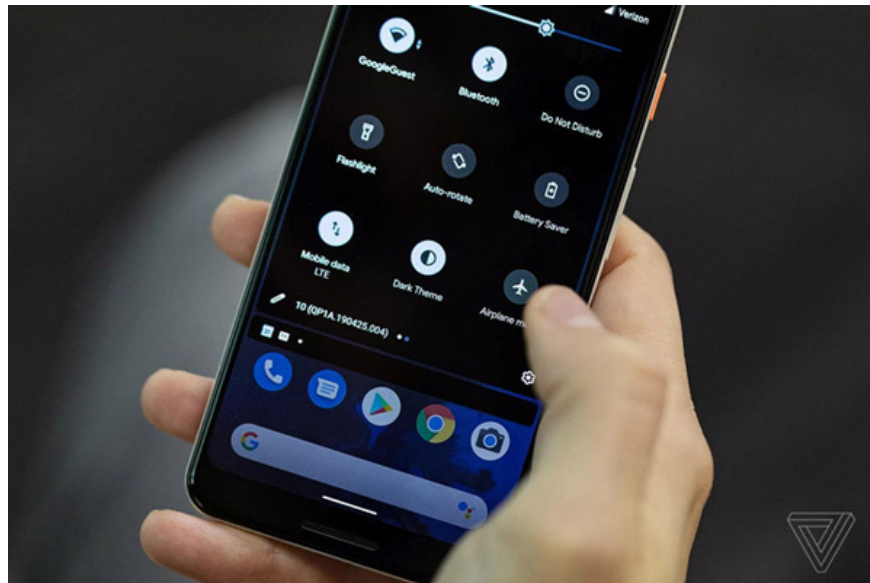


List of the first smartphones to receive Android Q updates

At the Google I / O 2019 event, Google announced the Android Q update, the latest version of the Android operating system, with many major changes. The most prominent is the removal of the familiar Back button, instead users will use gestures to navigate.

In addition, Google also made many improvements on Android Q to provide a better experience for users such as support for dark mode, smoother sharing features, and a more explicit authorization system. .
