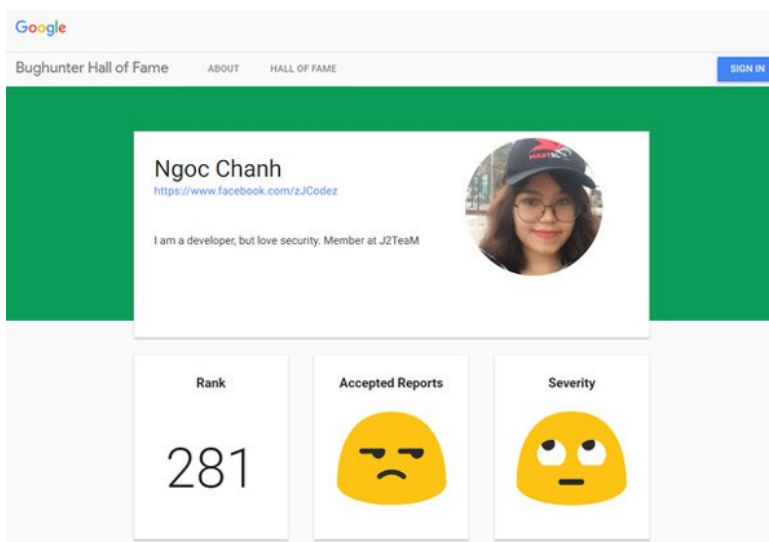


Interesting implication behind Google's \$ 3133.7 bonus for Vietnamese hackers

Killer is currently a full-time developer at a software company in Hanoi and also a member of the J2TEAM community. Killer reported and successfully demonstrated a security bug in Google Translate, a Google service that has more than 500 million users a day.

With his discovery, Killer was honored by Google and awarded the exact amount of \$ 3133.7. It is no coincidence that the technology giant offers such an odd and difficult-to-see bonus. In fact this is an implicit compliment from Google for the effort and talent of Killer, with stylized characters in the language "news" 31337 = eleet, synonymous with "elite", yes meaning elite.
