Sundar Pichai has the full name of Pichai Sundararajan and grew up in Chennai, India. Before the birth of Pichai and his younger brother, his father was an electrical engineer, and his mother was a shorthand writer. Pichai's family is not rich, so the two brothers' bedrooms are also the living room!

Sundar Pichai was soon discovered by his family the ability to remember all the phone numbers he had ever called. Currently, sometimes he also shows that talent at meetings before his colleagues' surprise.

After turning his attention to the computer, the first software program Sundar Pichai wrote was a chess game. In the past, Pichai studied metallurgical engineering at the Kharagpur Institute of Technology in India and won a study abroad scholarship at Stanford.

According to Sundar Pichai in a recent interview, moving to California was a big leap in his career life: "*I have always loved technology and when I grew up I had a dream of working in Silicon Valley, because I've read about it and heard stories from my uncle.*"



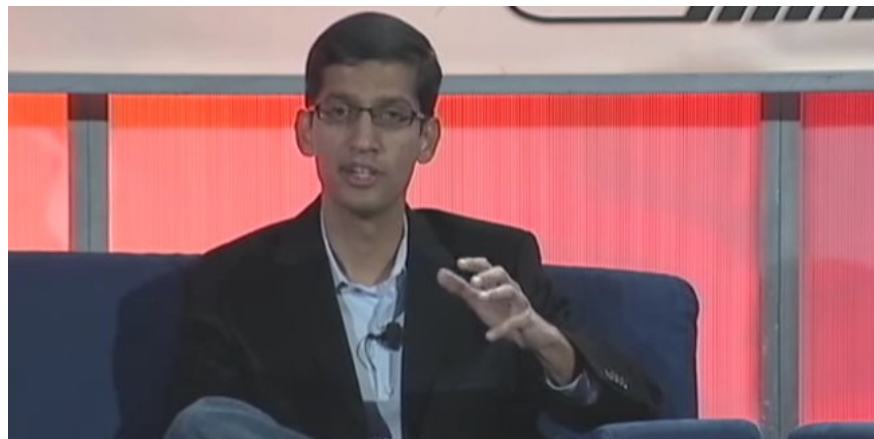

When he arrived in the US, Pichai could not believe that everything was so expensive, for example, that the backpack had a price of \$ 60. Besides, Pichai also missed his girlfriend Anjali, eventually married, giving birth to a son and a daughter.

After graduating from Stanford University, Pichai went on to study an MBA program at Pennsylvania's Wharton University. Before joining Google, Pichai worked at McKinsey & Co., a consulting and application materials company.

On the April 2004 fishing day, Pichai interviewed at the Googleplex, which was also the day the company launched the Gmail service. Everyone, including Pichai, thought that the free email service was one of Google's " *infamous hoaxes* ." After that, Pichai started working on Google's search toolbar.

In 2006, after Microsoft decided to put the default search engine on Internet Explorer to Bing, Pichai helped Google convince computer manufacturers to install their hardware toolbars to minimize the influence at this change.

That Internet Explorer failure led to a great achievement for Pichai. Pichai is the one who convinced the founders Larry Page and Sergey Brin to build their own web browser. The result is extremely surprising when Chrome now becomes the most popular choice on the Internet.

