Basically, there is a very simple way to buy and activate a license for Windows 10, but the license cost is not cheap, which is the reason why users have this problem.



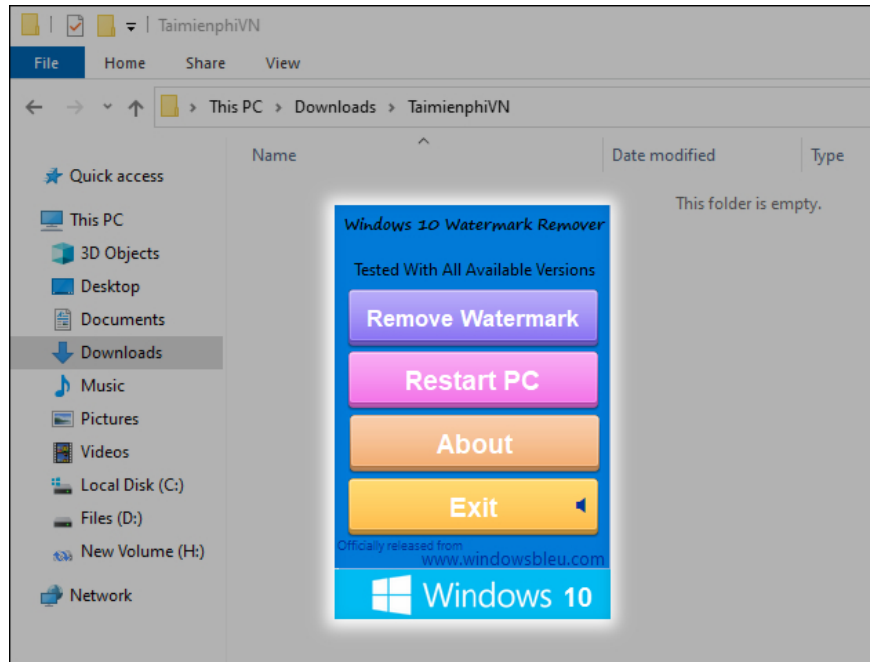
Delete the copyright notice in the right corner of the Windows 10 screen

1. Use Windows 10 Watermark Remover



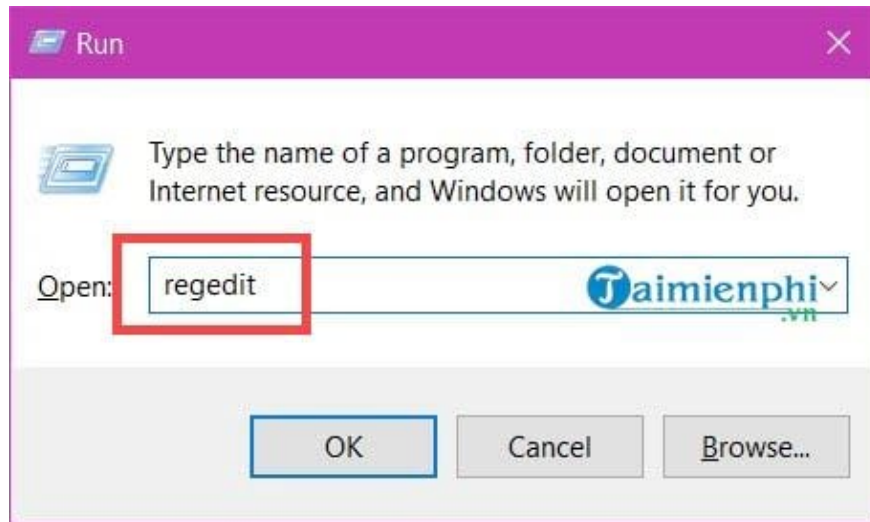
Windows 10 Watermark Remover is a special software that allows you to remove the copyright notice on the right corner of the Windows 10 screen in the simplest way. However, it only deletes the copyright notice in the right corner of the Windows 10 screen, not helping you activate your Windows 10 license. Basically, in addition to losing the text notice in the right corner of the screen, you will not be able to activate it. adds a feature, but if you're just having trouble with that obnoxious display text, use Windows 10 Watermark Remover to remove it.



