

In Doraemon, there are 4500 treasures, how much do you remember?

Through the movie Doraemon: Nobita no Himitsu D?gu Museum was released in 2013, many secrets about Doraemon's miraculous treasures have been revealed.

In our childhood, everyone is probably familiar with the Doraemon comic (or Doraemon, the old name before being changed under the Bern Convention on copyright), this is the Japanese comic of the author. Fujiko Fujio has been composed since 1969. By 2013 this comic has been adapted into TV episodes aired by many people.

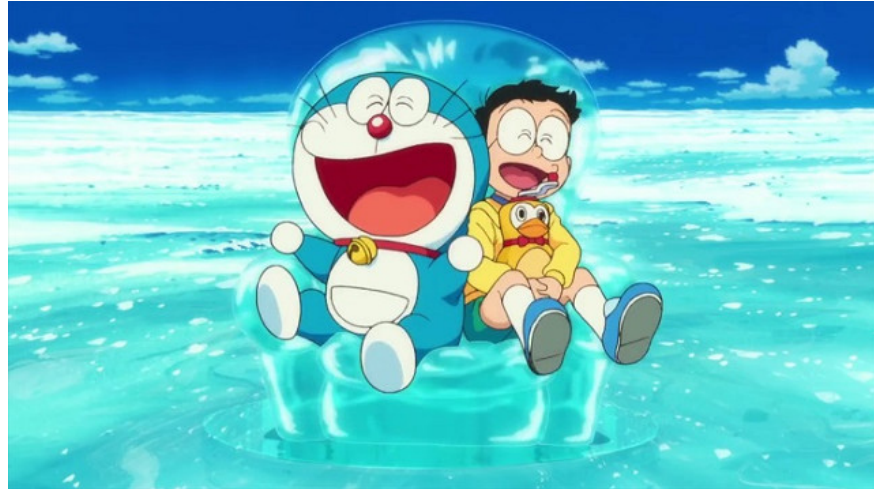
1. 18 types of sculptures are very characteristic of the first people with electricity
2. 16 strange things worth studying for the whole world are found only in Japan
3. Funny science: What flavor does your favorite coffee reveal about you?

The content of the series revolves around the theme of a cat named Doraemon from the 22nd century to help a 5th grade boy named Nobi Nobita.



In each content episode, it is often brief, easy to understand and move and brings an optimistic view of future life as well as the development of science and technology of Japan. Besides, the film also wants to convey to viewers about the affection of family and friends.

After the comics came out, Doraemon won many comic prizes in Japan and was voted one of 22 prominent characters in Asia by TIME Asia magazine.



Since its inception, Doraemon is not only considered to be the top favorite character and comic in Japan, but also becomes a cultural symbol of Japan and loved by children all over the world. .

In 1992, Kim Dong Publishing Company released a series of the first smart machine cat in Vietnam with the name Doraemon. In this series, the character lines are also changed by the publisher to be more familiar and readable for children. Later, in 2010, Kim Dong officially changed the name of the comic to Doraemon to ensure the characters' names were returned to their original character.

Besides the story of beautiful friendship between characters, we cannot forget the treasures in Doraemon's magic bag, these same treasures have helped to attract us when watching.

The items in the story are based on household items in Japan, after which it gets a bit more features to make it a more thrilling treasure. The rest are mostly fiction but perfectly suited to children's thinking.

In each episode, there is at least one new treasure that appears, according to Fanpop estimates (Asian entertainment site), there are about 4500 treasures in Doraemon.

In the short story, Doraemon once told Nobita that the price of the treasures in the future is very expensive, but can still be purchased by installments.

Here is a list of the 11 most common items in Doraemon:

1. Magic bag - Yojigen Pocket



This bag is semicircular and is always worn before Doraemon's abdomen to store his treasures. This bag is not normal because it has the ability to connect to the fourth dimension, so it is possible to store a variety of different things.

In addition to this bag, Doraemon has another backup bag just like the main bag and stored in a sleeping area or given to Nobita in urgent situations.

2. Time machine - Time Machine



In most episodes, we often see Doraemon or Nobita often jump into the desk drawer to get on the time machine back to the past or go to the future.

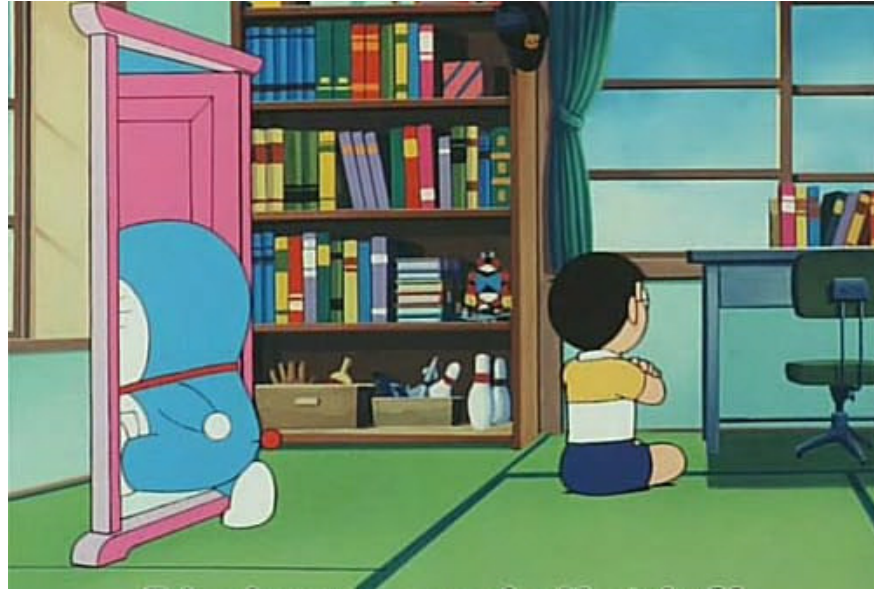
The time machine looks very simple, similar to a screened board and joystick. However, the machine this time was too old, often damaged, accidentally helping the group with new adventures.

