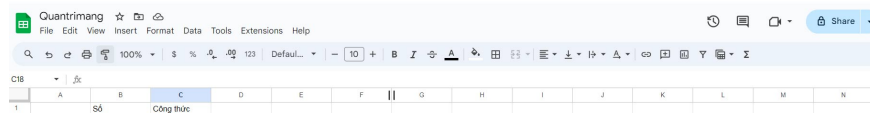

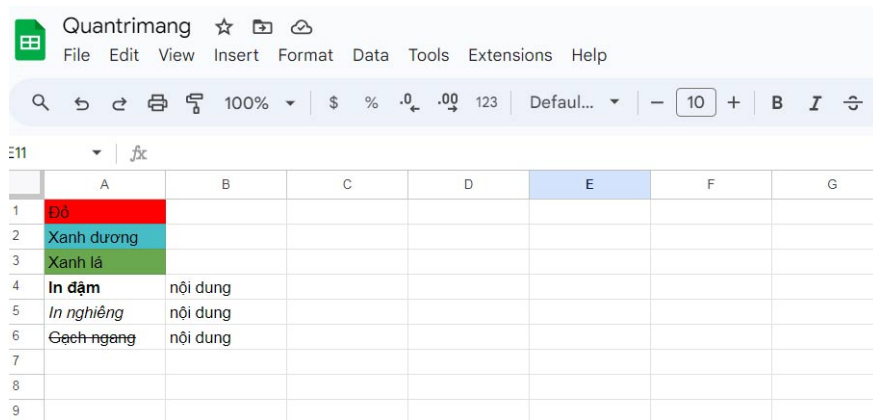
its button () in the Ribbon.



How to use Paint Format in Google Sheets

1. Select the cell you want to copy.
2. Click the **Paint Format** button.
3. Select a cell or range

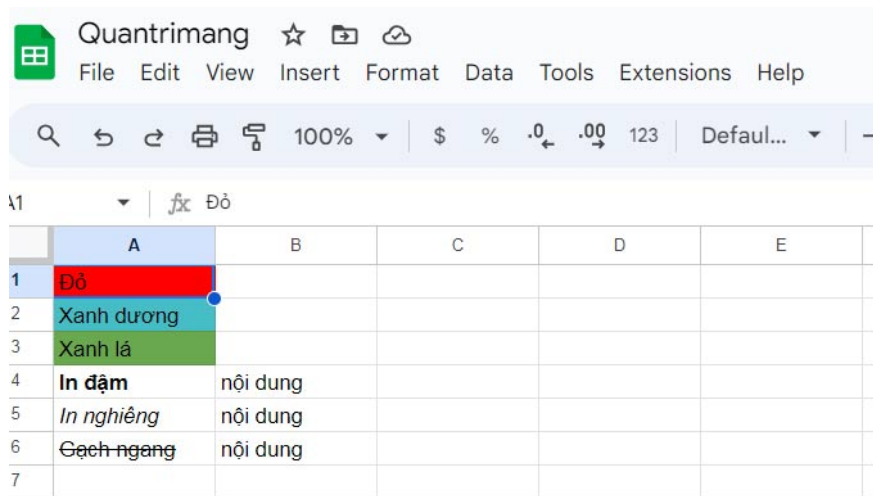
Try some examples and copy the formatting with different colors and font styles, such as bold, italics, and strikethrough:



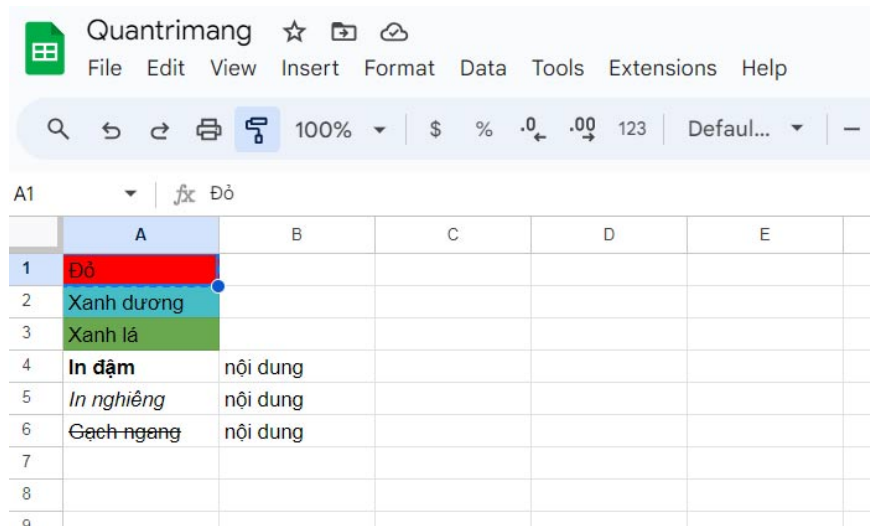
Copy the red color from cell A1 to cell B1.

