

Instructions on how to export saved passwords on Chrome browser into 1 file

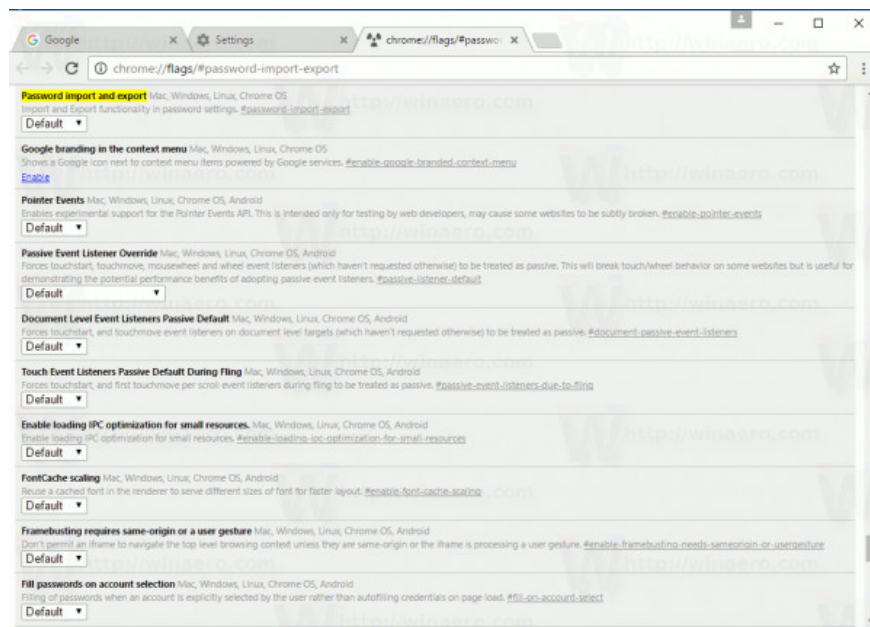
Latest update: This feature has been removed on Chrome 61. You have another way to retrieve your saved password on Chrome by signing in to your Chrome account to sync. After reinstalling Chrome, you only need to log in to this account to retrieve the saved passwords.

Export saved passwords on Google Chrome to 1 file

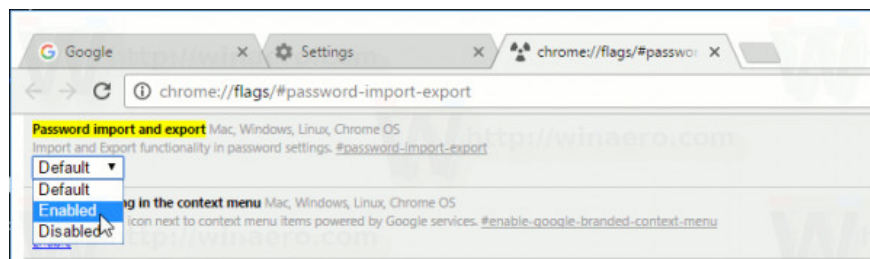
1. Open the Chrome browser on your computer, then enter the line below and the address bar:

```
chrome:// flags / # password-import-export
```

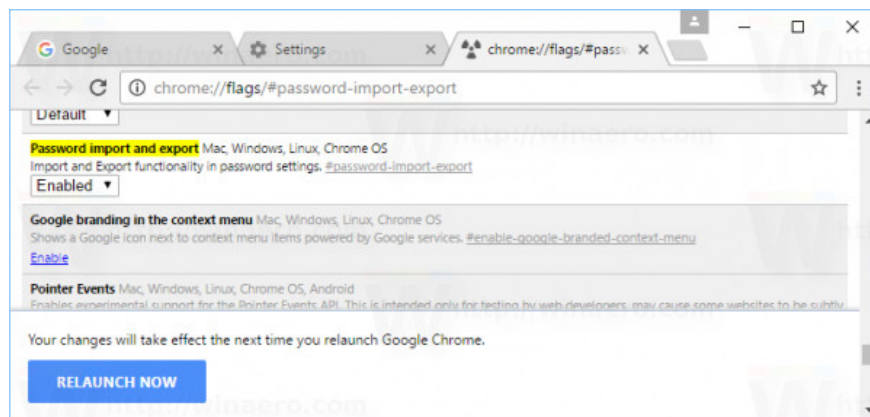
This is to open the flag page directly with the relevant settings.



