Instead of public bug bounty programs, this guy mainly makes money through challenging personal tasks.

Every day, Lopez usually spend about 6, 7 hours to hack. So this is almost a full-time job like any other normal job. Whenever finding an error, Lopez achieves a great feeling.

This job helped Lopez earn the money to buy a house on the beach and two cars (Peugeot RCZ and Mini Cooper).