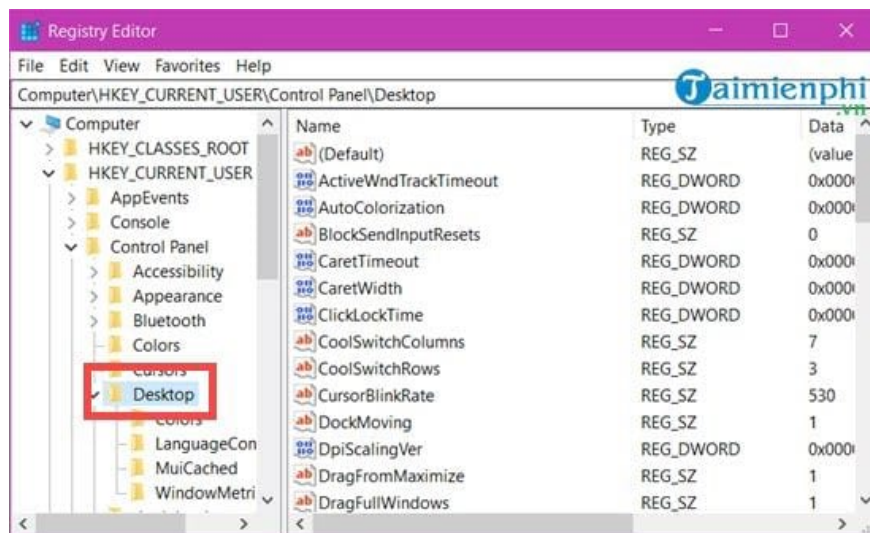
2. Use the Registry to delete the copyright request notice.

In addition to using Universal Watermark Disabler software to remove the copyright notice on the right corner of the Windows 10 screen, another option is to use the Registry and find a Key item named **PaintDesktopVersion** .

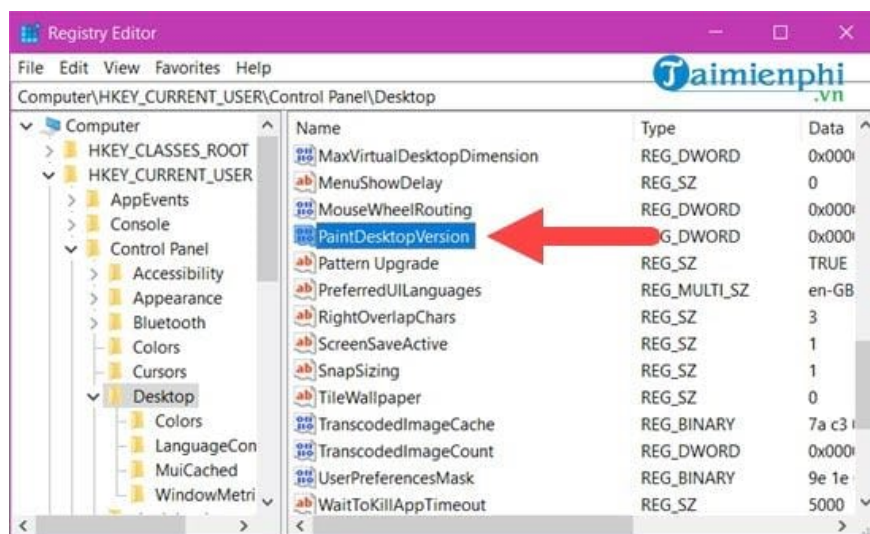
Step 1: To delete the copyright notice in the right corner of the Windows 10 screen with Registry, you must first access this tool. Press the **Windows + R** key combination then type **Regedit** and click OK to open.



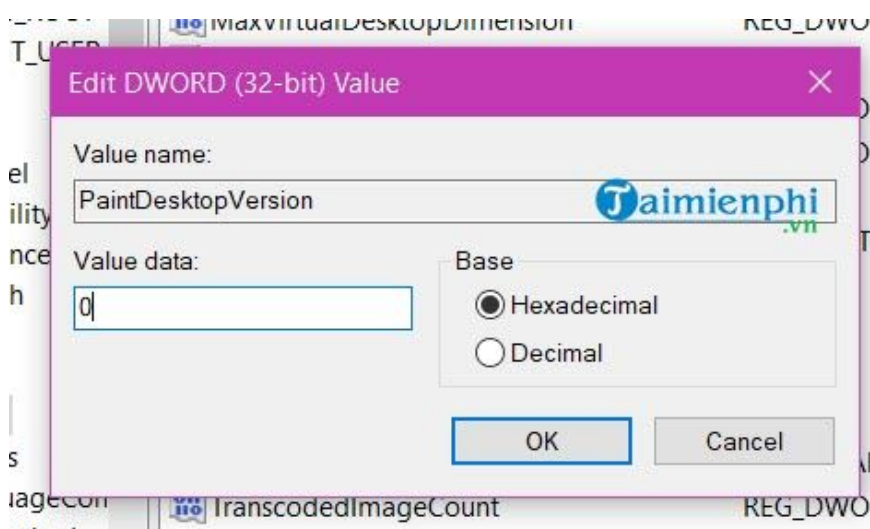
Step 2: In the Registry Editor interface, we access **HKEY_CURRENT_USER > Control Panel >** and access the **Desktop** folder .



Step 3: Here you look to the right to find a file named **paintDesktopVersion** , double click on that file to open it.



Step 4: Here you just need to change its value to 0 to remove the copyright notice in the right corner of the Windows 10 screen.



Please note that this method is not permanent, recovery time cannot be determined because it depends entirely on