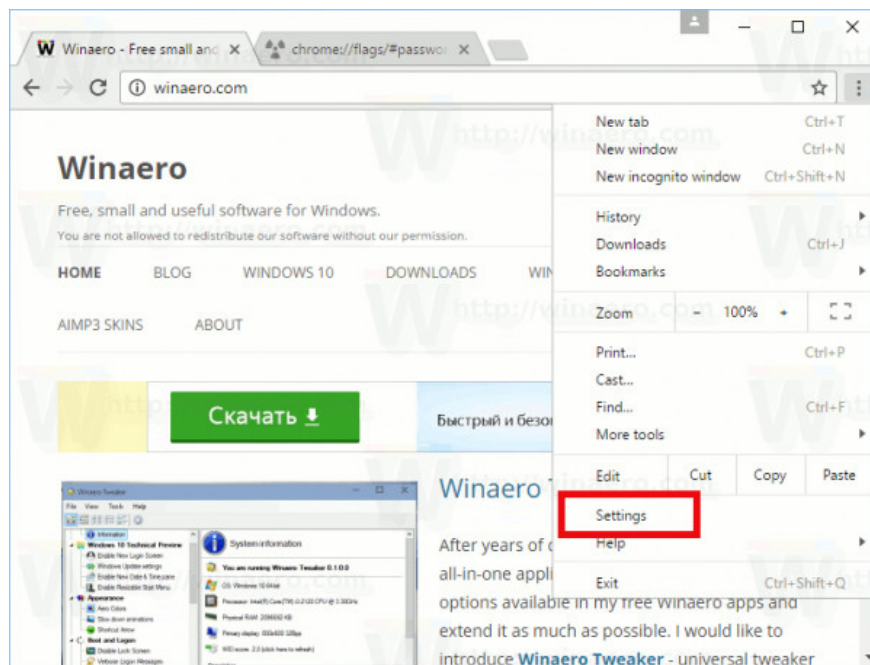
2. Here you find the setting named **Password import and export** . This option allows you to enable the export function and enter the password. You must enable this option by clicking **Enabled from the dropdown menu** .



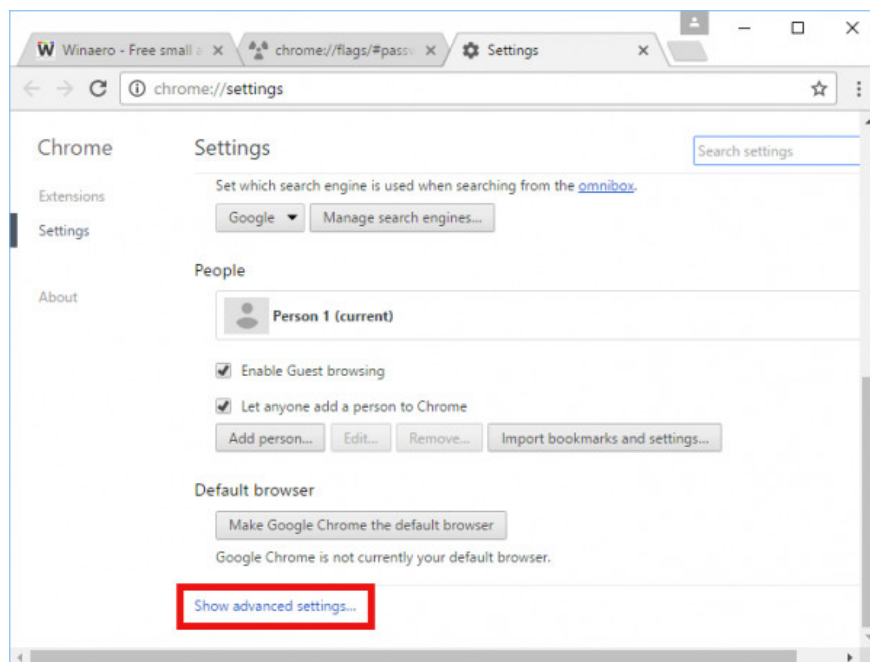
3. After changing the settings, click **Relaunch Now** to restart the browser.



