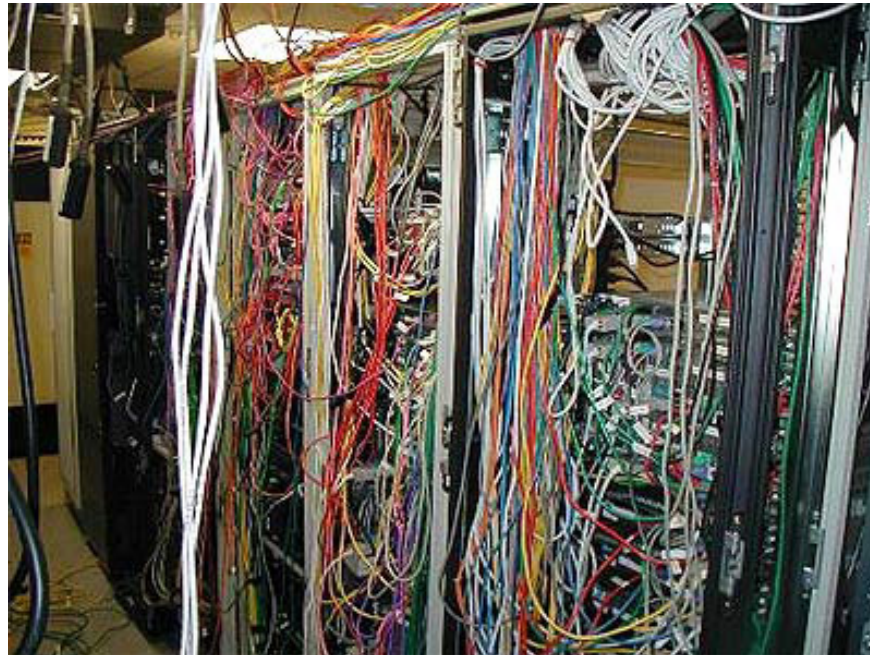


# How to stack cable bundles in the server room

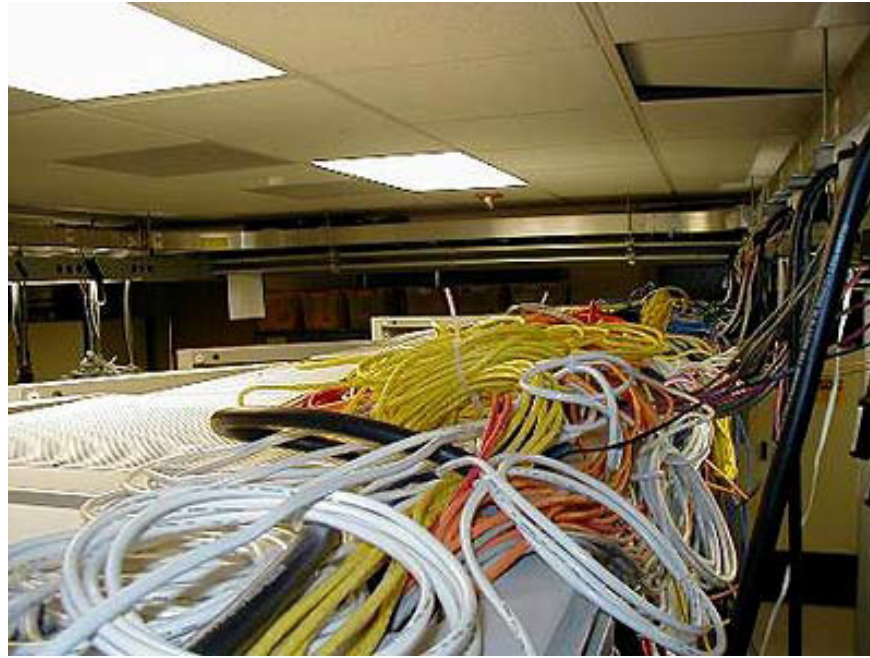
The sloppy technicians will make the room the server system into a dangerous barbed wire, but the simple tip below will restore order for this important data container.

