Modern women are very active and talented, no less than men. The following are inspirational quotes from famous women around the world.

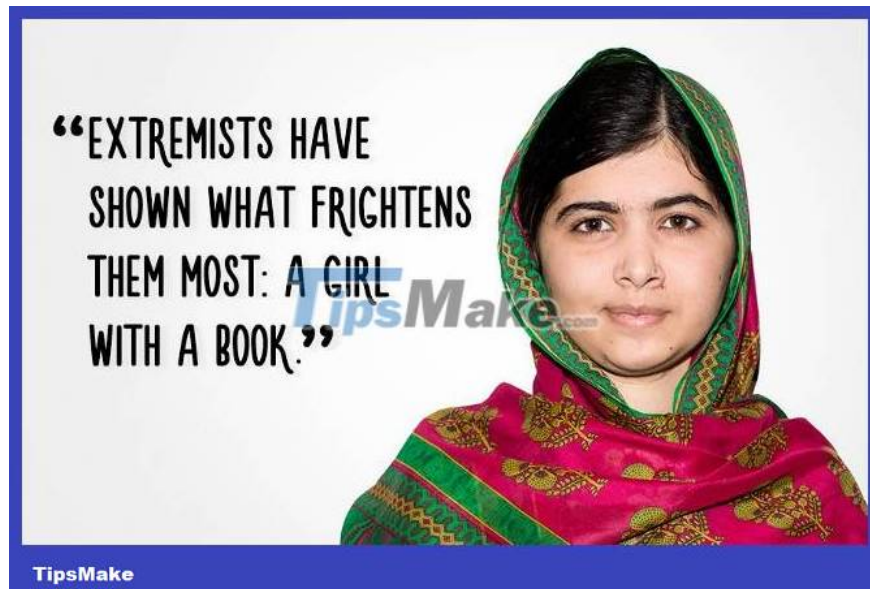

In 2014, when she was only 17 years old, Malala Yousafzai received the Nobel Peace Prize, and was also the youngest person to be awarded the Nobel Prize and the second Pakistani citizen to receive the Nobel Prize.

