

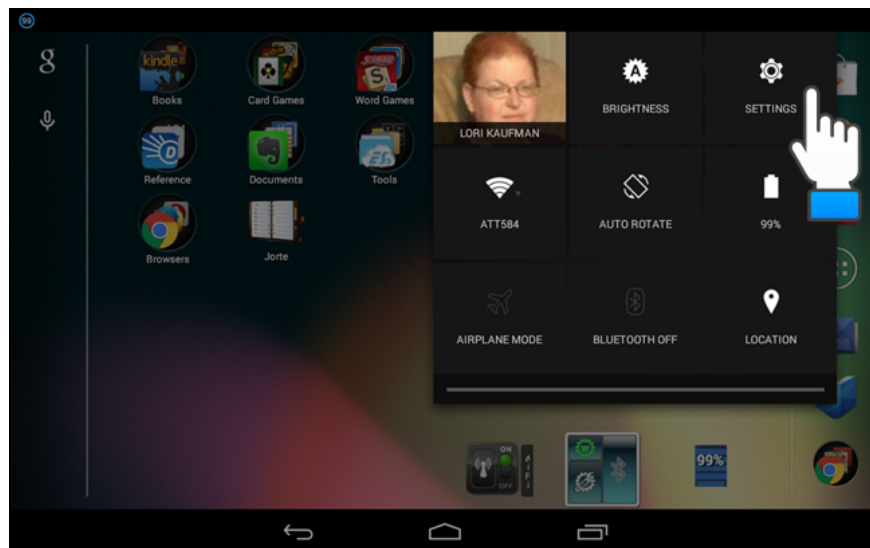
How to turn off Auto-Correct on an Android device?

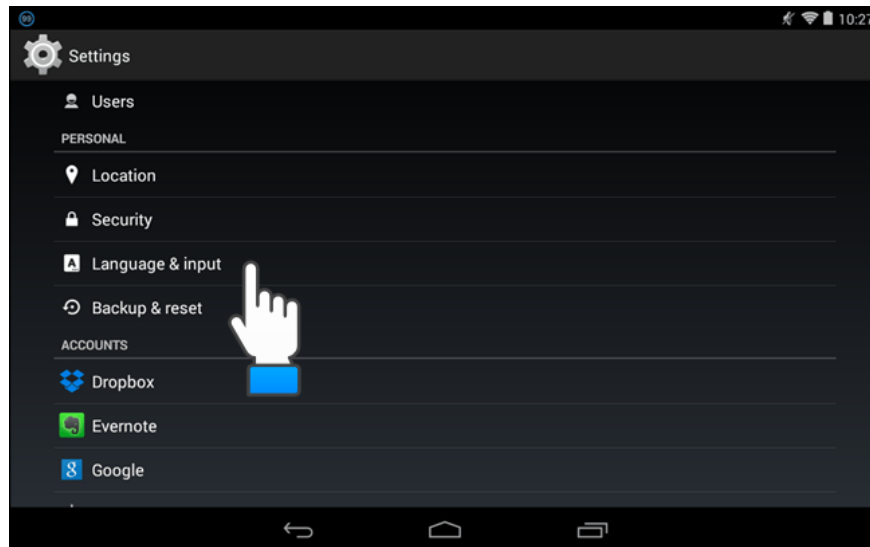

To turn off Auto-Correct on Android, refer to the following article of Network Administrator.

