Instructions on how to use Panasonic air conditioner

Panasonic air conditioner is divided into different types, such as 1-way air conditioner, 2-way air conditioner, air conditioner using Inverter technology, air conditioner without inverter technology, etc. However, the use of all kinds This Panasonic air conditioner has the same usage as the following (except for some new features only available on the premium line).



How to turn on / off Panasonic air conditioner

Press the ON / OFF button once to turn on the air conditioner. When the machine is turned on, the POWER lamp will display in green

Press the ON / OFF button again to turn off the air conditioner

How to adjust the modes on Panasonic air conditioner

After enabling Panasonic air conditioner, to adjust the modes on the air conditioner you need to press the MODE button on the control then select one of the following modes:

3. 3rd time: High fan mode
4. Times 4: AUTO FAN automatic fan mode

To adjust the air conditioning direction, press the AIR SWING button and select the appropriate mode.

Instructions for using timer mode on Panasonic air conditioner

Step 1: Select ON TIMER

Step 2: Select the time to turn on the air conditioner using the ? (up) and down ? (down) buttons.

Step 3: Select ON TIMER button again. To cancel, select CANCEL.

The on and off timer performs the same operation but only at the time of execution. For example, perform a timer off when the air conditioner is operating, timer turns on when the air conditioner is inactive.

Using Panasonic air conditioner helps save electricity

At this point, surely the use of Panasonic air conditioner is no longer difficult for you, right? So how to save electricity when using this device? Simply put, just follow the instructions below:

Always turn on the air conditioner at an average temperature of over 23 degrees Celsius: In the summer, we often have the habit of turning on the air conditioner at the lowest level. However, according to experts, using air conditioner at too low temperatures will cause health problems, causing air conditioner to fail and extremely power consuming.

Indoor and outdoor temperatures should only vary by a maximum of 10 degrees Celsius : If the temperature difference in the room and outdoor is too large (above 10 degrees Celsius), the air conditioner will have to work with extremely large capacity to weigh by heat. In this case, the air conditioner is easily damaged and consumes a lot of power.

The door should be closed when the air conditioner is turned on : Closing the door will prevent air from coming out of the room and vice versa. This helps the air conditioner not need to work much to balance the temperature, thereby saving electricity. However, you should not close the door too much to avoid affecting health.

Periodic cleaning : Dirt is one of the reasons that air conditioner is easily damaged, working efficiency is reduced and it will obviously consume more electricity. So, regularly clean and regulate, at least every 6 months.

Turn on the air conditioner timer when going to bed : The night temperature is usually lower than the day so there is no need to turn on the air conditioner all night. Turn on the air conditioner timer when going to bed to save electricity and protect your health.
