

How to view the fastest shared Google Drive data

To quickly know the entire file, the shared Google Drive folder, users can use the Filewatch tool.

Data sharing on Google Drive has been chosen by many people, with fast sharing speed and share holders can set up Google Drive file sharing rights at their discretion. And the recipient of the shared link will see all the data in the private folder shared with me. So with the data you share with others, how do you find and manage them? Usually with data shared with others, you must know by yourself the sharing icon. But with Filewatch, users can immediately share all files and folders shared with others, including public file sharing or private file sharing.

The website will list the files you have shared separately, from which users can quickly access the file to reset the right to share data on Google Drive if desired. The following article will guide you how to find shared files on Google Drive with Filewatch.

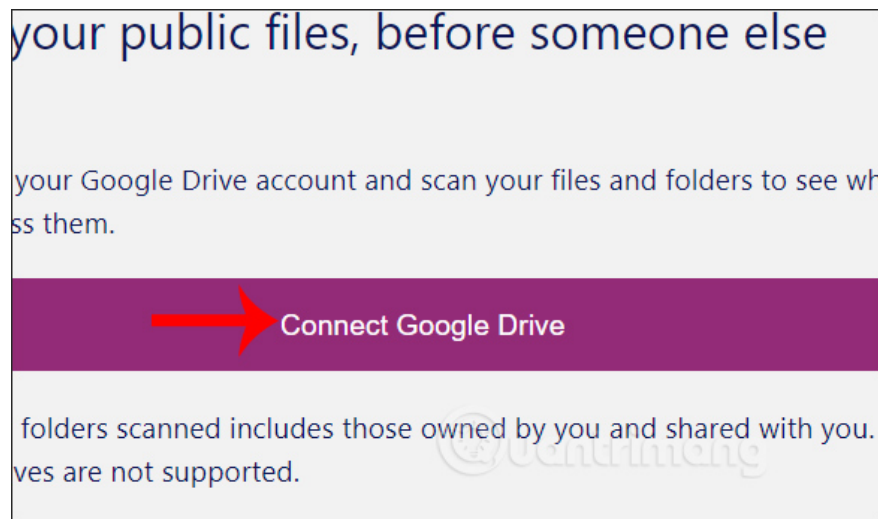

How to use Filewatch to view file sharing Google Drive

Step 1:

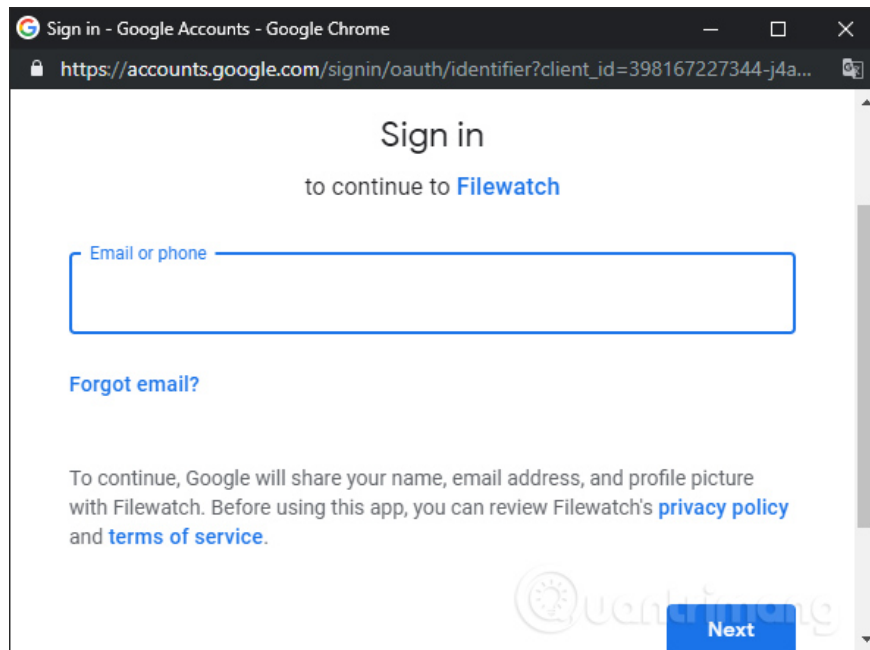
Users access the homepage of Filewatch under the link below. At the homepage interface you click on **Connect Google Drive** .