#2 Eleanor Roosevelt

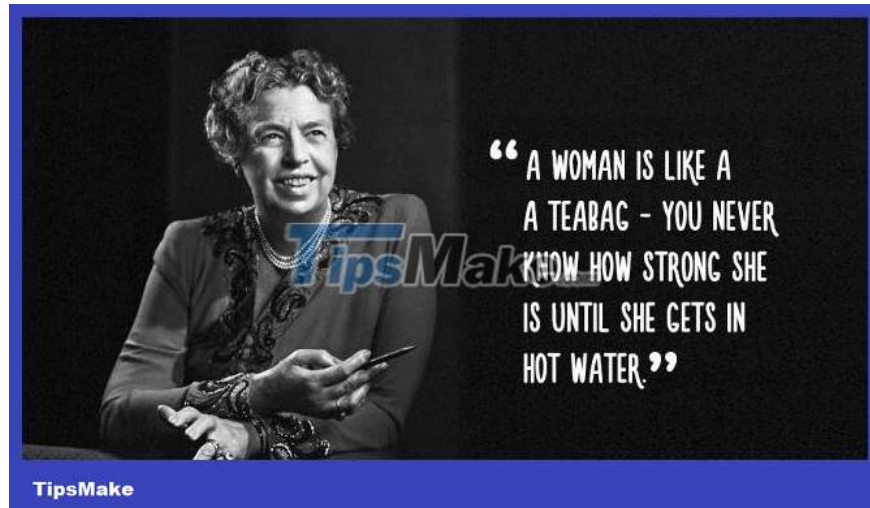

#3 Aung San Suu Kyi



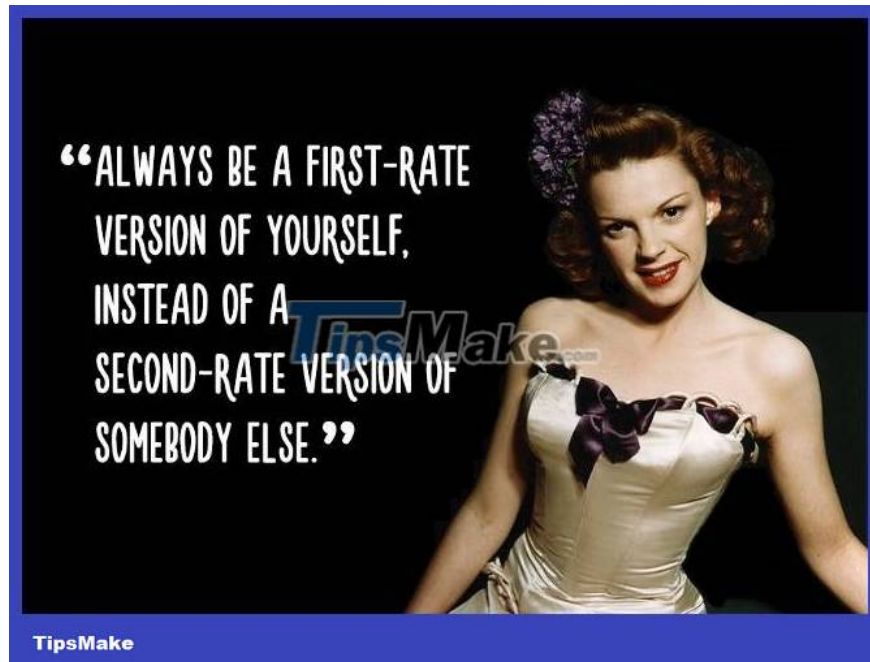

#4 Judy Garland

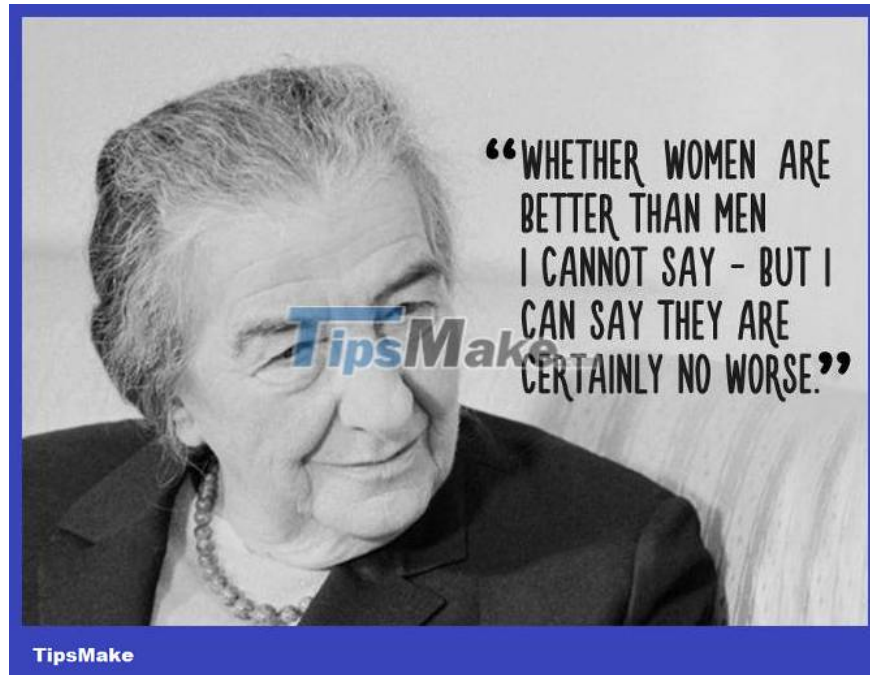

#5 Golda Meir

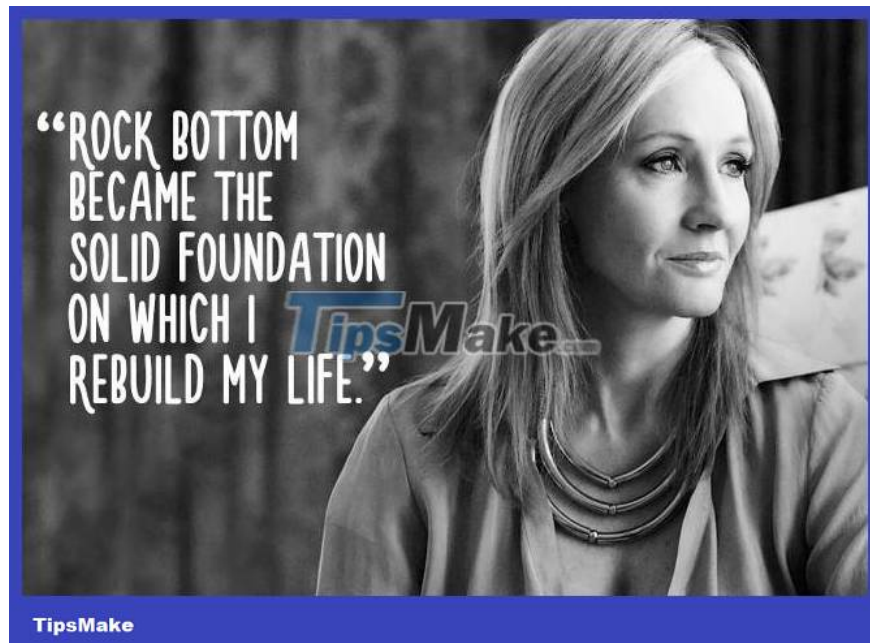


Golda Meir (*formerly Golda Meyerson, May 3, 1898 – December 8, 1978*) was an Israeli teacher, kibbutznik and politician, and the **fourth Prime Minister of Israel** since December 1974 . March 17, 1969, after serving as Secretary of Labor and Secretary of State. Golda Meir is the first woman in Israel and the third woman in the world to hold this position. Golda Meir has been described as the "*Iron Lady*" in Israeli politics since before this nickname was assigned to British Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher. Former Prime Minister David Ben-Gurion called Meir "*the best man in government*"; and is described as a "*strong-willed, straight-talking, grandmother of the Jewish people*".