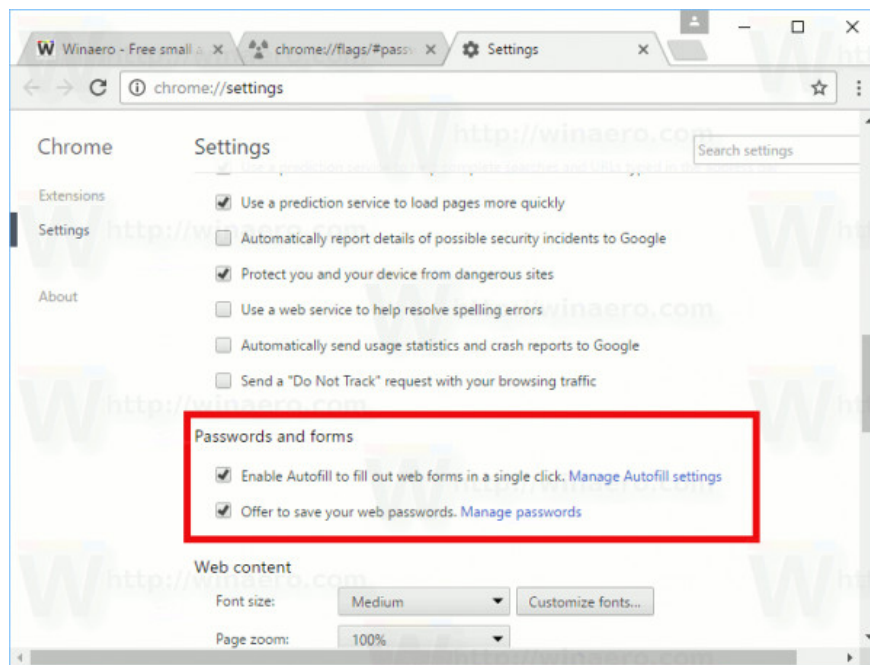
4. Next, click on the **3 dots** in the right corner of the browser window and click **Settings** .



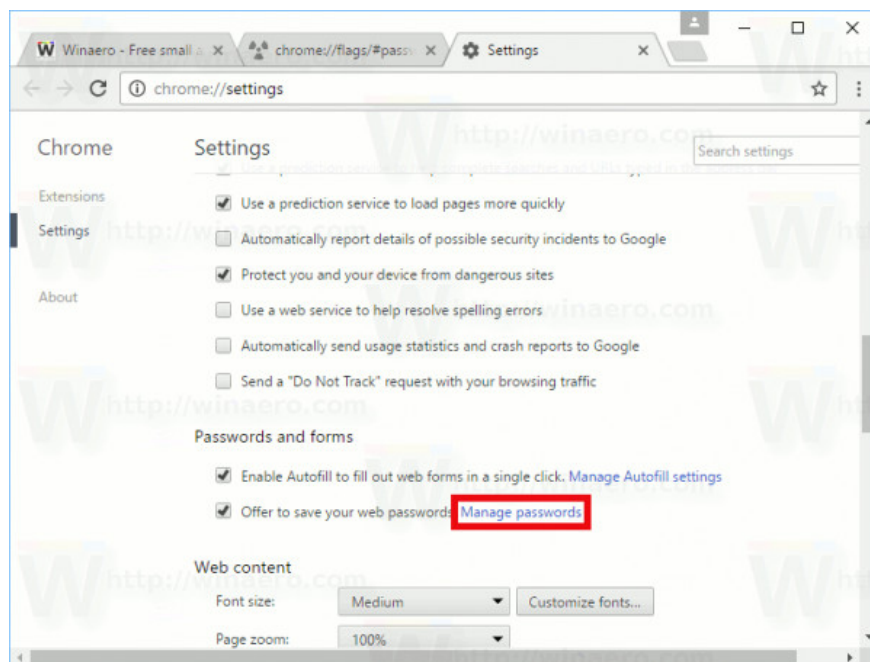
5. On the Settings window, find and click the " *Show advanced settings .*" link (*show advanced settings*).



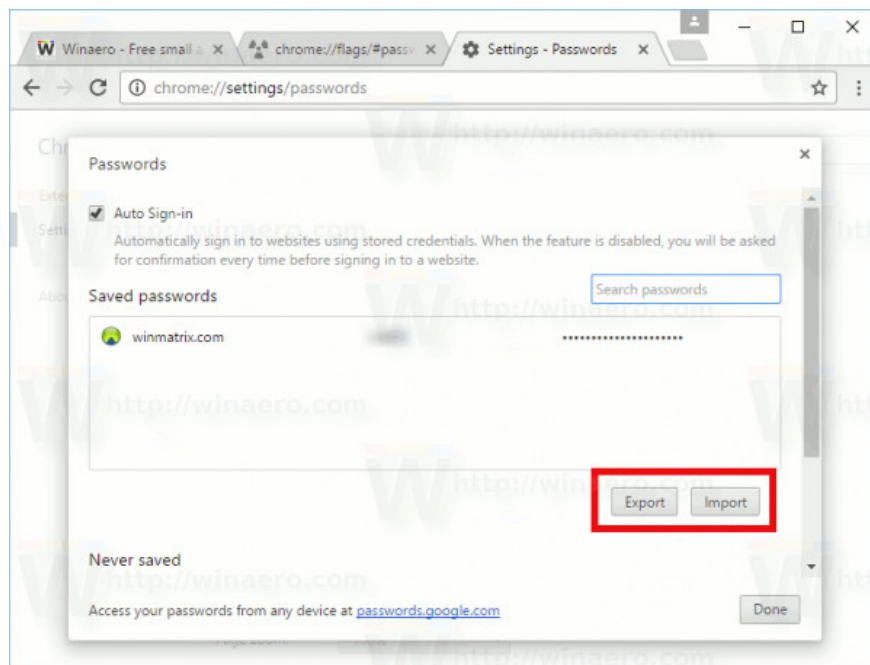
6. Here you find the " *Passwords and forms* " section:



