Efficiency



Quicksilver

Quicksilver is a running application, able to browse to your file system, quickly transfer to email, quickly access via iTunes library and many other utilities.



Bean

If you're using a Mac and don't want to spend money to use and edit Microsoft Office files, Bean is a solution. This is a fast, lightweight document editing application that can open Word files. It's not a replacement for Word, but if you don't want to use too many Word features, Bean is a great option.



Notational Velocity

Notational Velocity is an application used to create, search, tag and synchronize notes via the web, computers or even your iPhone itself (can be synchronized with Dropbox or the application on the Simplenote web). If you always have to create notes, you will not hesitate to install this application once you have tried it.



TextWrangler

If you want a more powerful text editing application than Notational Velocity, the TextWrangler text editing application is a great tool for you to do the job.

Internet, communication



Firefox / Chrome

These two applications compete fiercely to become the official web browser on the Mac, and indeed, both applications are great. Google has removed the trial version of Chrome for Mac and released its first stable version. Meanwhile, Firefox still has some great features that can 'pull' you if we switch to using Chrome. Therefore, we recommend using both applications.



Adium

Adium is a multi-protocol instant messaging application used on many platforms. This application is fully customizable, works with most chat services you want.



Cyberduck

This open source application can connect and post, download files via FTP, SFTP, WebDAV, Amazon S3, and even Google Docs. The most impressive feature of Cyberduck is that it is too long to move down. If you think you should pay to be able to use stable FTP on your Mac, consider Cyberduck first.



Fluid

If you use web applications more than desktop applications, this free open source tool can create a separate application for any website you visit. With user scripts and tweaks, Fluid's own website for you can display Growl notifications, Dock badges and make your web apps look like apps that run on your computer screen.

Services



The Unarchiver

The built-in Archiver Utility on the Mac is not bad, but if you regularly use popular RAR files, the Archiver Utility can hardly meet your needs. In this case, you'll have to 'rely on' Unarchiver. This application is capable of extracting all common compressed files like RAR, TAR, 7Z, Stuffit and most other compressed files.



uTorrent / Transmission

Every time you download anything on Mac via BitTorrent, you will need to use open source Transmission. However, just a few days ago, uTorrent - the popular BitTorrent in Windows - updated to version 1.0. This is probably a worthy replacement for Transmission, although many people think Transmission is better.



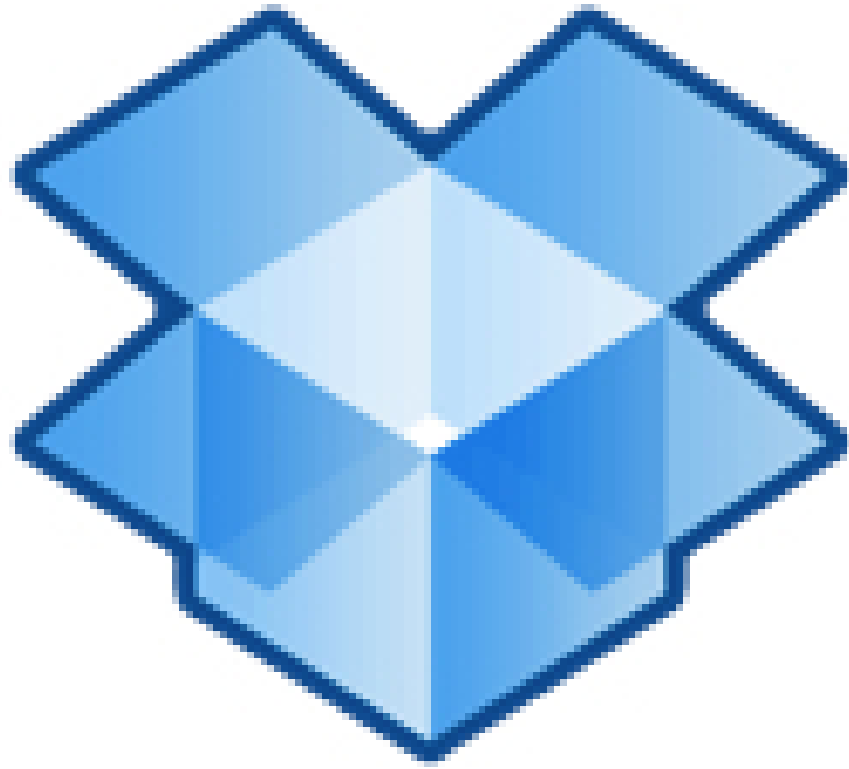
Burn

Built-in Disk Utility in OS X runs quite well in burning ISO files and other files. However, the open source Burn application is a secondary utility to help you reduce burning tasks. Burn stores data, audio, video and disc copies on a user-friendly interface.