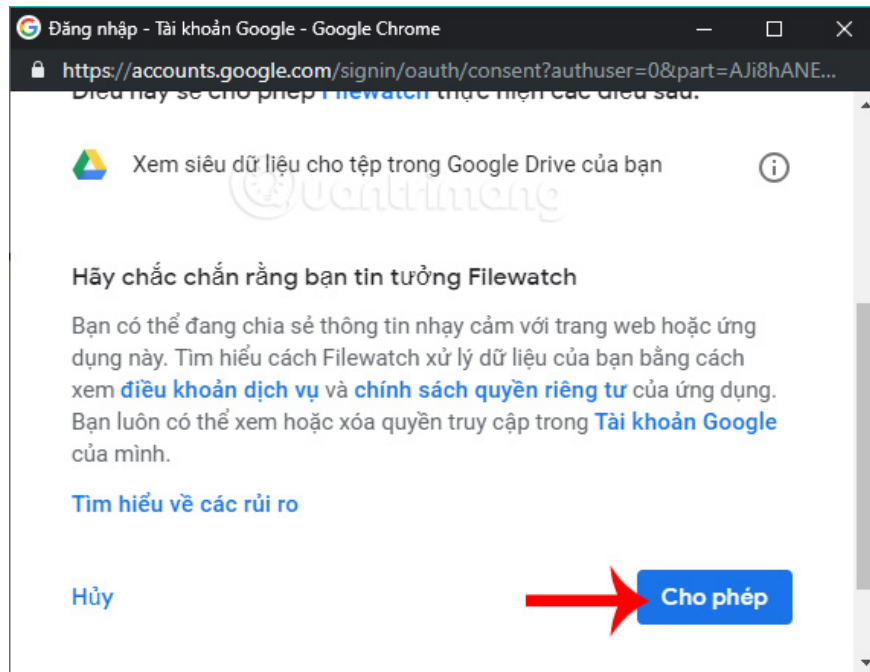


Step 2:

Log in to your personal Google Drive account as usual.



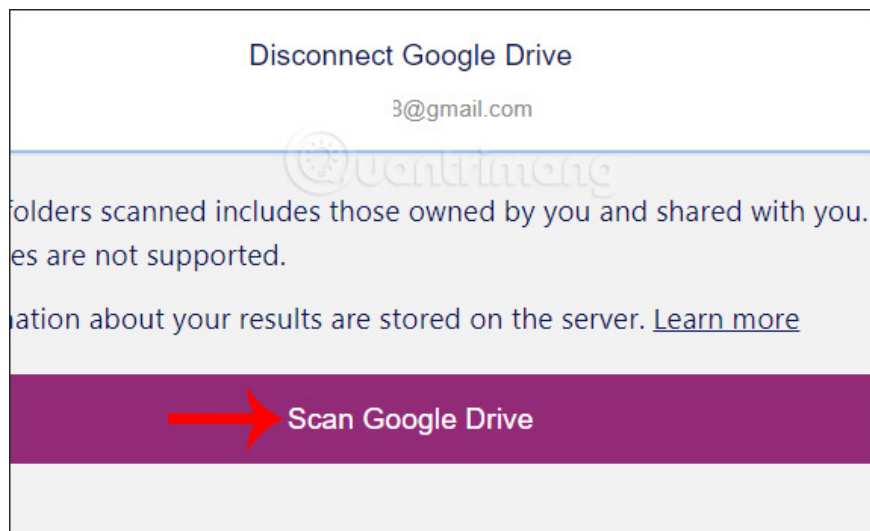
You then need to agree to let Filewatch **access your Google Drive account** to scan the data.



Step 3:

After connecting Filewatch with personal Google Drive account, at the interface of the website click **Scan Google Drive**.