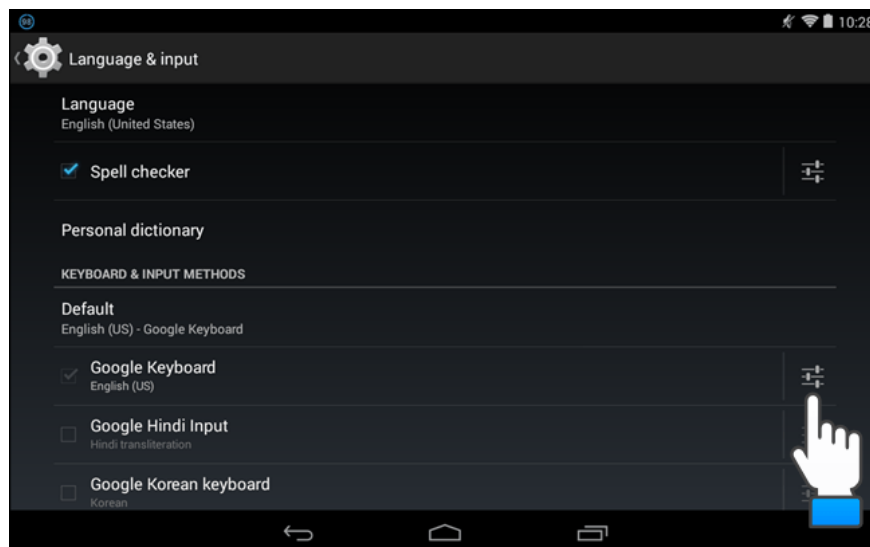

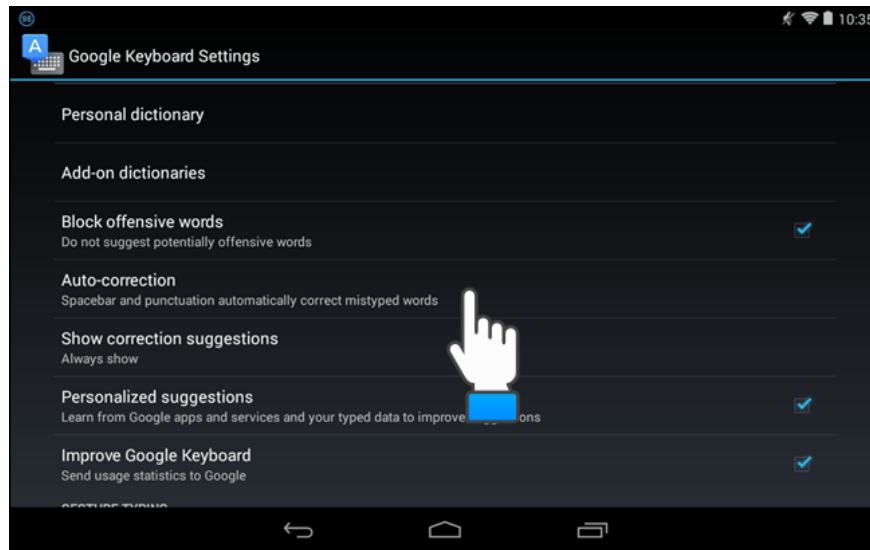
To turn off Auto-Correct on Android, first go to **Settings** .



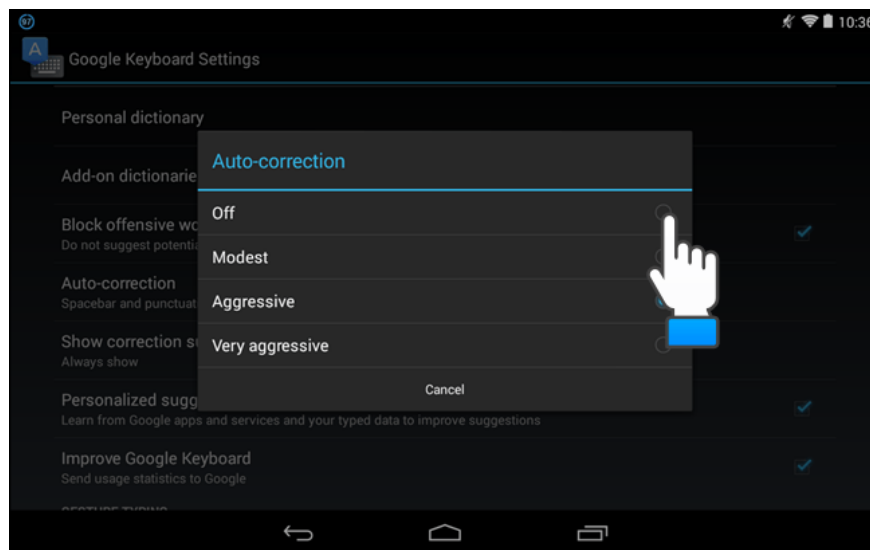
On the Settings interface, in the Personal section you select **Language & input**.



Next on the Language & input interface, Keyboard & Input Methods section, touch the **Quick Settings** icon on the right side of the **Google Keyboard** option.



On the screen displays the Google Keyboard Settings interface. Touch the **Auto-correction option** .



Now the Auto-correction dialog box appears on the screen. To turn off Auto-correct (correct spelling errors automatically), select **OFF**.

Finally press the **Back** button 3 times to return to the main screen of the device.
