

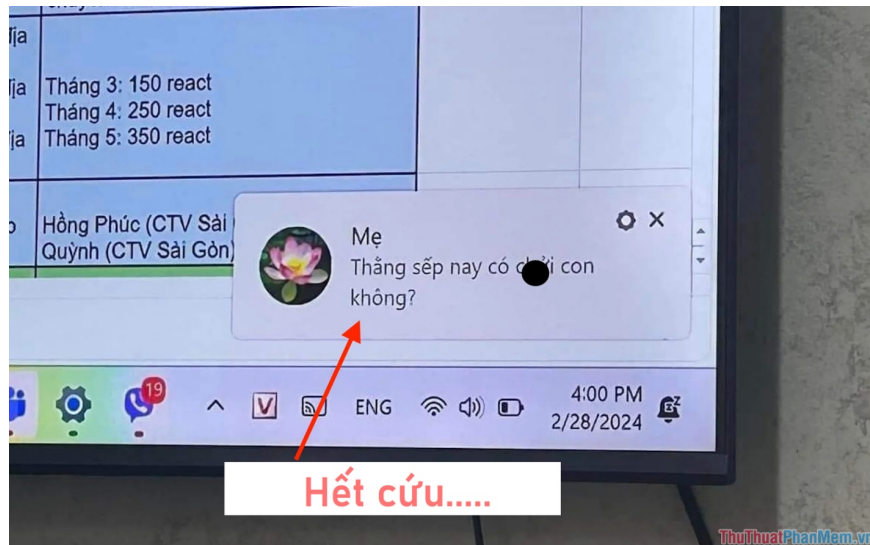
# How to turn off notifications when showing PowerPoint presentation slides to not reveal personal information

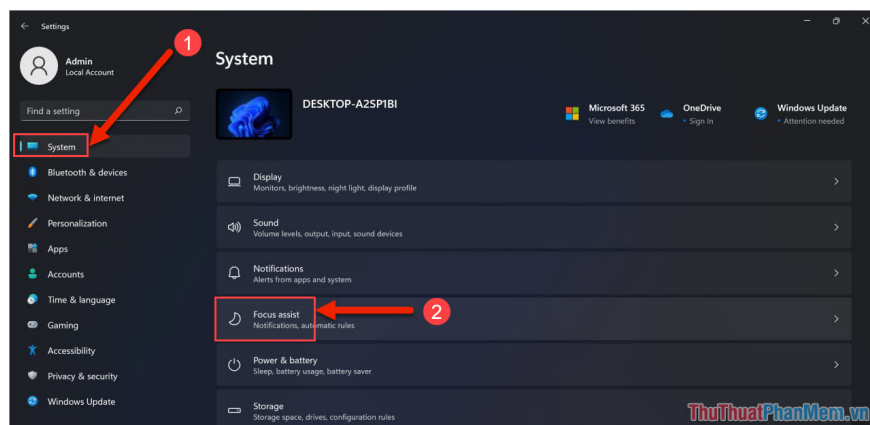

When you want to turn off notifications for messages, calls or any other notifications on your computer to present a PowerPoint presentation slide, you will need a more specific and accurate solution!

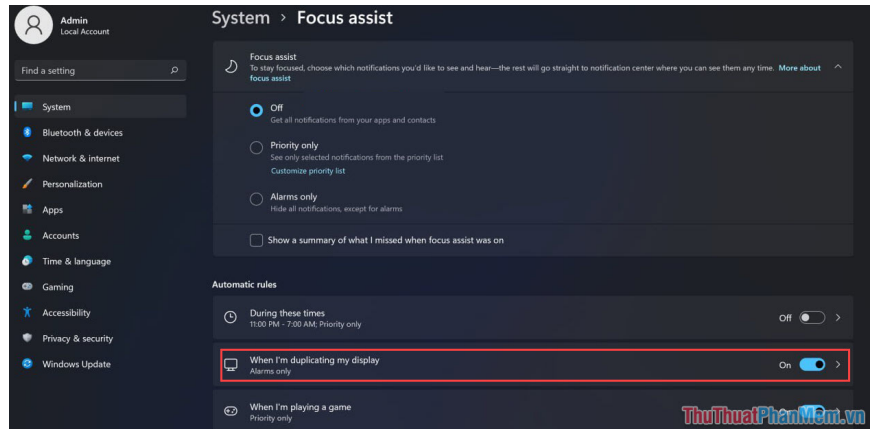
## 2. How to turn off notifications when presenting Slides on PowerPoint for Windows computers

On Windows computers, you only need to enable the feature to turn off notifications when presenting PowerPoint Slides '*once only*'. This feature will be automatically enabled every time you present your screen.

