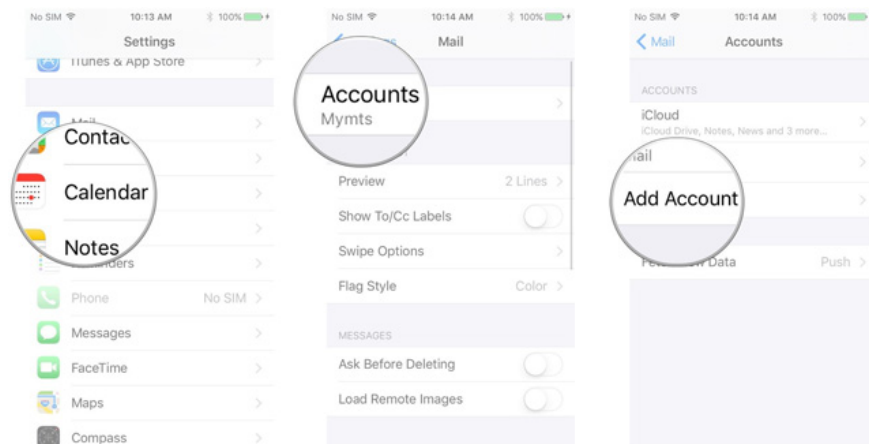
1. 7 Outlook.com tricks you may not know yet

Step 1: Launch the **Settings** app on iPhone or iPad.

Step 2: Touch **Mail** , **Contacts** or **Calendar** .

Step 3: Touch **Accounts** .

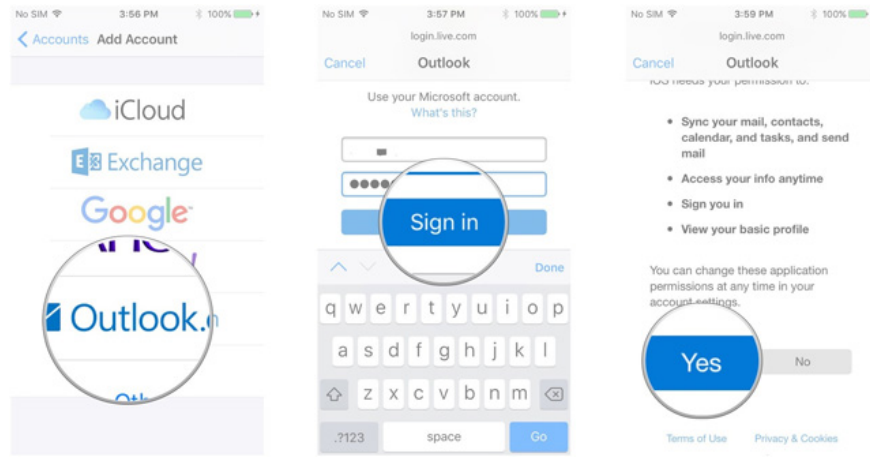
Step 4: Touch **Add Account** .



Step 5: Touch **Outlook.com** .

Step 6: Enter your username and password for your Outlook.com account and click **Sign in** .

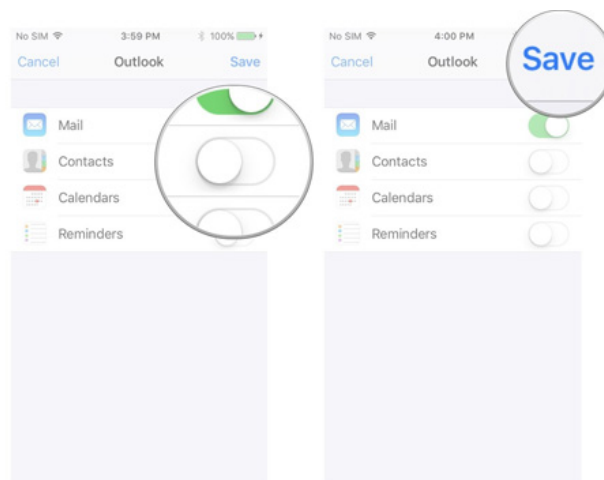
Step 7: Click **Yes** to allow Outlook to access your information.



Step 8: Touch the conversion bar next to each service you want to activate. If there is already a calendar, mail or contacts available on your iPhone, you will be asked if you keep it on your phone or delete them, select the option you want.

Step 9: Click **Save** in the upper right corner.

And is done! Now, you will receive all mail from Microsoft email service to the inbox of iPhone or iPad. You can also set up Outlook.com as an Exchange account. Just follow the steps above but select the **Exchange** option for the account type and use **m.hotmail.com** as the server.