Growl

Growl is a full system notification tool that displays system notifications and is able to integrate with almost all popular Mac applications (including the entire application in the article list). this). With the same notification and usability as other applications, it's hard to believe that it hasn't been integrated into OS X.



Dropbox

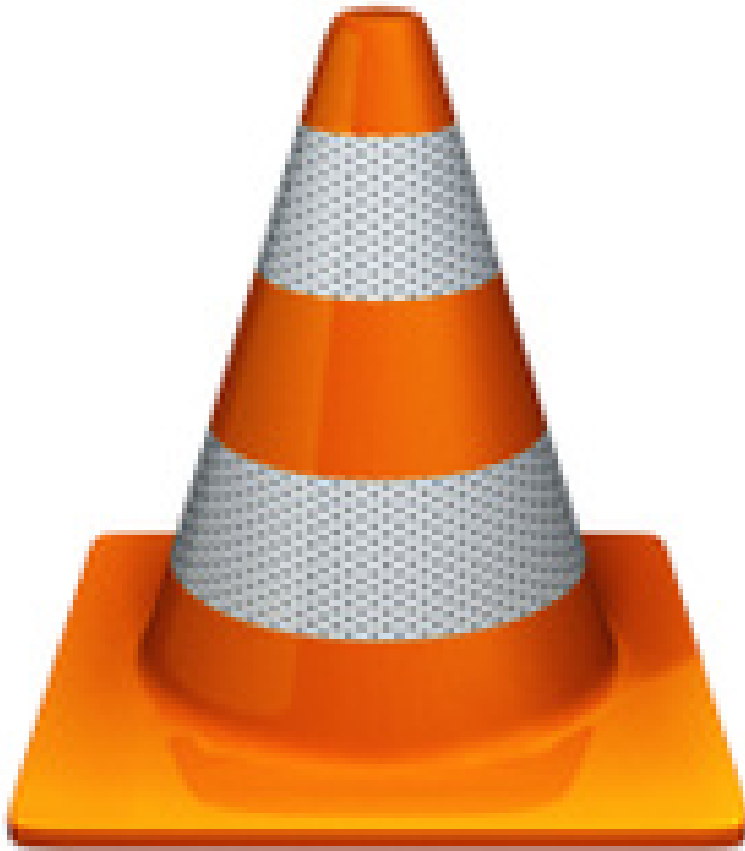
This utility will create a Dropbox folder into the user directory and immediately synchronize all the files you add, edit or delete from this folder, to Dropbox's cloud server or sync to the Other computers have Dropbox installed. If you often have to switch back and forth between two computers or just want a way to access and back up some important files, Dropbox is the application you need.



Mozy

If you want to back up important documents, Mozy is an application you should use. The latest version of Mozy can back up and retrieve data with impressive ease of use. You can backup online when using this service with 2GB of free storage or for just \$ 5 a month, you can backup online with unlimited storage. We don't expect you to open your wallet, but Mozy's unlimited online backup service is worth the money.

Media



VLC

Throw all the video and audio files you have into VLC and this program will run all files, regardless of the file format. Although not as eye-catching as QuickTime, VLC is still the media player software that received much appreciation.



iTunes

Maybe iTunes will be the most controversial application on this list. Some people like it, some hate it, but the fact remains the same: if you use Apple products, iTunes will be the 'substance to connect' all your media together. In addition, if you own an iPhone or iPod or iPad, this is still the first priority application.



Seashore

Photoshop is the leading standard for photo editing. However, if you just want to use some photo editing utilities, you also don't want to spend a lot of hard drive space, ram, Seashore is a small utility tool you should use.



Picasa

If you feel iLife's default photo management software, iPhoto doesn't satisfy you, Google's Picasa will meet your requirements. This software has a lot of utilities that iPhoto has, plus the ability to interact with Google accounts and Picasa Web Albums online.



Handbrake

Want to rip a DVD to your hard drive with high quality, lightweight format that can be carried? Try using Handbrake's extremely popular and handy application.