Although wireless technology can eliminate tangled cables hidden behind a computer desk, it is still possible to see these "pasta" in server rooms. Many rooms are not reasonably designed to arrange neat strings, which are easy to pose many risks.



This is a sloppy server room with all kinds of cables, wires .



Many sections of 100 - 200 m cable to run from one price to another.



To prepare to remove this jumble, you can build a rack containing plastic boxes. Each box will contain a carefully labeled cable.



First, remove the tangled wires in the room.

You have to make a diagram of servers with things that connect them like wire type, switch . This helps you determine the correct connection and the corresponding cable. When finished, you will be free to unplug the cord without fear of plugging it in later.

Clean in-door and surrounding rooms (if available) because this rodent will bite off the connecting cables.



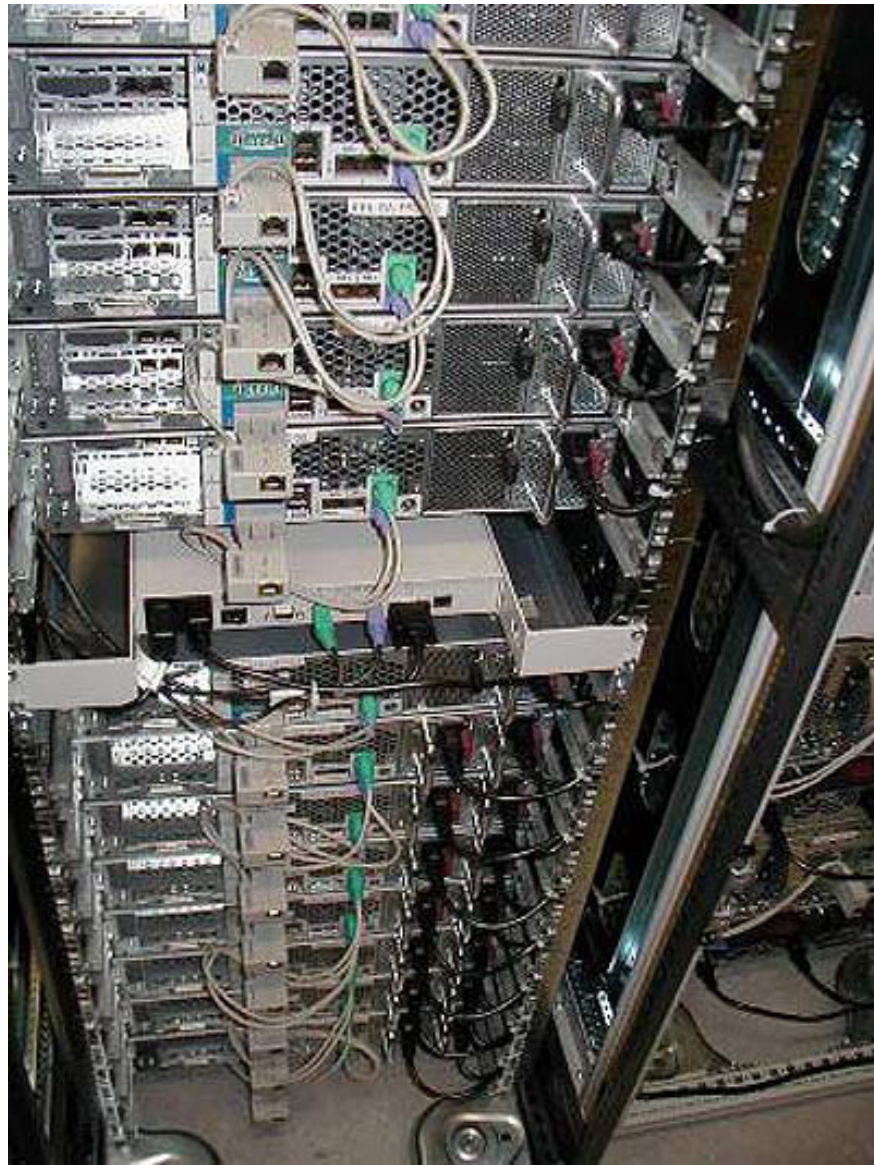
Network cables and wires should be neatly rolled on the top of the machine before you plug in other types of wires.



