

# Laptop keyboard not working: effective solutions

Laptop keyboard not typing letters or numbers: What are the causes and how to fix a non-functioning laptop keyboard? This article will reveal the details.

## Why can't I type numbers or letters on my laptop keyboard?

*The problem of a laptop keyboard not typing numbers or letters can be caused by various factors, including hardware , software , or unintended activation of Num Lock or Scroll Lock . Specifically, these include the following causes:*

1. **Stuck keyboard:** The keyboard is stuck due to dirt, spills, or damaged keys, resulting in the keys not working.
2. **Faulty keyboard driver:** Incorrect driver installation or faulty operating system updates can prevent the computer from recognizing the keyboard.
3. **Activate Num Lock or Scroll Lock:** When Num Lock or Scroll Lock is activated, the keyboard will be unable to type numbers or letters.

## Troubleshooting a laptop keyboard that won't type.

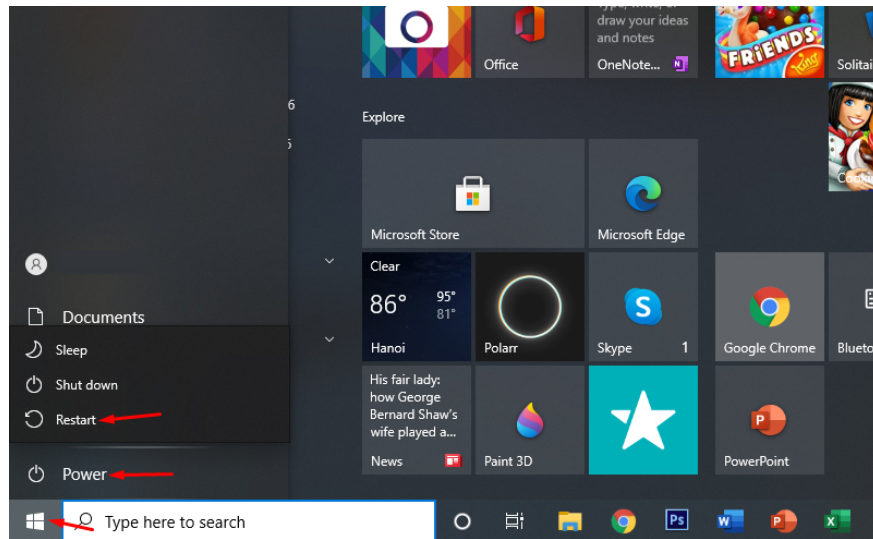
*To fix a non-functioning laptop keyboard, you should check the NumLock key , restart your laptop , update the keyboard driver , reinstall the laptop keyboard software , clean the keyboard , and check the connection . If you have tried all of the above methods and the laptop still cannot type numbers or letters, the keyboard may be damaged, and you should take it to a repair center.*

### Check the NumLock key.

If your keyboard isn't typing numbers, the problem might be with the NumLock key. Therefore, check your keyboard and turn on the 'NumLock' key until the indicator light turns green; then you should be able to type.

### Restart your laptop.

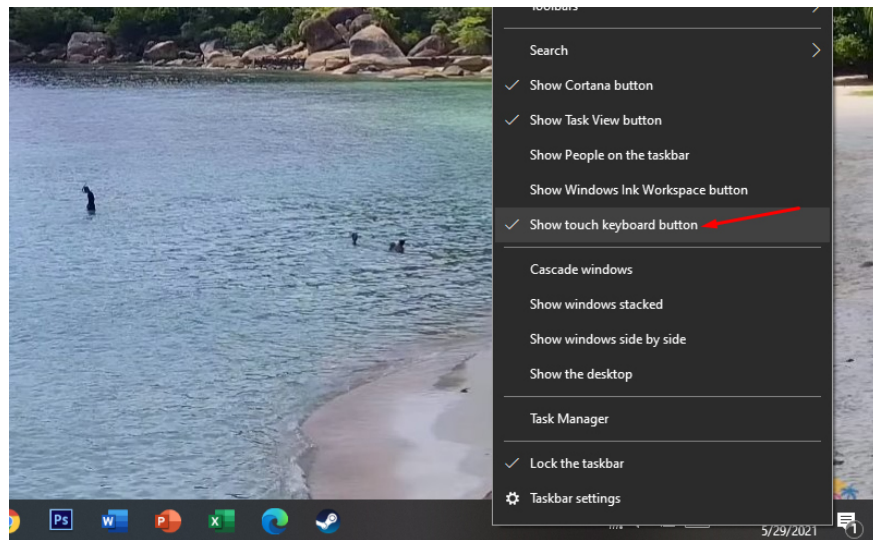
The simplest way to fix this error is to restart your laptop. Restarting will help the laptop recognize the keyboard driver. Press the **Start button or the Power Restart** button .



