

How to turn off the notification center on Windows 10?

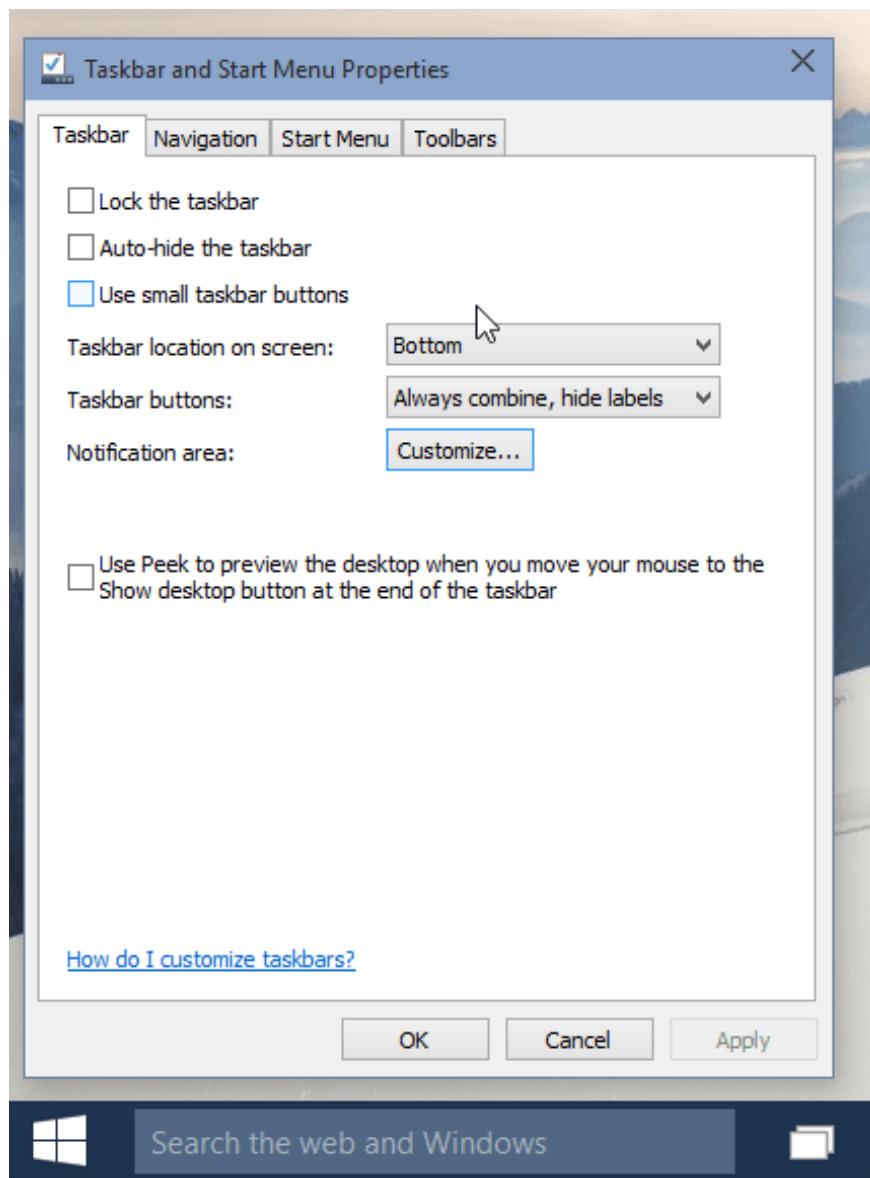

To turn off the Notification Center (Notification Center) on Windows 10, follow the steps below:

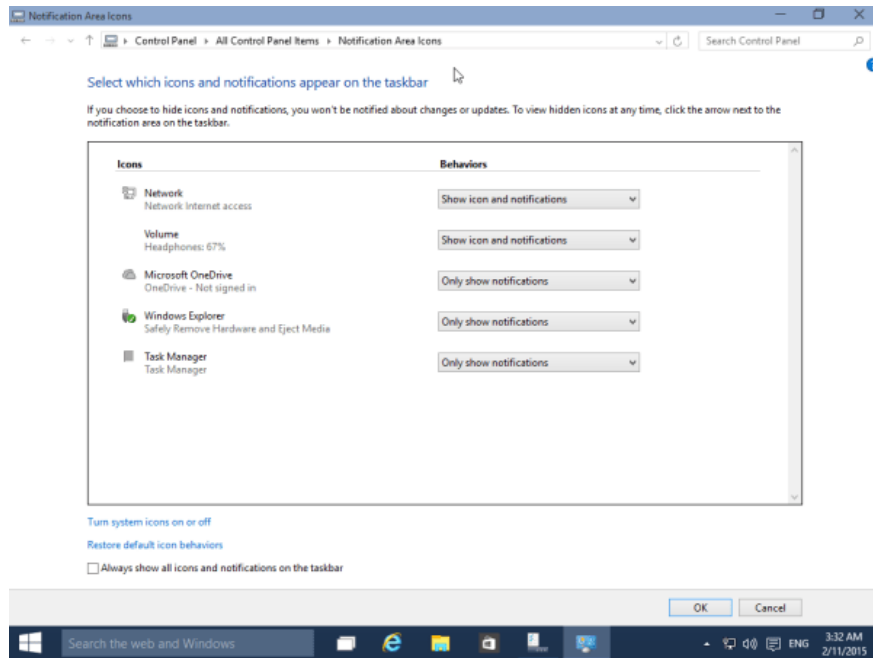
Step 1:

First, right-click on the Taskbar, select **Properties** to open the Properties window.