The service starts searching for files and folders that you share. Fast or slow completion time depends on the amount of data you have shared.



Step 4:

When the scanning process is completed, the user will see the total number of files and folders that you are storing in your personal Drive account.

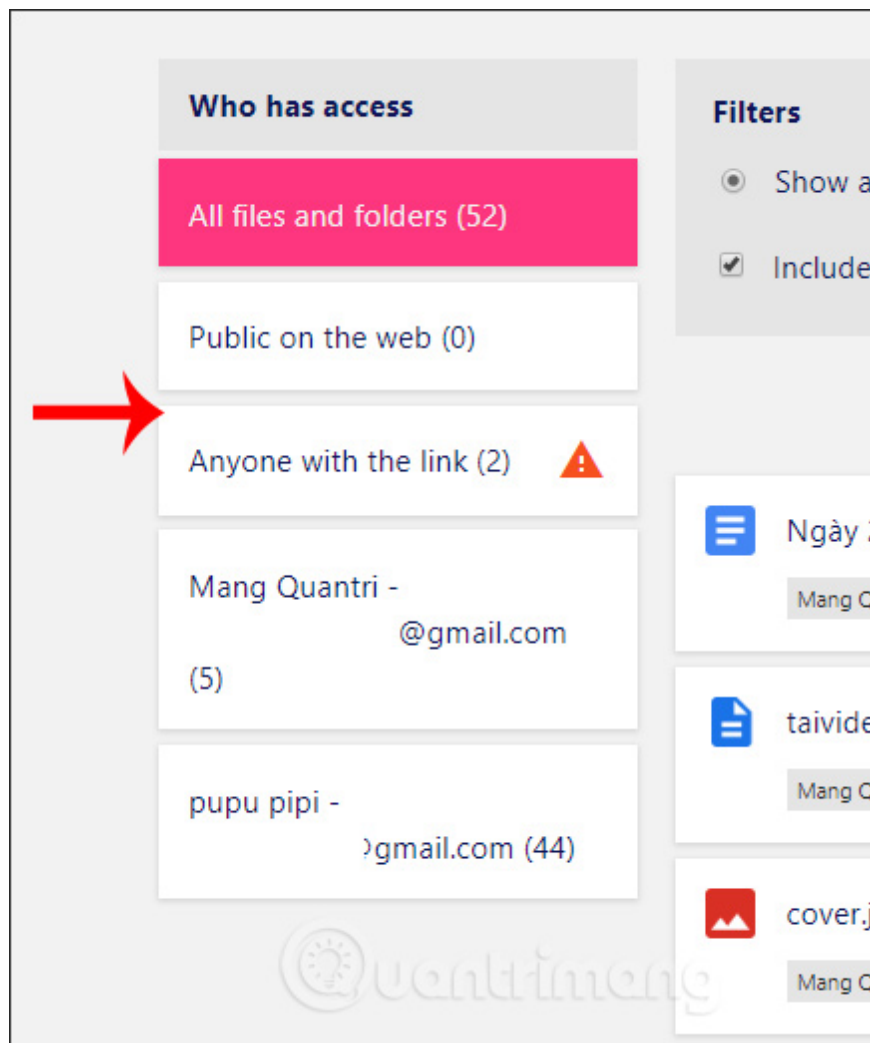
All of your files and folders are available to search. You can use the access categories and filters to refine your search.

Review each file or folder and ensure they are shared appropriately. Click on folder to open it in Google Drive and change the sharing settings.

Below to check the shared data, users see the Who has access section. There are 2 different display items with different content.

