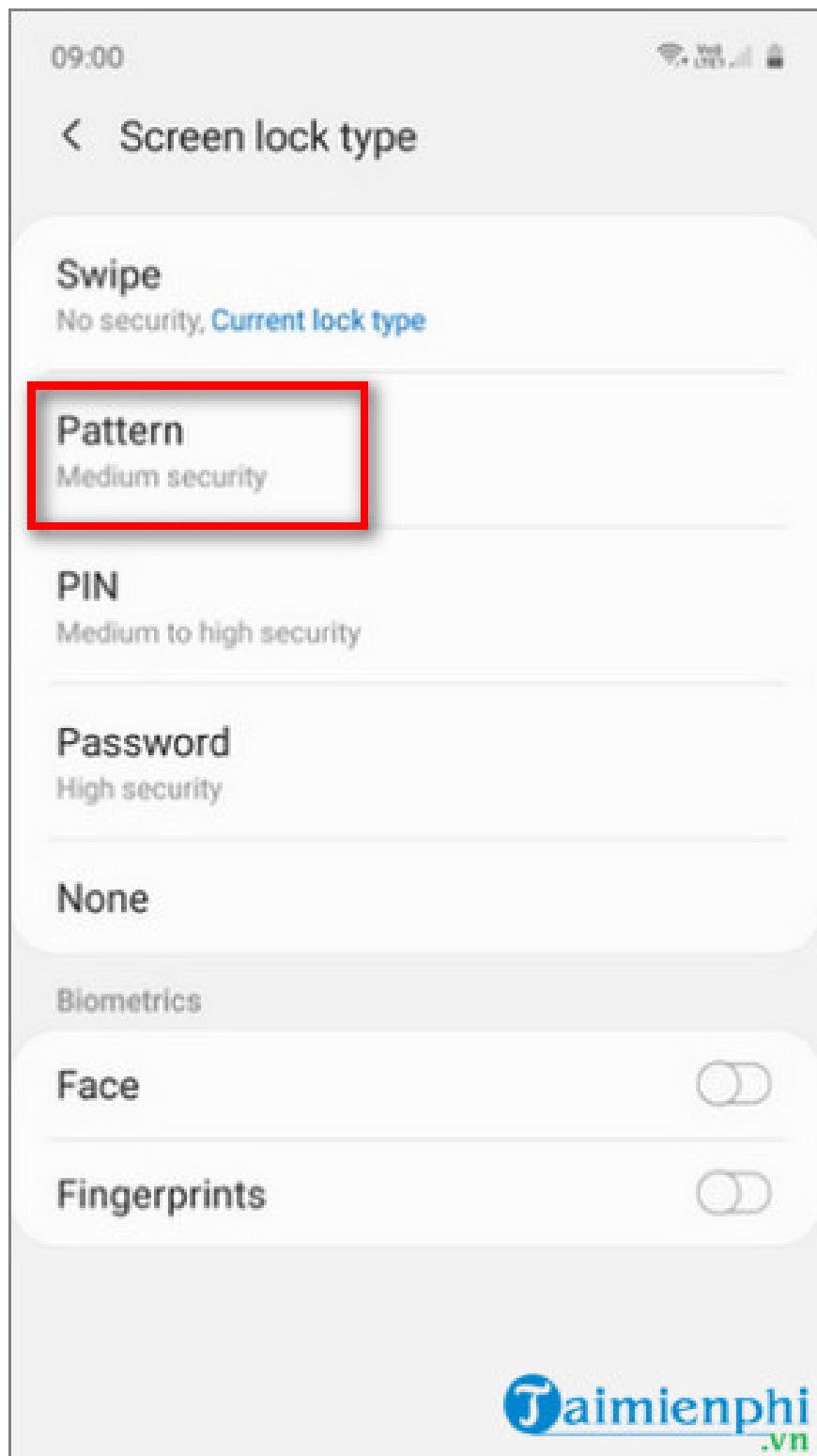
Step 1: Open the **Settings** app and then find and tap the **Lock screen** option .