#6 Jk Rowling

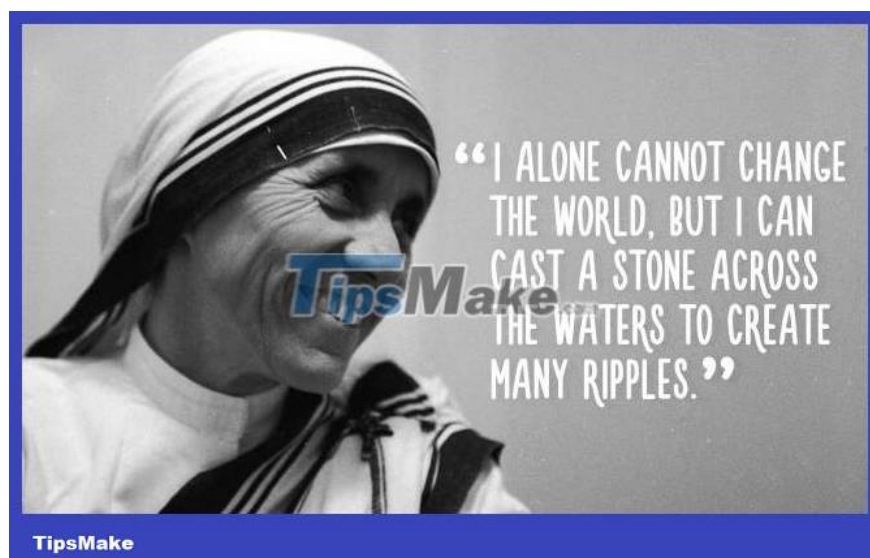

#8 Coco Chanel

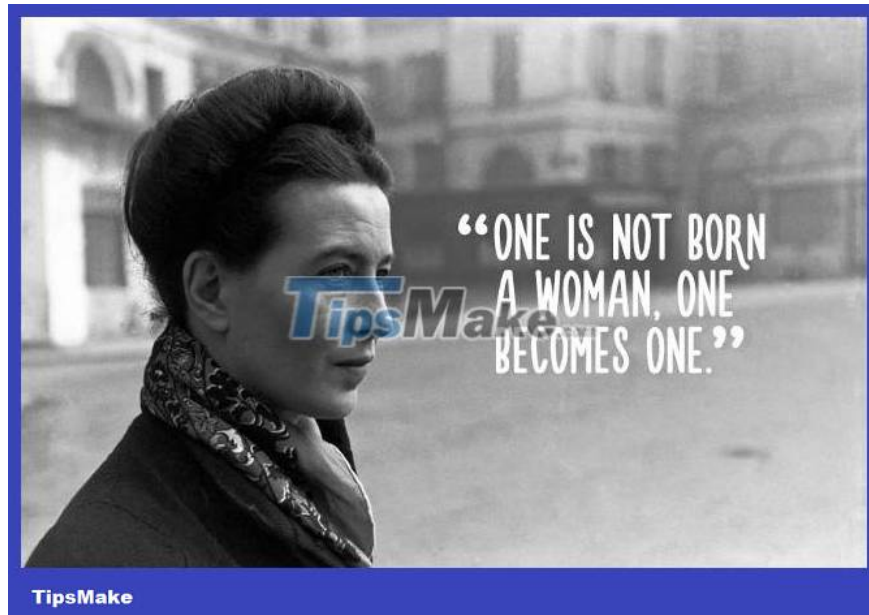

#9 Simone De Beauvoir

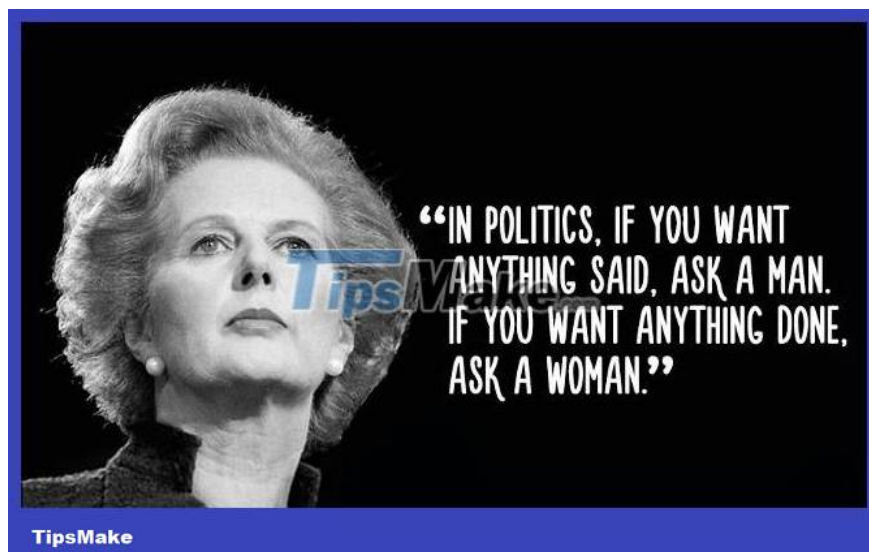

#11 Ellen Degeneres

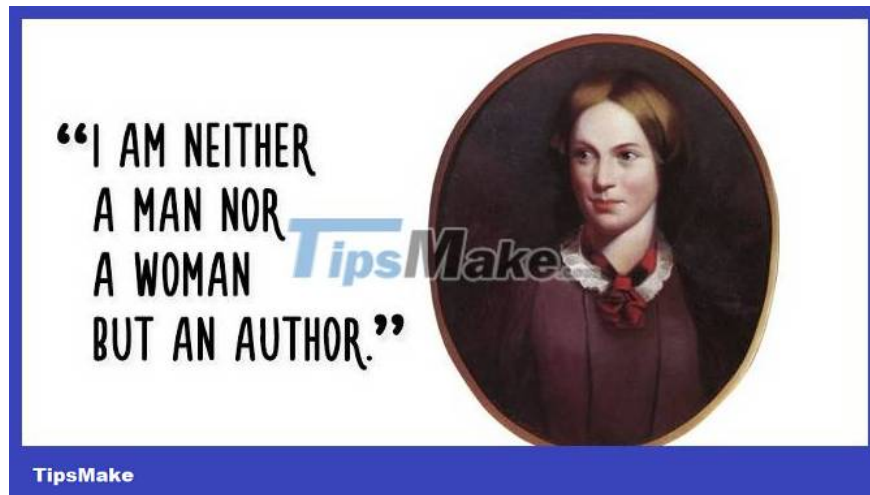

Charlotte's most famous work is *Jane Eyre*, first published in 1847 under the male pen name Currer Bell, because at that time, it was extremely difficult for female