

January update makes Windows 10 lag and here is the solution

Many users were disappointed when the January 2022 update caused their Windows 10 computer to suffer a severe performance loss.

In the January 2022 update, Microsoft caused Windows computers to fail with LT2P VPN connections, causing domain controllers to restart repeatedly and preventing Hyper-V from starting. Then the software giant had to roll out urgent updates to the above problems.

But there is one thing that Microsoft has not mentioned. In fact, besides the problems on the January 2022 update with number KB5009543, it also causes Windows 10 computers to have serious performance problems. Issues reported by users include slow startup, slow response when opening the Start Menu, running applications, playing games, and most basic operating system functions.

Overall, Windows is very laggy after installing updates.



"Usually it only takes me about 2 minutes to open my laptop. But now it takes up to half an hour. I am extremely frustrated and am thinking of removing the update," user Ninja_Bobcat shared. on Reddit.

"This update ruined my ability to play games on my laptop, specifically Warzone and Apex. FPS dropped to 0 and lag everywhere," another user shared.

"My computer was extremely slow after installing the KB5009543 and KB5008876 updates. It took about 3 minutes to boot and about 2 to 3 minutes to open a Chrome tab. The update killed my computer already. ", wrote another Windows 10 user.

What is the solution?

Although it did not say, in fact, the emergency update that Microsoft released also solved the above performance issues. Now, users only need to install the Cumulative Update Preview update number KB5009596 to say goodbye to lag when playing games.

The problem is that KB5009596 is an optional update, so you need to check and install it yourself. Go to Settings > Windows Update and then click Check for Updates. If you see the update KB5009596, click Download and install.

It is expected that the upcoming improvements and fixes of KB5009596 will be included in the Patch Tuesday patch of February 2022 and will be automatically updated and installed.