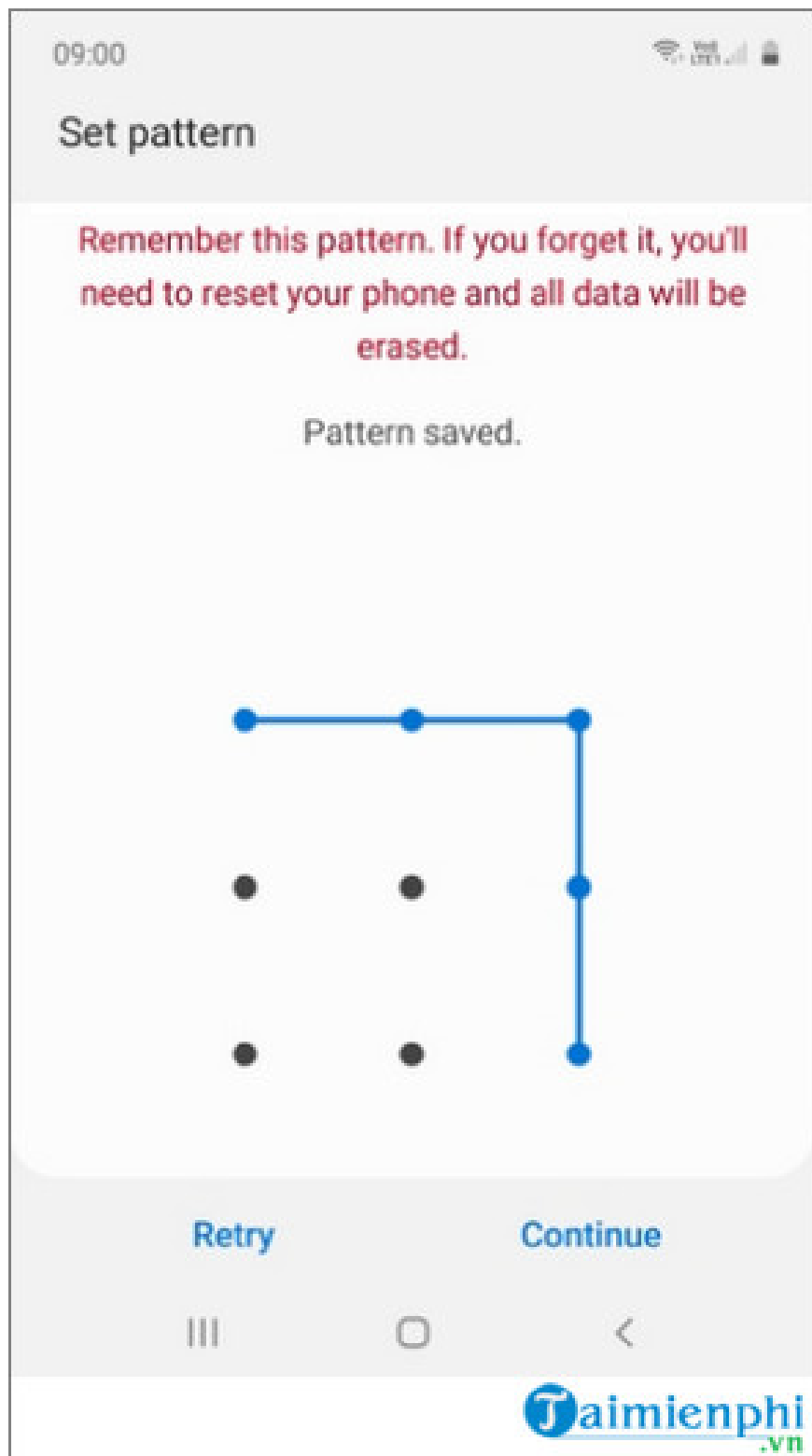
Step 2 : In the window displayed on the screen, find and select **Screen lock type** .