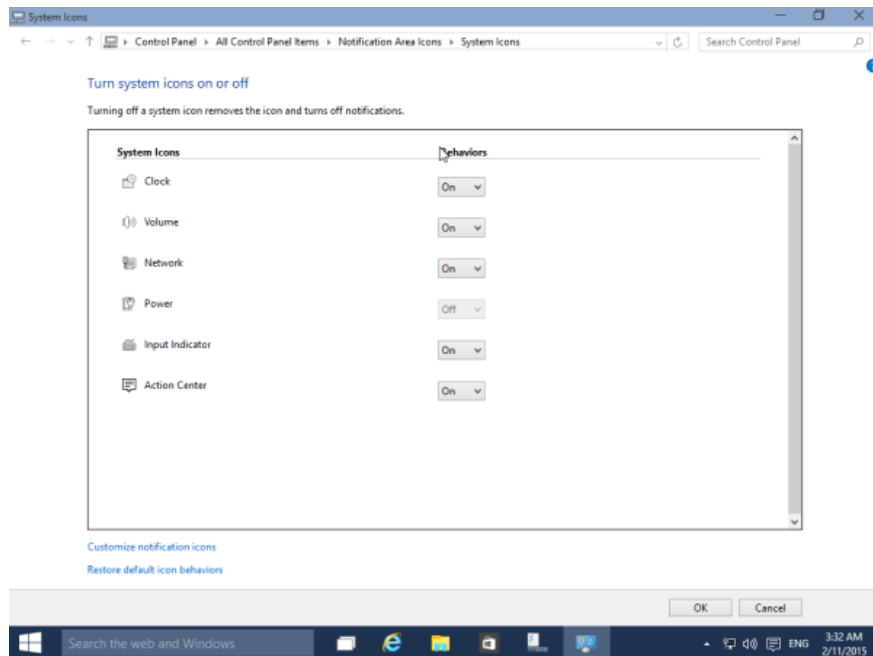
Step 2:

Click on **Customize .** to open the Windows system tray icon:



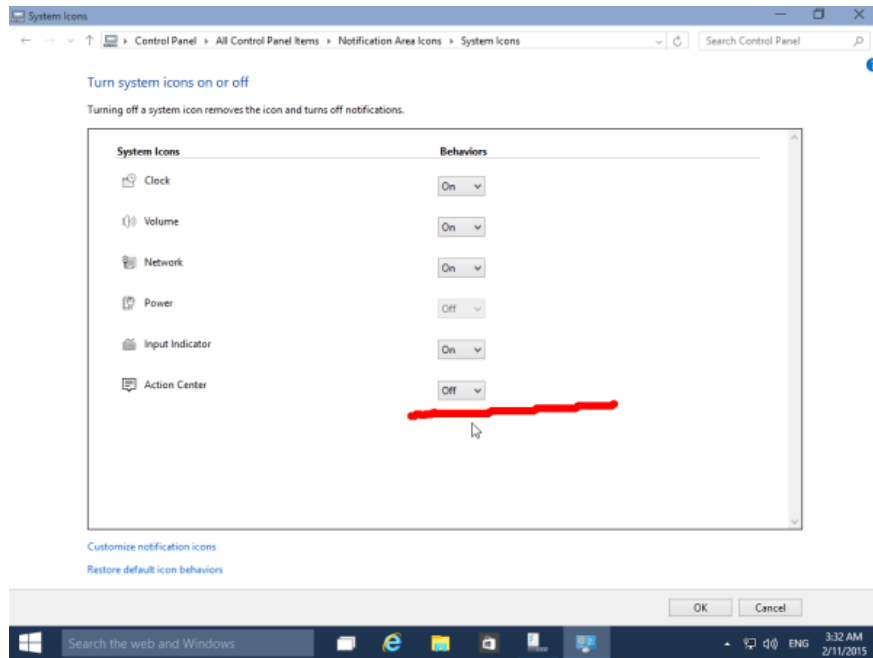
Step 3:

Click the **Turn system icons on or off** link to open the window as shown below:

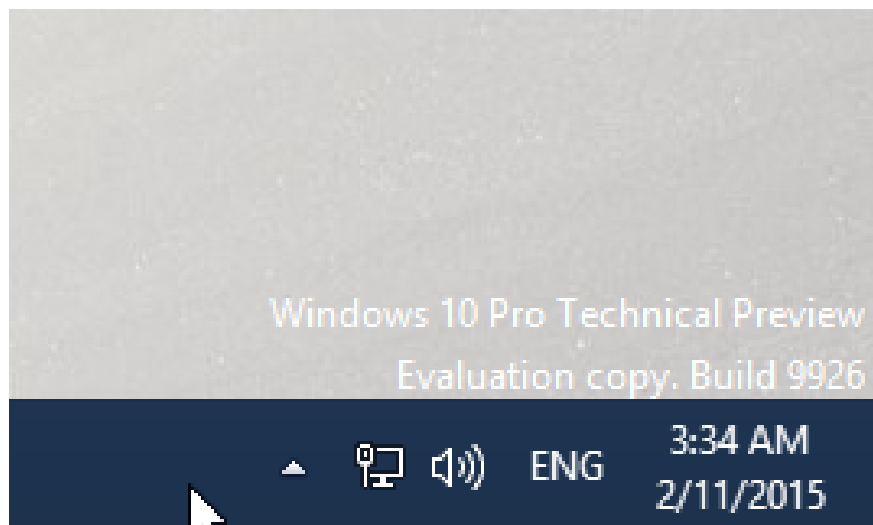


Step 4:

Set Action Center to **OFF** as shown below:



Step 5:



At this point on the screen you will not see the Action Center icon in the system tray anymore. From now on the notification center on Windows 10 is also disabled (off).
