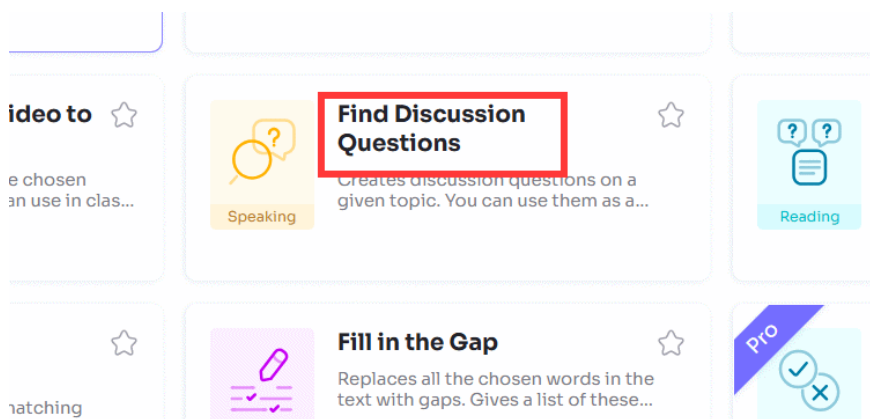
How to create discussion questions for English lessons on Twitter

Step 1:

First, teachers should click on the link below to access the Twee website and then register an account to use it.

At this point, you will see a lot of teaching support content; teachers **should click on "Find Discussion Questions"** .





Step 2:

To access the new review question setup interface, first enter the discussion content using the topic name or the specific content that the teacher wants to cover.

Step 3:

In the Target Vocabulary section, teachers enter the vocabulary they want to use, whether related to the question or not, and then **click "Do the magic"** to proceed.

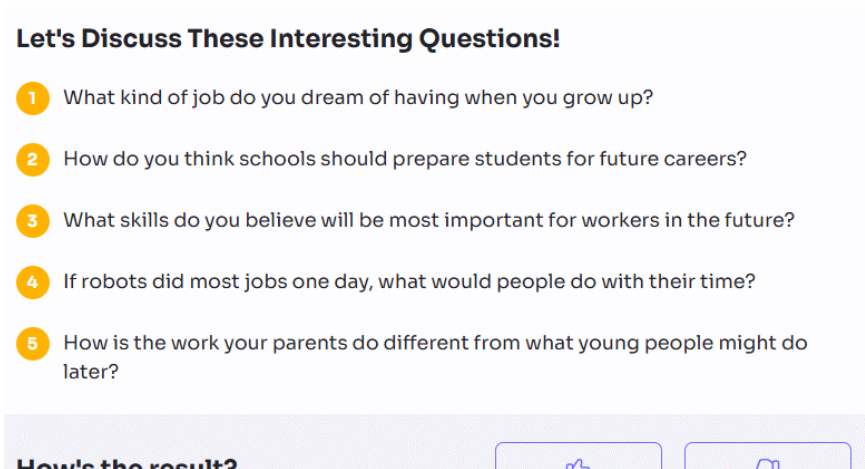

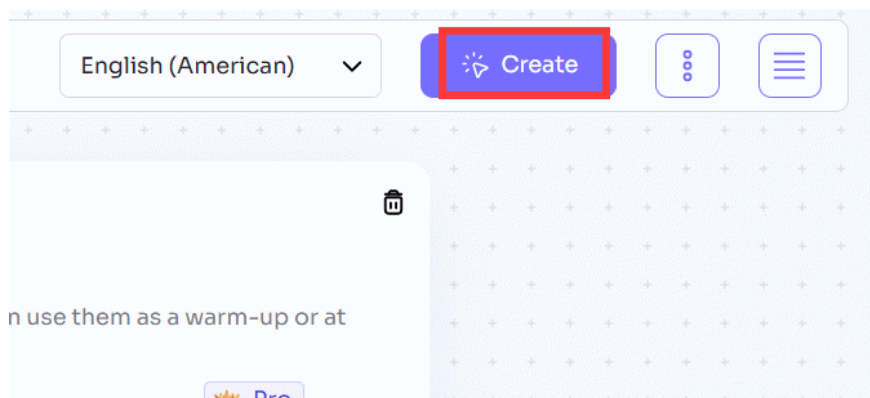

At this point, you will see the discussion question created based on the topic you entered. Teachers can edit and copy it for use.

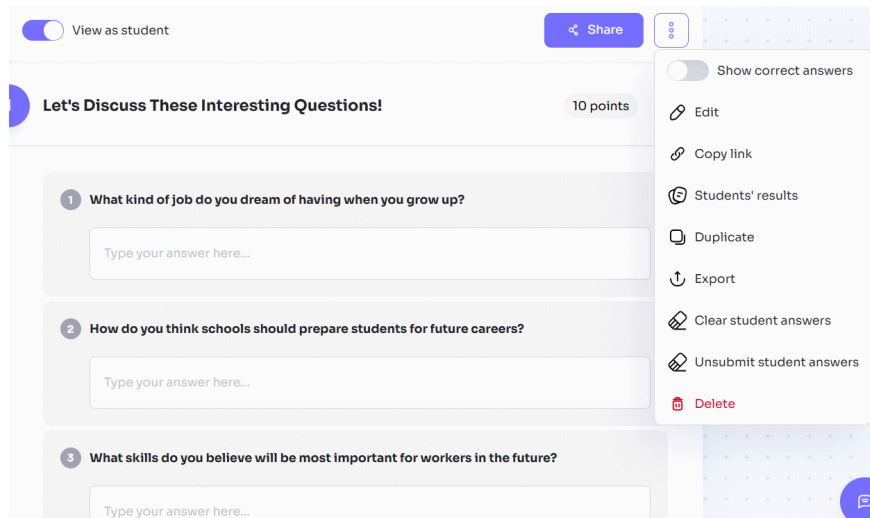


Step 4:

This content is then used to create a link for students to take the test. **Click "Create"** in the upper right corner to proceed with creating the test.



Then, teachers just need to click on the three-dot icon, copy the assignment link, and send it to students to complete and submit their answers.