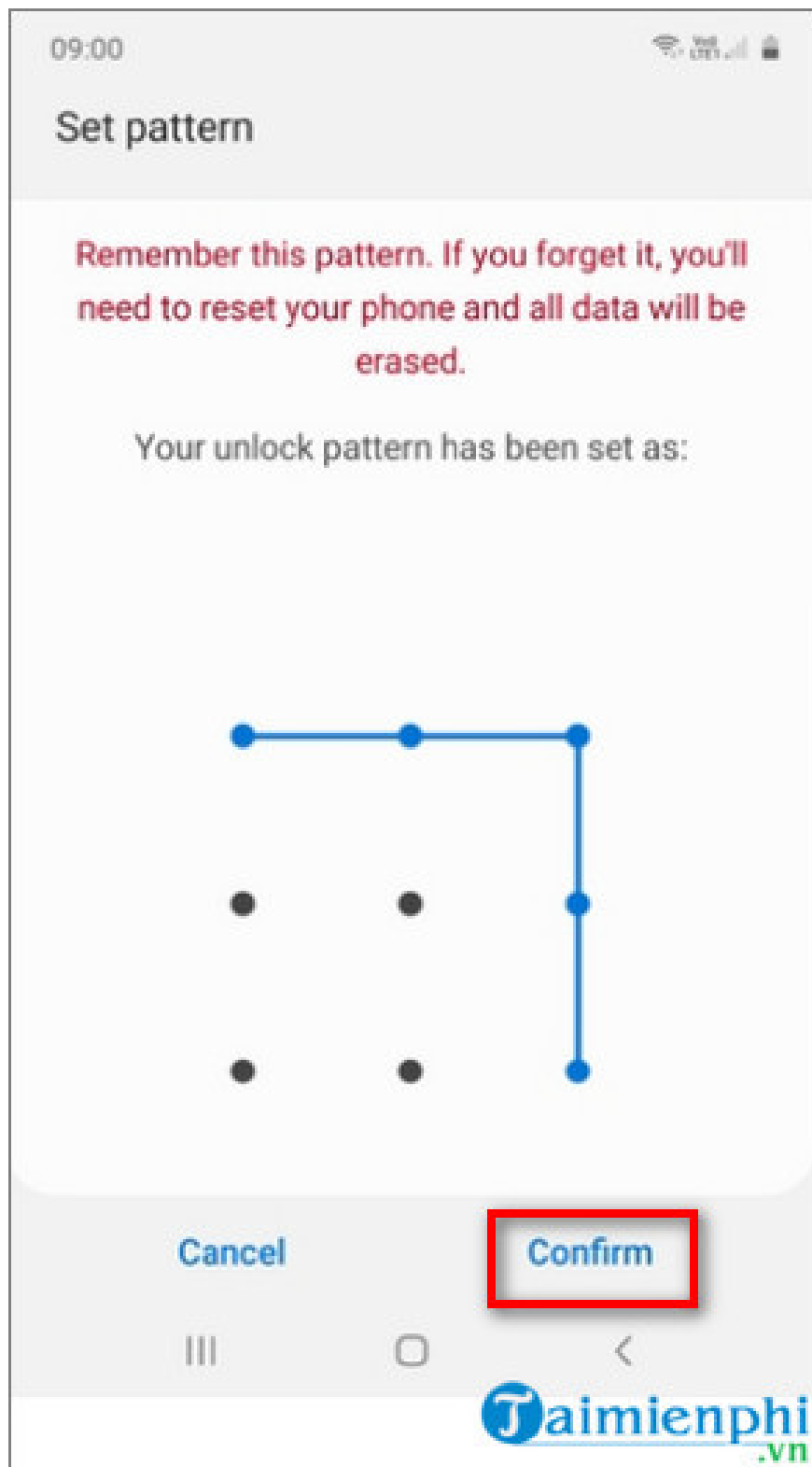
Step 3: Next, select **Pattern** to set up unlocking using a pattern.