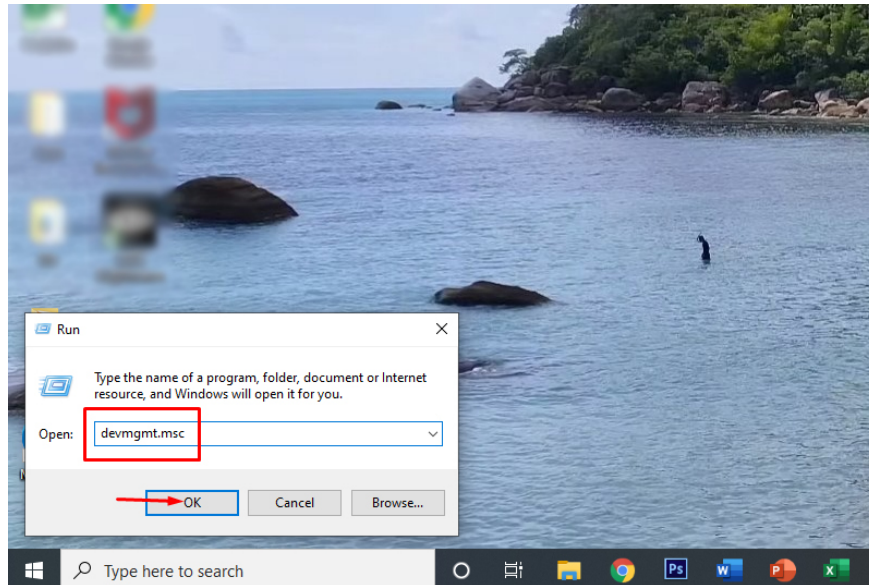
## Update your keyboard driver on Windows 10.

To fix a computer keyboard that isn't typing, you should update your keyboard driver on Windows 10 by doing the following:

**Step 1 :** Open the virtual keyboard by **right-clicking on the Taskbar and selecting "Show touch keyboard button"** . The keyboard icon will appear. Click on that icon to open the virtual keyboard.



**Step 2 :** Press **Windows + R** on your virtual keyboard to open **Run** , type the command **devmgmt.msc**, and **click OK** .



**Step 3 :** The Device Manager window appears. Click on **Keyboards** , then **right-click** on **Standard PS/2 Keyboard** and select **Update driver** .

**Step 4 :** Select "**Search automatically for drivers**" to allow Windows to search for and install new drivers or update existing drivers for your laptop.

## **Cleaning your laptop keyboard**

Accumulated debris and dust can jam keys, rendering your laptop keyboard unresponsive. Therefore, you should clean your keyboard using a soft brush to remove dust and compressed air to dislodge any trapped dirt. Then, use a clean cloth to wipe the key surfaces and clean any narrow gaps. Finally, try pressing the keys again to check if the keyboard is working properly.

## **Reinstall your laptop keyboard.**

If your laptop keyboard isn't working, you can try resetting it, which includes the following steps:

**Step 1 :** Go to **the Start Menu > Settings** .

**Step 2 :** Here, select the **Ease of Access** option .

**Step 3 :** Scroll down and select **Keyboard Filter Keys, Ignore brief or repeated keystrokes, and change keyboard repeat rates to On** .

## **Unlock the keyboard using a shortcut.**

If your keyboard isn't working, it's not necessarily broken but accidentally locked. You can use the **Windows + Space** or **Shift + Esc** key combination to unlock it. Alternatively, on some models, the keyboard unlock

**function might be located on one of the F1-F12 keys .**

## **Take it to a reputable service center for repair.**

If you've tried all the above methods and nothing works, your laptop keyboard might be broken. You should take it to a reputable repair center for inspection and repair by qualified technicians.

## **How to test your laptop keyboard at home**

To fix a laptop keyboard that won't type, you need to quickly diagnose the problem. Below are some basic checks to identify the issue and then resolve the problem of a keyboard that won't type Vietnamese characters or all keys being unresponsive.

7. **Check the physical condition:** Look for keys that are sunken, uneven, warped, or show signs of having been exposed to water.

If a key is broken, deeply recessed, completely unresponsive, or warped due to impact, self-repair is almost impossible. These physical damages usually require a new keyboard to ensure stability and durability. This type of fault renders the laptop keyboard unusable in the long run.

### **Laptop still under warranty**

While your laptop is still under warranty, you should take it to an authorized service center for a free check-up and support. If the keyboard issue is covered under warranty, you will receive a replacement free of charge. This is a safe option and will prevent issues that could void your warranty later.

### **Tips to extend the lifespan of your laptop keyboard.**

If my new laptop's keyboard isn't working, is it a hardware problem?

Not necessarily. It's usually due to the driver, keyboard settings, or accidentally pressing the lock key. However, if you've tried everything and still can't type, you should check for warranty service.

Where is the NumLock key on a laptop?

The NumLock (or Num LK) key is usually located in the upper right corner of the numeric keypad (if present) on a laptop. On laptops without a separate numeric keypad, it may be integrated into another function key, often a letter or number key with a small NumLock symbol, activated by holding down the Fn key.

How do I keep the NumLock key always open in Windows?

There are three main ways to keep the NumLock key enabled when Windows starts:

1. In BIOS/UEFI: Go to BIOS/UEFI settings (press F2/Del during startup), find Boot Options or Advanced and set "NumLock State" to "On".
2. Modify the Registry: Open regedit, access HKEY\_USERS.DEFAULTControl PanelKeyboard, and change the value of "InitialKeyboardIndicators" to 2 (or 2147483650). (Caution is required when modifying the Registry).
3. Disable Fast Startup: Turn off "Turn on fast startup" in the Power Options of the Control Panel. Then enable NumLock, completely shut down the computer (Shift + Shutdown), and then restart it.

Does using an external keyboard affect the laptop?

No. Using an external keyboard is perfectly safe and won't harm your hardware. It's a temporary solution when your laptop keyboard isn't working.

How often should I clean my laptop keyboard to prevent problems?

Approximately once every 1-2 months. If the environment is dusty or the device is used frequently, more often cleaning is recommended.