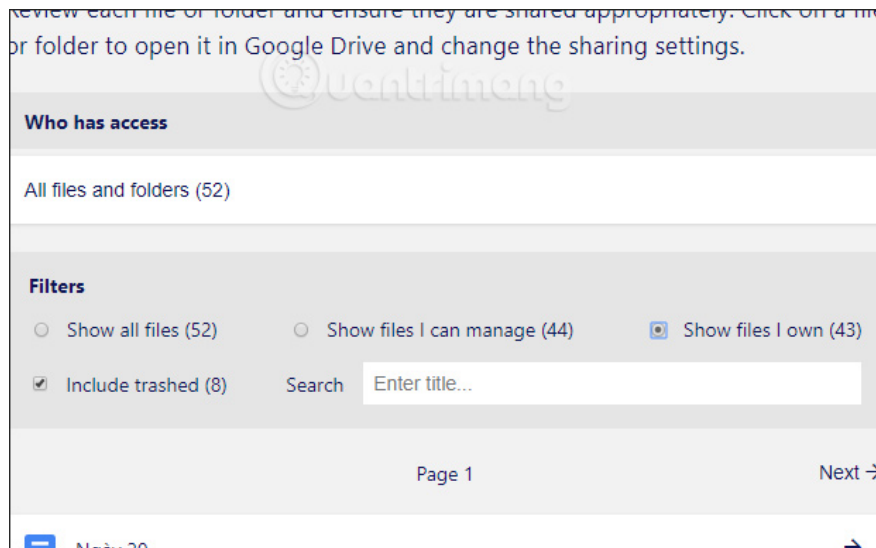
1. Public on the web: Files, folders shared publicly on the web for anyone to access.
2. Anyone with the links: Files, shared folders are only for those who have links.

Here users access each item to check the shared files or folders on Google Drive.



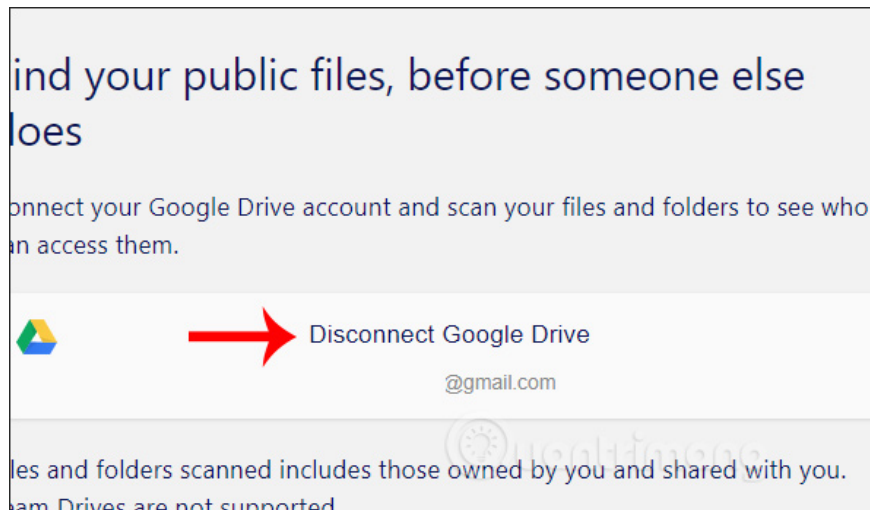
Step 5:

Also you can change the filter mode to display data with the options that Filewatch provides. In each share, clicking on it will immediately switch to the original link displayed on Google Drive, or Google Docs if it is a document file.

