

How to use the Tyke note-taking app on macOS - Take quick notes on your computer.

Tyke is a quick note-taking application for macOS that you can use directly on your screen without having to launch the application.

On macOS, to create notes or edit and save text and HTML content, you can use the TextEdit text editing feature. The only drawback of TextEdit is that it's not readily available on the computer screen; you have to launch and create it yourself. If you want to take notes quickly, this process can sometimes be time-consuming.

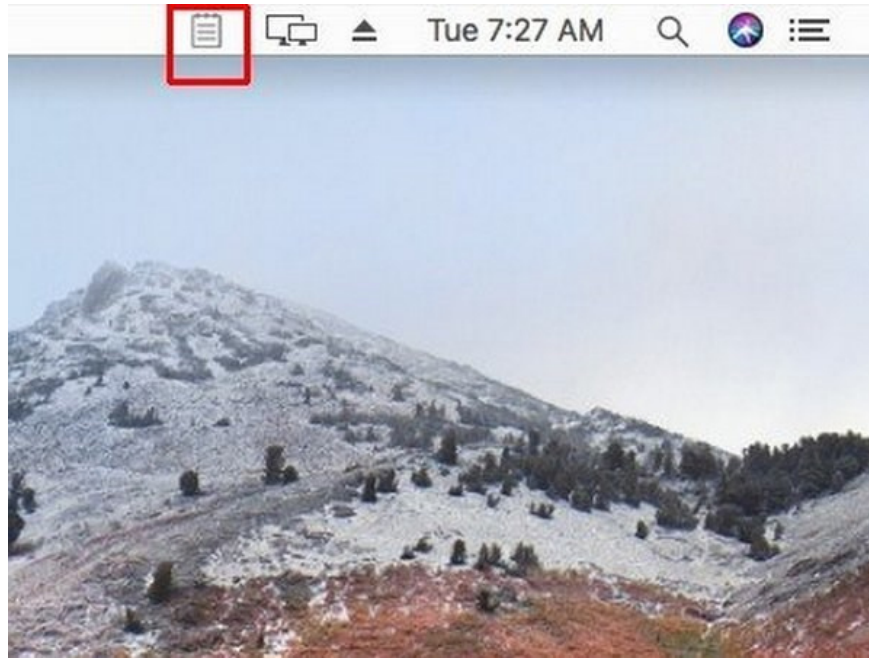
If you want to take quick notes, you can use the Tyke application. Basically, Tyke is a note-taking application, but it can't save the entered text as a separate file. Instead, Tyke saves the entered text until you delete it. Importantly, unlike TextEdit, you don't need to launch it; you just click the Tyke icon in the menu bar. This article will guide you on how to use Tyke for note-taking on macOS.

Step 1:

You can download the Tyke app for macOS using the link below. The app is completely free to download.

Immediately after successful installation, you will see **the Tyke app's note-shaped icon** in the menu bar at the top of the screen.

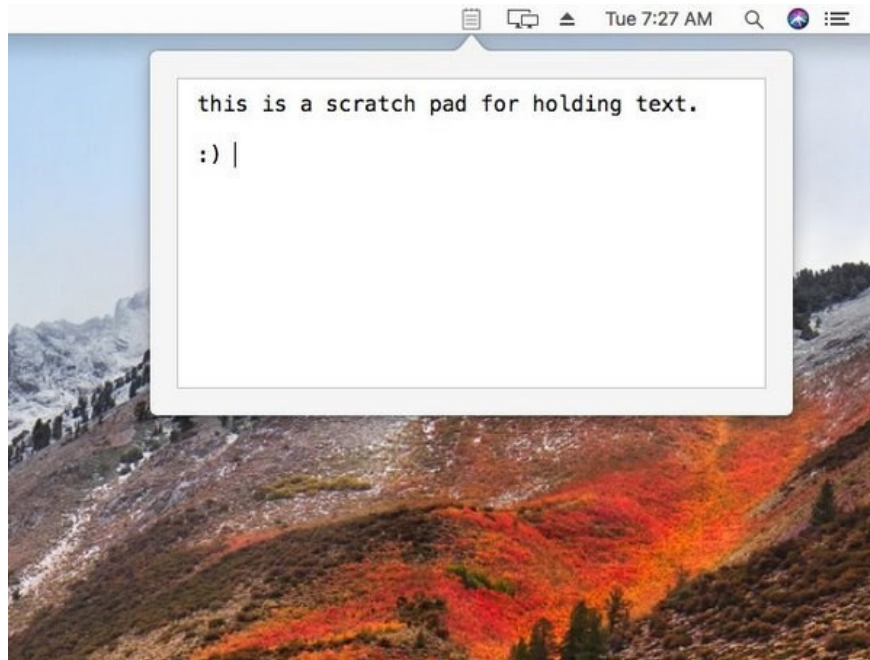


Step 2:

When you click this icon, a pop-up note dialog box appears. You can type your notes or paste previously copied content into this interface, just like in Windows Notepad. You can enter an unlimited amount of text into Type. Text formatting, including special characters, will also be removed when pasted into Tyke.

After you've finished entering the content, press and hold on the screen to close this dialog box. When you reopen it, the Tyke application will still display the text you entered earlier.

Please note that if you completely close the application or restart your system unexpectedly, the notes you made on Tyke will completely disappear.



Here's another useful note-taking app for macOS. Tyke is quicker and easier to use than opening an app like TextEdit. If you're looking for a note-taking app with basic features, no need to save files, and fast performance, Tyke is a good option.