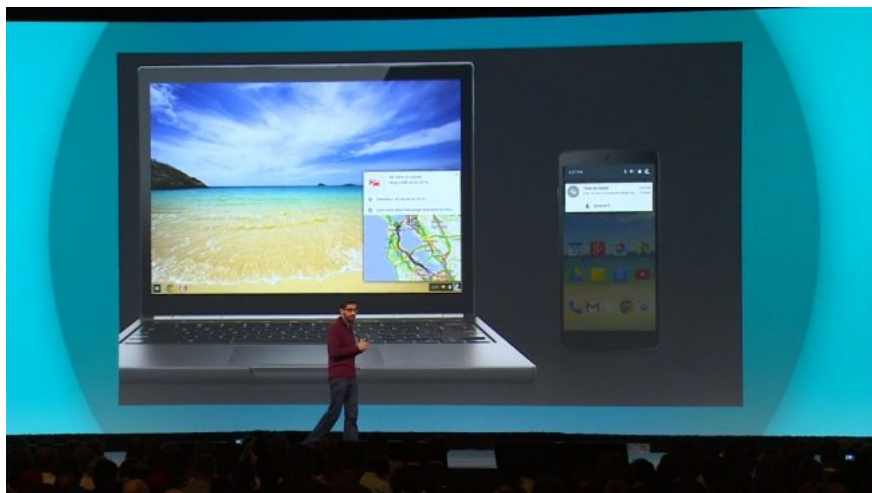

After nearly a year of organizational structure, it is not surprising that Pichai is responsible for core products and exploits to make Google grow stronger.



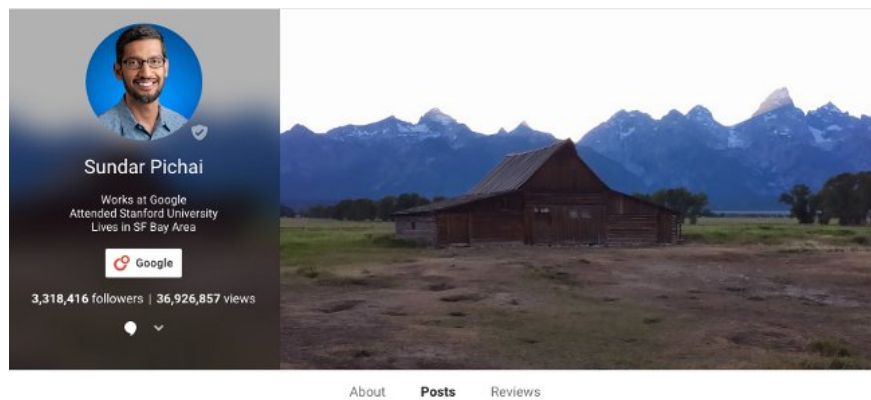

Pichai is a favorite leader at Google, who often focuses on results rather than personal ego. Since becoming Google CEO, the number of people known to him has increased significantly. One employee shared on Quora forum: " *In Google, Pichai is respected by everyone. The engineers, product managers and entrepreneurs love him very much.* "

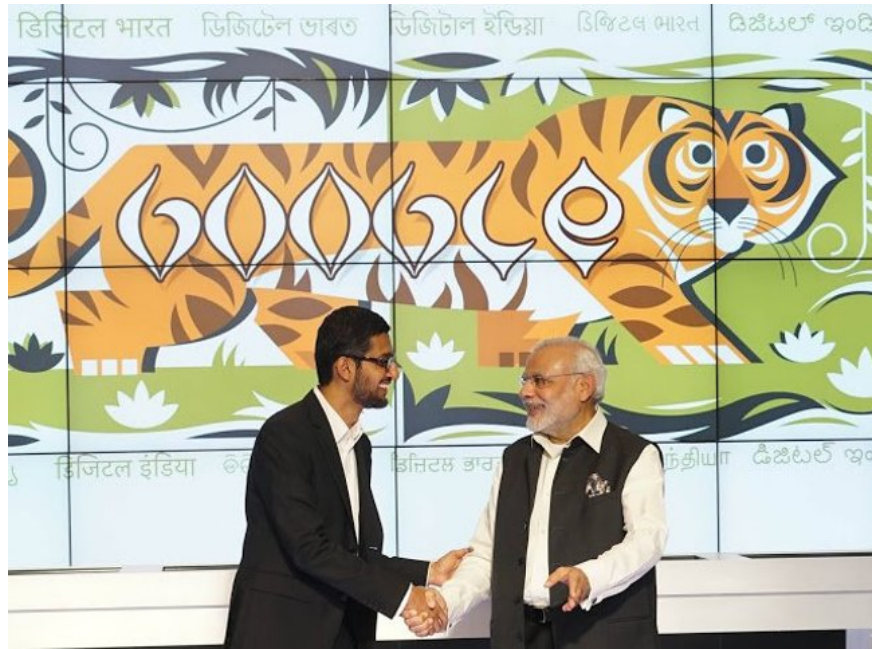
