

How to see when to open the nearest computer on Windows

For some users, the Hibernate (or Sleep) feature available on Windows is very useful. With this feature, you do not need to wait for the operating system to update every time you turn it on or off, and you will also save a lot of your time because just closing the phone is done, and the shutdown is done. let the computer take care of itself


The tips below will help you determine the closest time you opened your computer. This is a very useful tool for those who regularly use Hibernate and Sleep.

Computer crashed causing Windows to crash, how to fix it?

For some users, the Hibernate (*or Sleep*) feature available on Windows is very useful. With this feature, you do not need to wait for the operating system to update every time you turn it on or off, and you will also save a lot of your time because just closing the phone is done, and the shutdown is done. let the computer take care of itself. Then when you want to work again, just open the lid, turn on the power button and wait for the machine to start up in just a few seconds without fearing that the previously opened software is turned off then you must reopen when you use the shortcut Traditional (*Shut Down*) machine.

However, this feature leads to a situation where you may need to know when your most recent opening time is, to see how long it has been. If you have such needs then this is how you can check.

Method 1: Use the Command Prompt command line



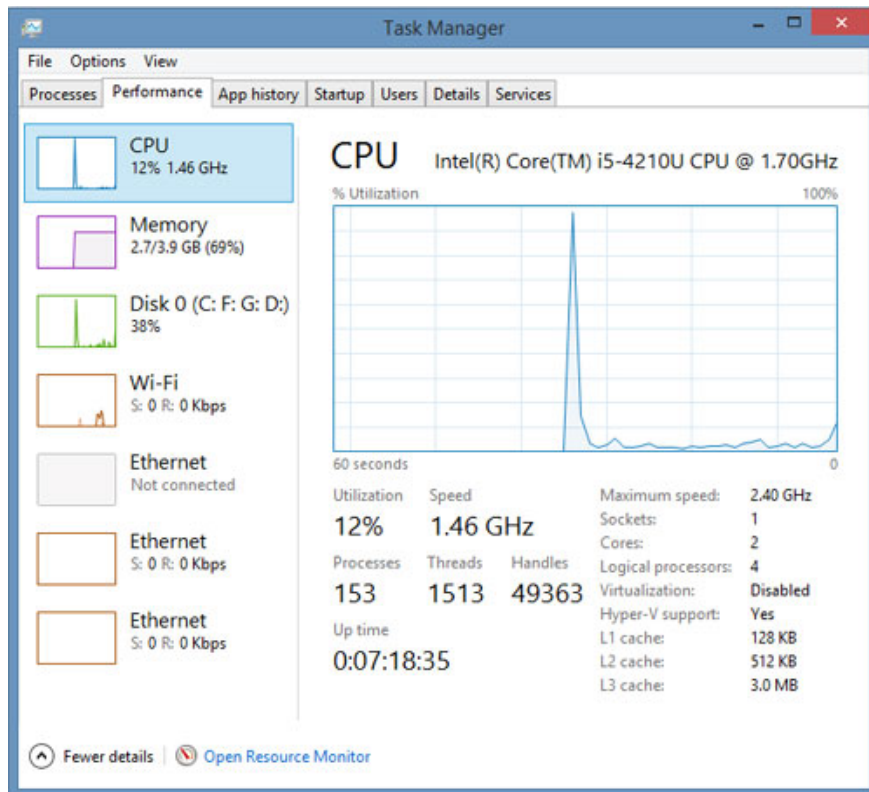

Turn on the Run window with **Windows + R** key, enter `cmd` and then enter the following in italic code: `systeminfo | find /i "Boot Time"`, press Enter and wait for about 1 minute for the crawler, after finishing, your most recent turn-on time will appear (*including day, hour, minute*).

Method 2: Use Task Manager



This is the easiest way if you don't want to remember the lengthy code, turn on **Task Manager**, click the **Performance** tab (*both Windows 7 and Windows 8*), then you'll see the time it has been running since The last opening in the Up Time section (*for Windows 8, it is on the CPU part*). Although it is easier to open, its display will be a little messy (*currently in the form of date: hour: minute: seconds*).