**Step 1 :** Press the **Windows + I** key combination to open **Settings** on your computer and select **System (1) ? Focus Assist (2)** .



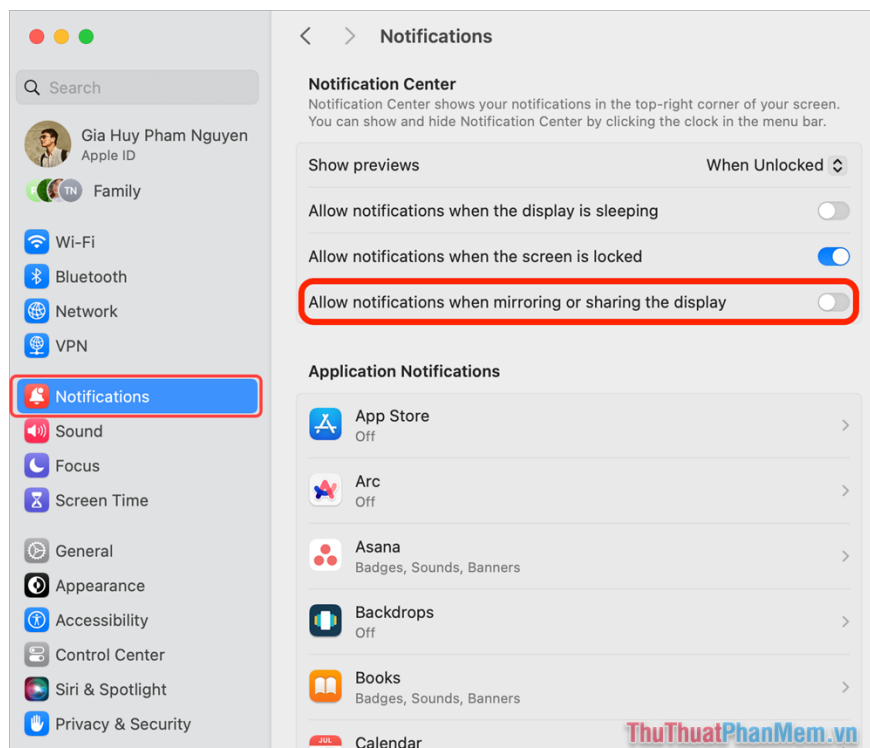
**Step 2 :** Then, you enable the **When I'm duplicating my display** feature . When activating this feature, you just need to show the screen on a projector or TV, the system automatically turns off all notifications and only leaves the alarm notification.



### 3. How to turn off notifications when presenting Slides on PowerPoint for Mac computers

For MAC computers, the developer also added the feature to turn off notifications when displaying the screen and transmitting the screen on other devices to avoid displaying sensitive notifications. To turn off notifications when presenting Slides on PowerPoint for Mac computers, do the following:

Open **Settings (System Preferences) ? Notifications ? Allow notifications when mirroring or sharing the display** .

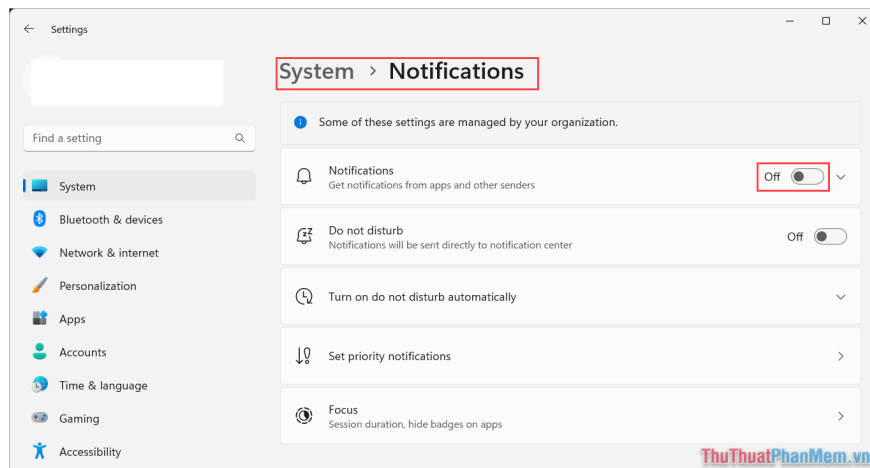


## 4. How to turn off notifications on Windows computers

Windows computers are being complained by many people for displaying too many notifications, including system notifications, application notifications, messages, calls, etc. Don't worry, TipsMake will show you how to turn off notifications above. Thorough Windows computers.

**Step 1** : Press Windows + I to open Settings and select **System** .

**Step 2** : Then, select **Notifications** and switch **Notifications** to **Off** to turn off all notifications on Windows.