authors to publish books. After *Jane Eyre* was published, the Brontë family suffered three consecutive tragedies in just eight months: the death of the only son Branwell in the family, followed by Emily and Anne. Charlotte stopped writing for a while but then went on to write her second work, *Shirley*. She considered it the only way to escape her great pain.

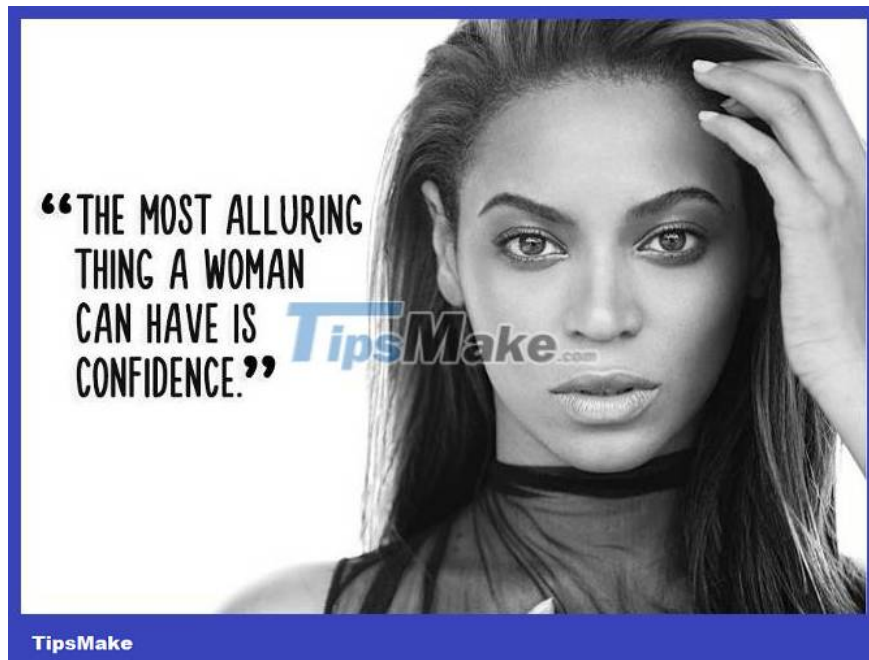
