Photographer Elias took at dawn, the moment the Sun was partially obscured by the Moon, so the image of the Sun rising out of the sea looked like a devil's horn.

Photographer Elias said that there was an interesting solar eclipse that day, so he planned and waited for the right time of dawn on the sea in the hope of capturing impressive images.

And the result was more than expected, photographer Elias captured the impressive and rare moment. When the Moon partially obscures the Sun, it glows red as the planet slowly emerges from the horizon and slowly rises above the sea. This causes the Sun to be split into two pieces like two "devil horns". As the Sun moves away from the horizon, we see it as a crescent.



According to scientists, the image of "devil horns" floating in the sea taken by photographer Elias is the Fata Morgana phenomenon, a rare and complex illusion that makes objects appear to be above the horizon. This phenomenon occurs due to the difference in temperature in the air, when light when passing through layers of air with different temperatures is bent. This interesting phenomenon once created images of ships that seemed to hover in the air above the water.
