

How to update to Windows 11 from Windows 10, without losing data

Instructions on how to update Windows 10 to Windows 11 without much data

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1 - Some notes before upgrading to Windows 11 with Installation Assistant

Before you start, you need to check that your computer meets the following conditions:

- Your computer must be running Windows 10 copyright, version 2004 or later.
- Your computer must meet the minimum Windows 11 installation configuration requirements. You should visit the website of the PC manufacturer you are using for information about updated drivers and hardware compatibility.
- Your computer must have 9 GB of free storage space to download Windows 11.

II - How to upgrade Windows 10 to Windows 11 without data loss using Installation Assistant

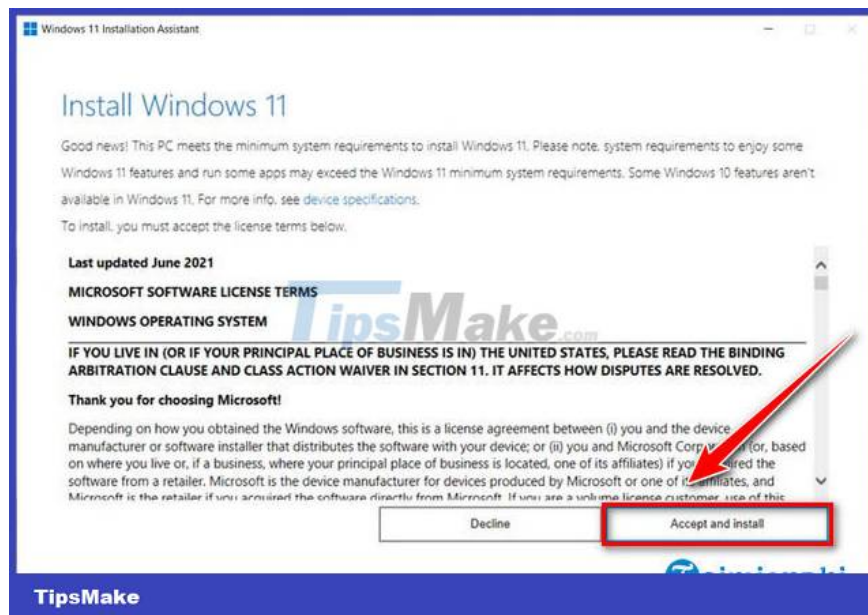
After making sure your computer meets the above requirements, follow the instructions below to upgrade Windows 10 to Windows 11 using the Installation Assistant:

Step 1: Download **Windows 11 Installation Assistant** from the download link provided in the article.