3. Bamboo shoots - Take-copter



Nobita used this museum very well when going to school late. The design of this museum is somewhat similar to our ceiling fan, including three small propellers attached to a small vacuum-shaped cup-shaped object, capable of fastening and helping users to fly.

4. Magic door - Dokodemo Door



The magic door has the same effect as the time machine, this magic door can take you anywhere you want just step through the door.

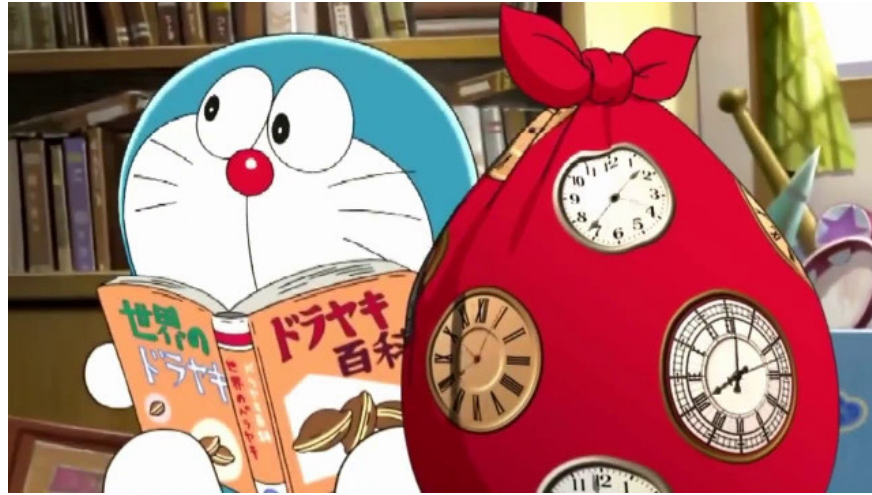
5. Phone case if - Moshimo Box



This museum is a phone booth, it can call the future to ask them to fulfill the caller's request.

Nobita used this museum to ask a world that doesn't need money, when buying an item that means taking money from the seller, being robbed is to receive the money of the bandits . funny.

6. Time towel - Time Furoshiki



Time-consuming towels are items that can transform damaged items back to their original form. Therefore, this treasure is often used by Doraemon to fix old and broken objects, turning old into young people.

7. Flashlight zooms in / out



This miniature flashlight is used to enlarge or shrink the objects that it is exposed to, objects will be used for 1 hour.

8. Piercing rings - Toorinuke Hoop



This chant is a closed circle, when applying a piercing ring to the object creates a hole through the object. Enough for Doraemon's characters to pass through. Nobita used this museum for the first time when she was punished by the mother for being imprisoned in a warehouse.

9. Great big boy



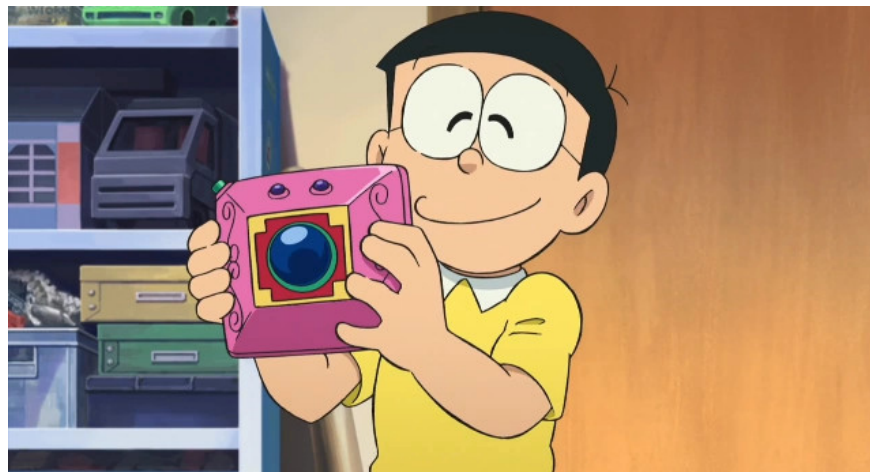
This is a very special protection, it has many different sizes for users to wear on their fingers or hands. Very simple to use, just head the cannon towards the enemy, then shout "paw!", There will be a strong aura emitted to cause the enemy to be thrown and unconscious.

10. Translated bread



The original name of this cake is "hon'yaku", meaning translator. This cake can help you speak, write, read with all the languages ??from animals to people from alien .

11. Stylish camera - Kisekae Camera



This treasure helps Doraemon and his friends get the right costumes for different situations such as coming to the future or returning to prehistoric times. If you use a blank sheet of paper instead of the original, the person who was taken will . not wear anything.
