Simply put, the cloud is the Internet, more specifically it's all the things that you can access remotely over the Internet. When something is in the cloud, it means it's stored on Internet servers instead of your computer's hard drive or the internal memory of your mobile devices.

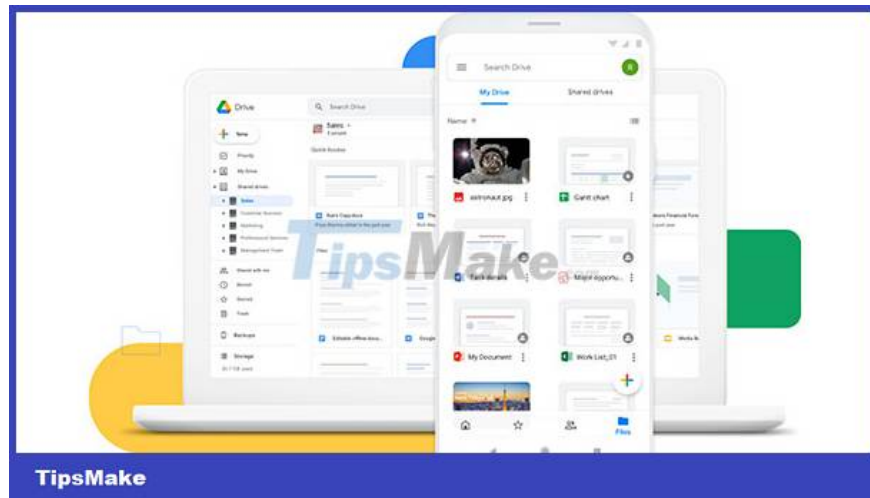
Why use the cloud?

Some of the main reasons to use the cloud are convenience and reliability. For example, if you have ever used a Web-based Email service - Web Mail, such as Gmail or Yahoo! Mail, which means you're already using the cloud. All Emails in the Web-based service are stored on the server and not on your computer's hard drive. This means you can access your Email from any computer or mobile device with an Internet connection. It also means that you will be able to recover your Email if something happens to your computer.

File storage - File storage

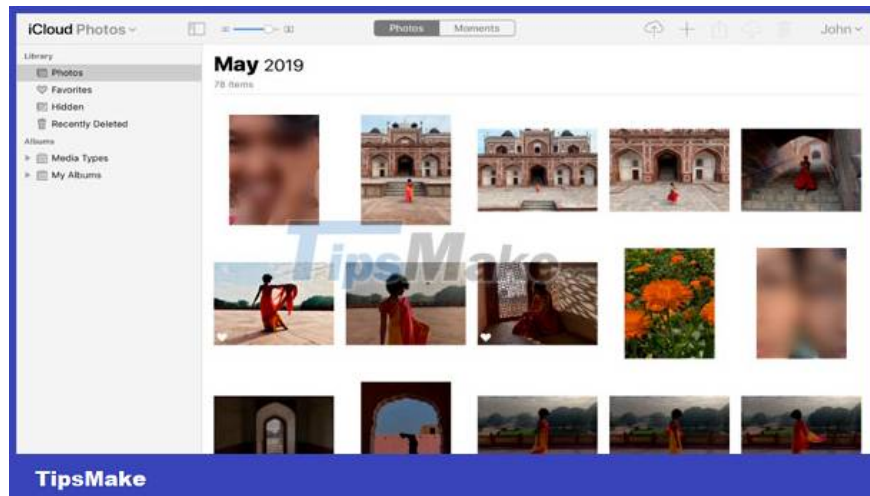

File sharing - File sharing

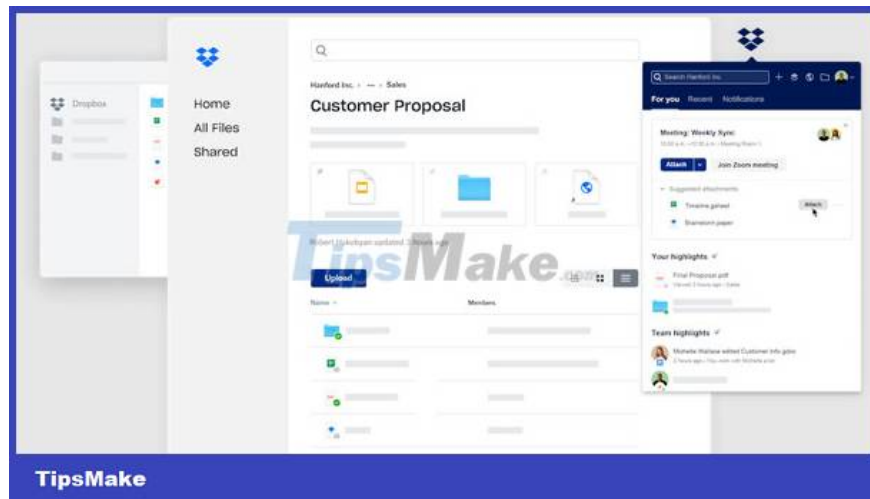

Data Backup - Backup

You can also use the cloud to protect your files. There are apps like Dropbox and Google Drive that will automatically back up your data to the cloud. This way, if your computer is lost, stolen or damaged, you can still recover these files from the cloud.



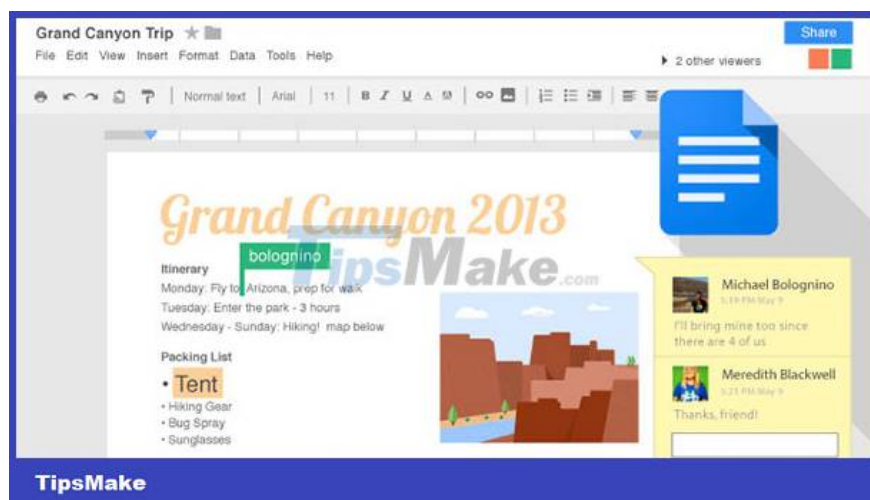
Dropbox Backup Service - Backup

What is a web application?
