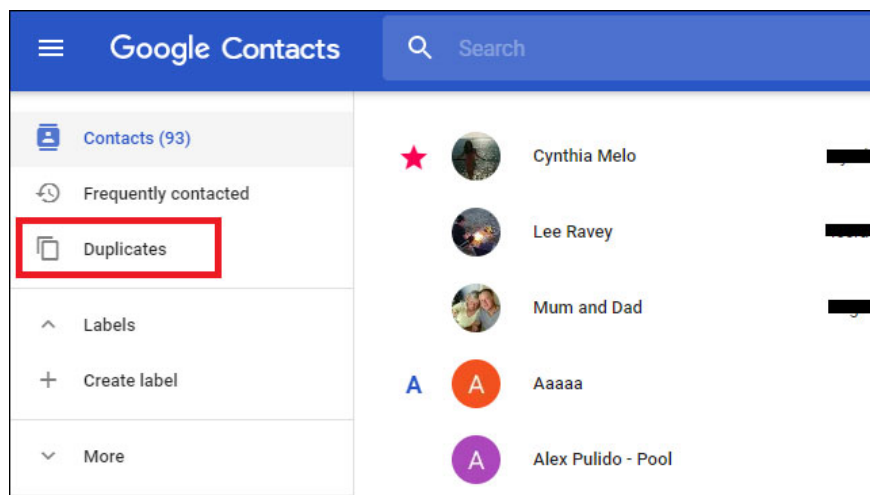

How to find and merge duplicate contacts in Google

First, you need to access contacts.google.com and sign in with your Google account login.

In the left panel of the screen, click **Duplicates**.



The duplicate contacts will be listed here. The process will use the name field, phone number and email address.

Click **Merge All** if you accept all Google exports automatically or check the boxes next to the relevant items and click **Merge** if you want to merge manually.

Your changes will be reflected in Google's ecosystem: on Android, Gmail phones and any other Google services.

If your contacts contain multiple duplicate contacts, follow the steps above to merge them!