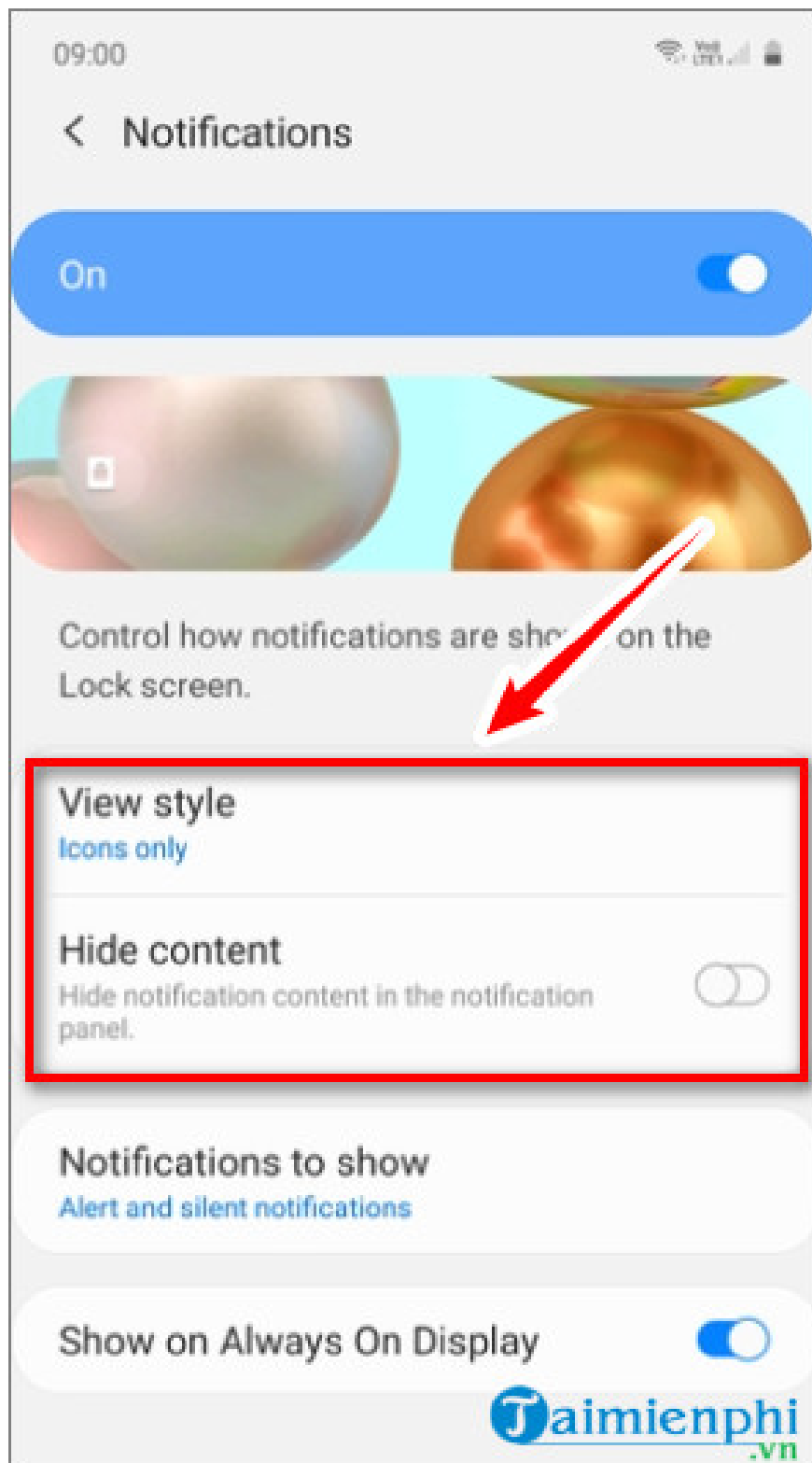
Step 4: Draw any pattern you want to use to unlock your device, then tap **Continue** .



Step 5 : Draw the pattern you just created to confirm your password, then press **Confirm** to save the screen unlock pattern.



Step 6: Finally, in this step you can set whether to show or hide notifications on the lock screen by selecting **the View style** option (show notifications) or the **Hide content** option (hide content). After you're done, tap **Done** .
