Step 1:

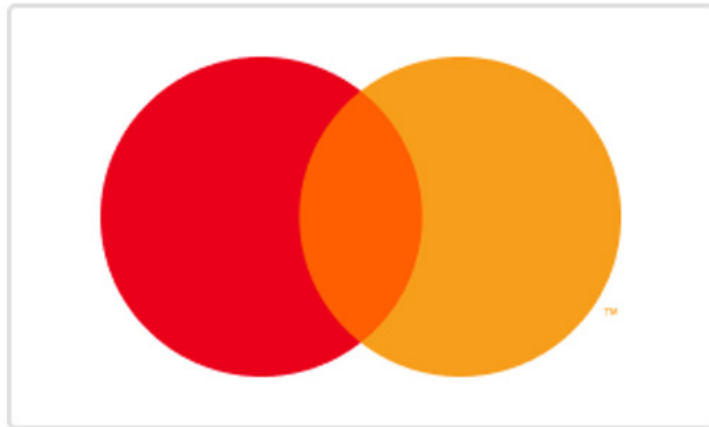
Step 3:

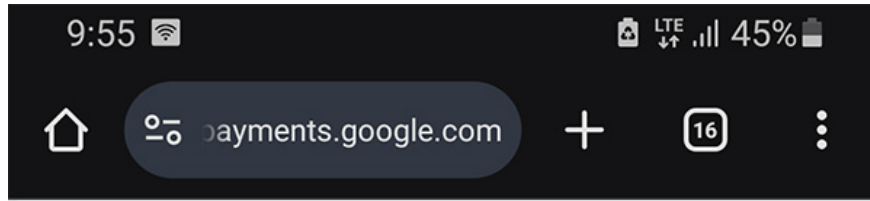

Finally you confirm the prompt and remove the payment method from your Google Play account and you are done.

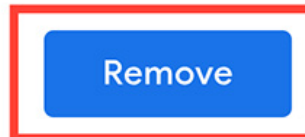