Step-by-step instructions:

1. Select cell **A1** .

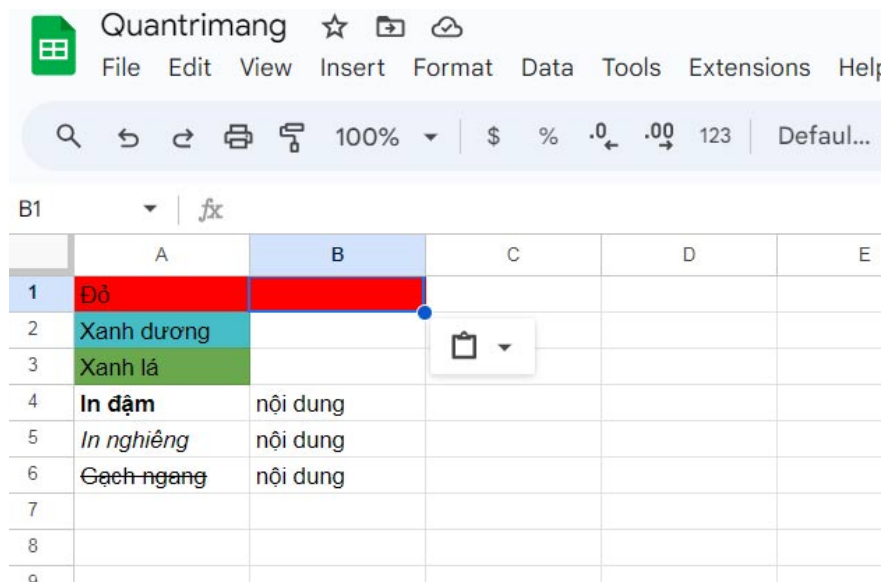


2. Click the **Paint Format** button .



Note the dotted border around cell A1. This indicates that the formatting has been copied and is ready to be pasted. Paste it into cell B1!

3. Select cell **B1** .

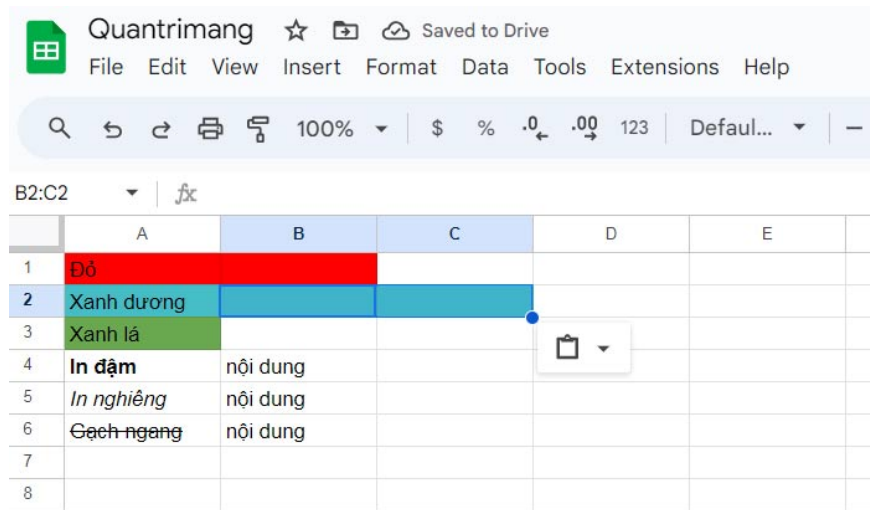


That's it!

Copy and paste the color into multiple cells.

Copy cells B2 to C2. That's right, try pasting it into a range of two cells!

1. Select cell **A2** .
2. Click the **Format Paint** button .
3. Select cell **B2** and drag it to cell **C2** .

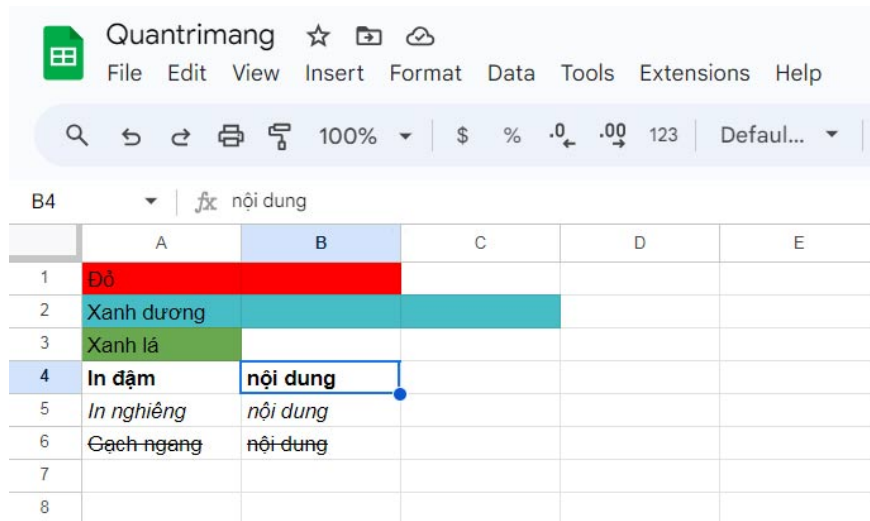


Copy font style

Copy font characteristics from the range **A4:A6** to the range **B4:B6**.

Step by step:

1. Select the range **A4:A6**.
2. Click **Format Paint**.
3. Drag and select range **B4:B6**.
4. That's it.



That's it! As you can see, using Paint Format is really simple, right? Using this tool, you can significantly shorten the time spent formatting data, copying content, and coloring text.

Where is the Format Painter tool located?

Answer: The Painter Formatting tool icon looks like a paint roller () and is located on the toolbar at the top of the Google Sheets file.

2. Click the Paint formatting icon on the toolbar. The mouse cursor icon will change to indicate that it is in Paint formatting mode.
3. Select the target cell or data range to which you want to apply the formatting. The formatting will be applied immediately.