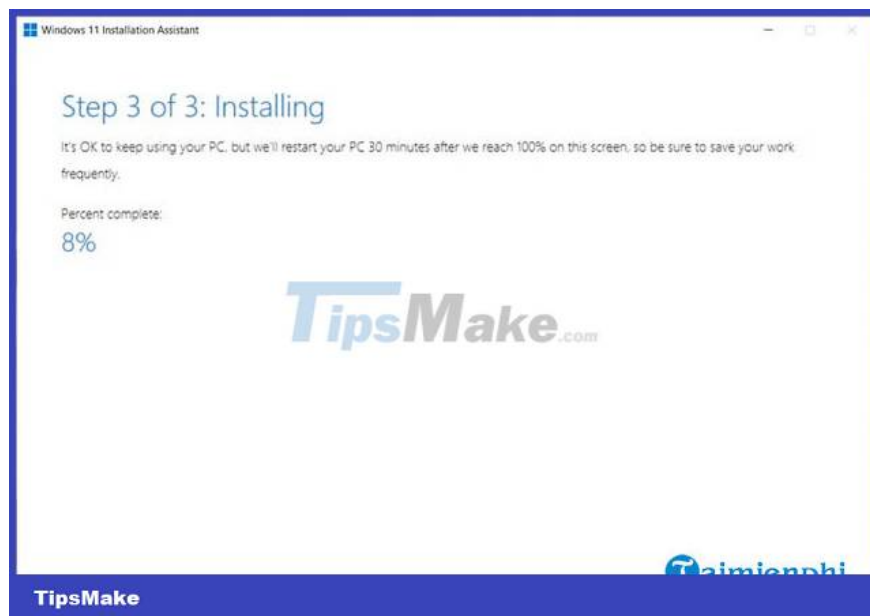
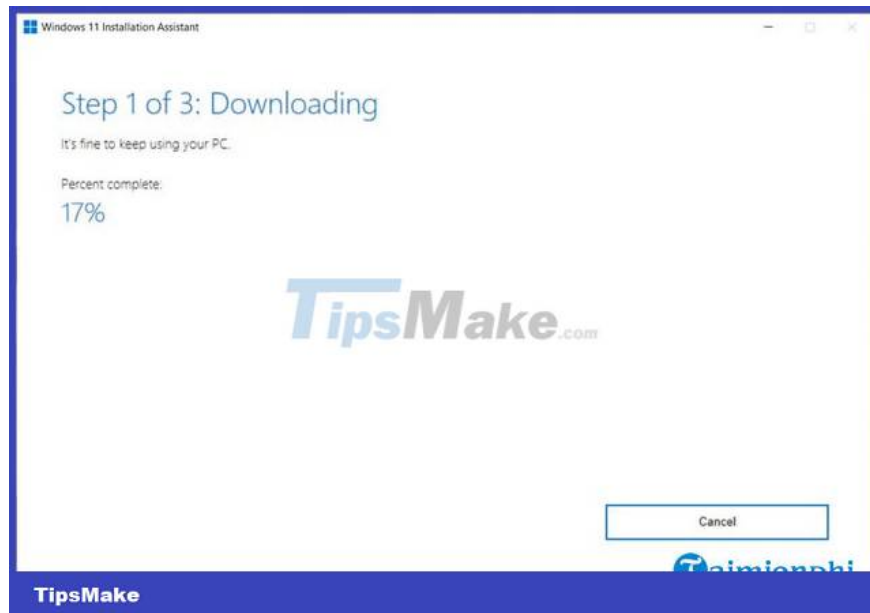
=> Download **Windows 11 Installation Assistant** here.

Step 2: After the download is complete, **right-click** on the file **windows-11-installation-assistant.exe** and select **Run with administrator** to launch Windows 11 Installation Assistant.

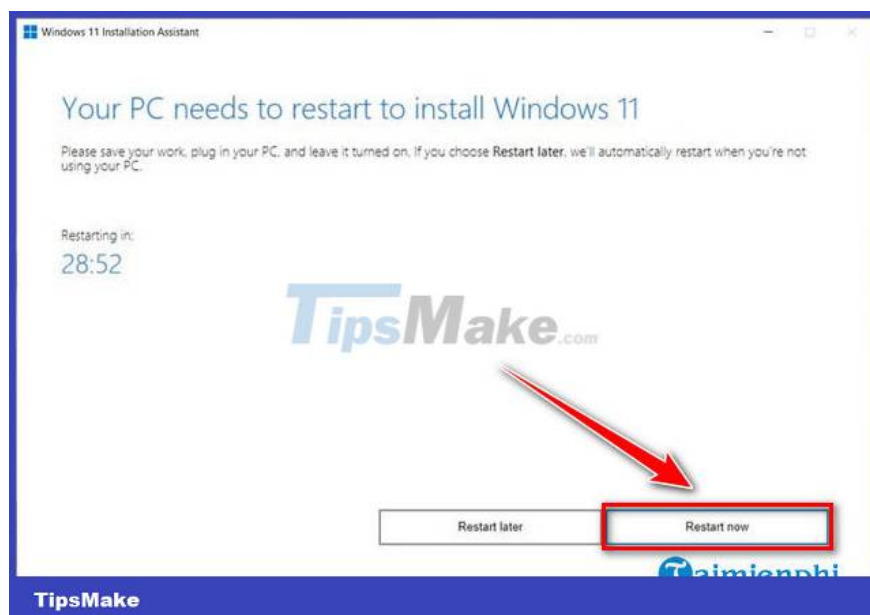
Step 3: Click the **Accept and Install** button to agree to the license terms and proceed with the installation.



Step 4: Then, the tool will download the installation files and proceed to upgrade the computer to Windows 11. Completion time will depend on your Internet connection and device hardware.



When the Windows 11 installation is complete, click the **Restart Now** button to restart your computer and start exploring the features on the new operating system.