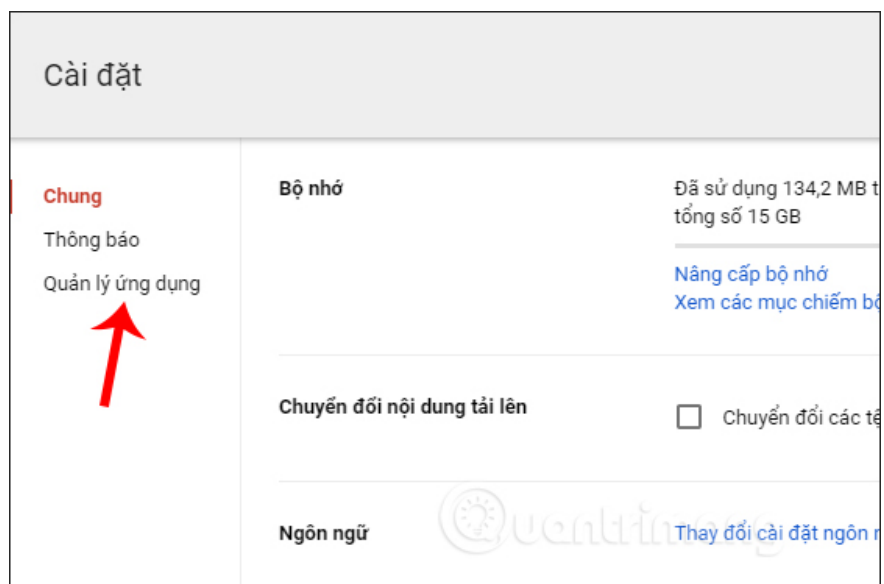


Step 6:

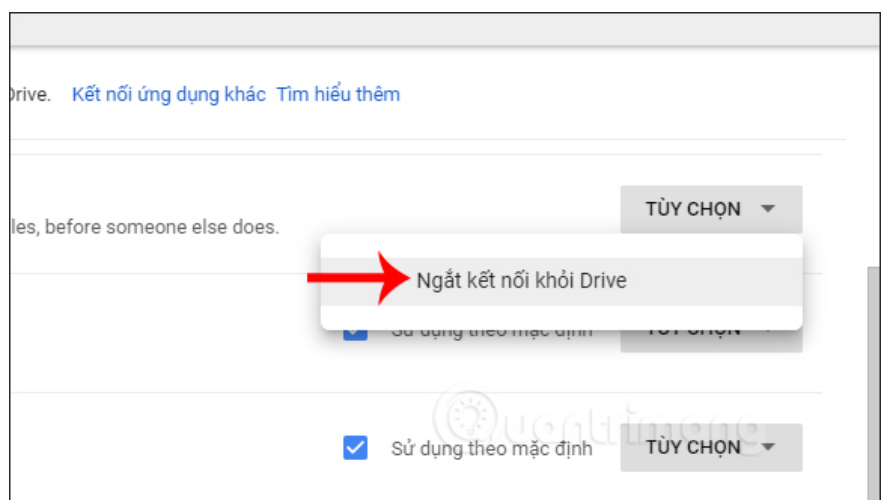
To **disconnect Filewatch with Google Drive** , in the interface click **Disconnect Google Drive** .



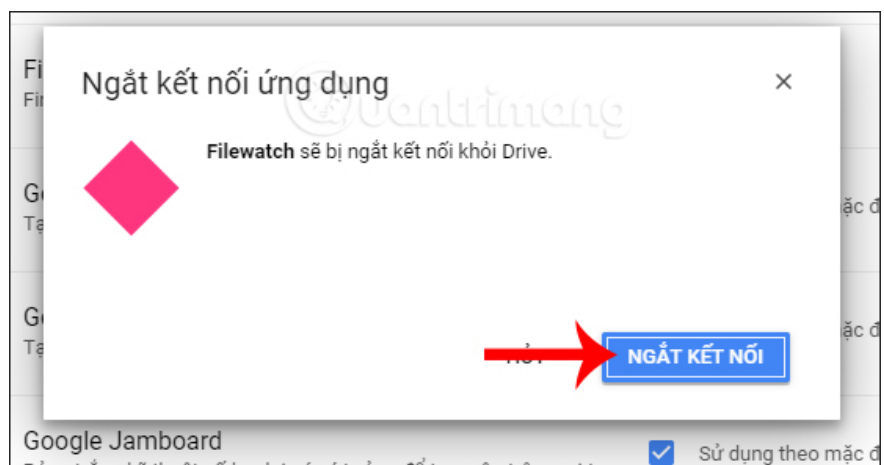
In your **Google Drive account** click on **the gear icon** and select **Install** , click on **Application management** .



Go to the **Filewatch** application and click on the **Options** button , click **Disconnect from Drive** .



Finally users need to **click Disconnect** to agree not to use Filewatch on Google Drive.



Filewatch helps you get the shared Google Drive file with others, when you can't see it quickly on Drive. After checking, we should disconnect Filewatch with Drive account.