7. Click **Manage passwords** .



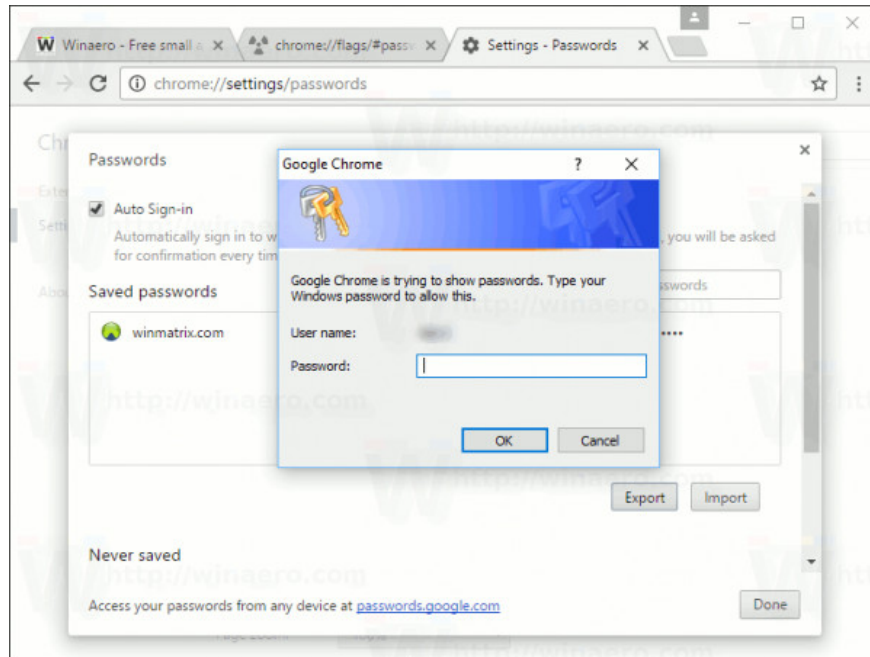
8. On the next dialog window, find the " *Export and* " *Import* "button below the list of saved passwords in Chrome browser.

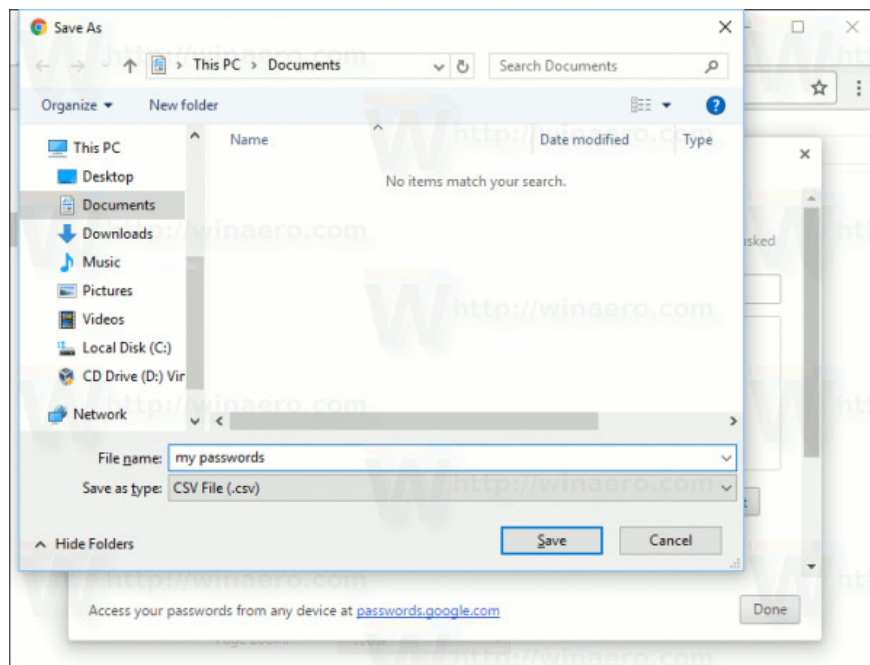


When you click the **Export** button, your password will be saved as a * **.CSV** file.

To ensure security, Chrome will ask you to enter your current Windows password. This is to protect your Chrome password from any other unauthorized user accessing your computer.

Your task is to **enter the password** and **specify the file** where the password is saved:





The CSV file will contain information such as: username (username), target URL, your username and password for the page. The stored password will not be encrypted, so you should store the file in a safe location or encrypt the file.
