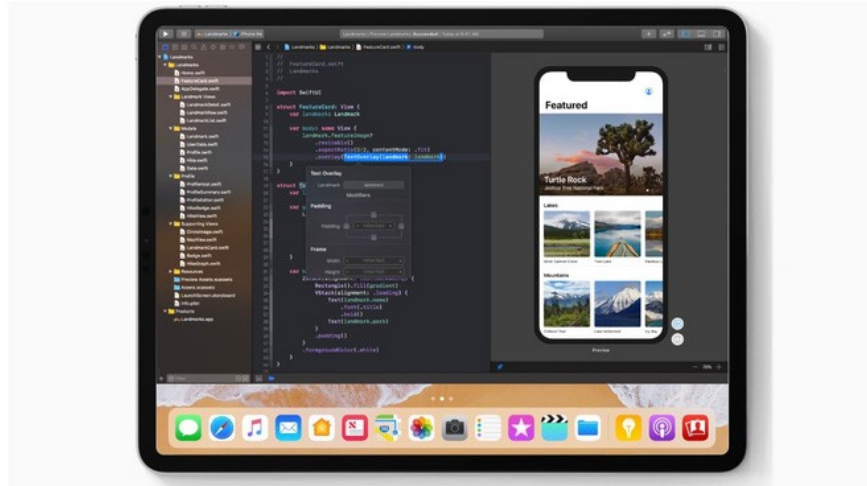


Put Xcode on iPad

Xcode supports many different languages, including Apple's Swift, C ++, Python and more. But it only runs on MacOS. At least until now.

But if Prosser's prediction is correct, developers can now use the iPad to write software.

This is a feature that Apple has gradually upgraded for its tablets over the years, especially the iPad Pro line. Now it has the popular USB-C port, supports external file access, mouse support, etc. And the iPad Pro processors have the same power as Apple's laptops.