Plastic boxes contain different types of cables.



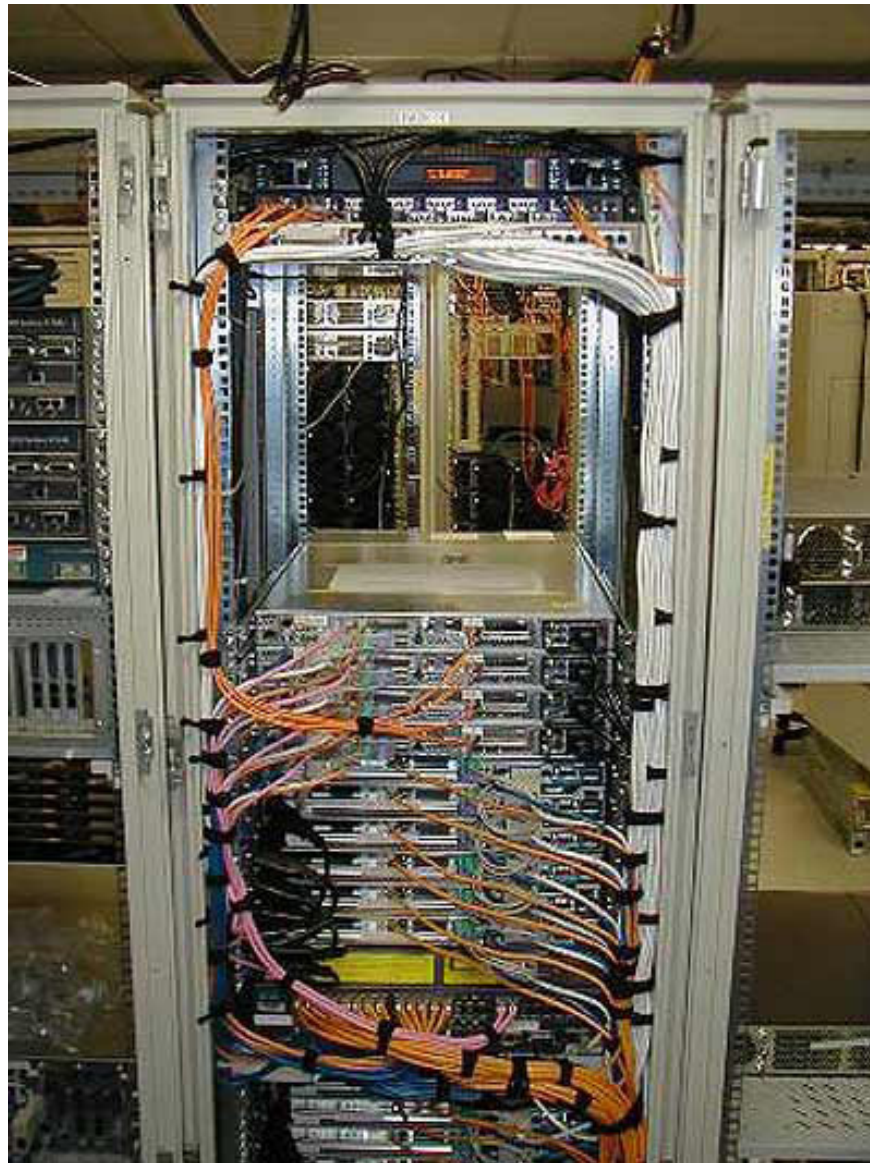
The server blades are rearranged.

Wrap the cable with some fastener in each piece, creating neat and beautiful look.



Each string color is tied into a separate, recognizable bundle.
