## How big a difference can a low angle shot make?

However, by crouching down and shooting from above, you can make an ordinary tree look like a majestic giant. And the same effect can even be used on people to give them a sense of heroism.

## How to take great low angle photos

While low-angle photography is simple, there are a few extra tips that can help you take things to the next level.

### Use the viewfinder wisely

The first and most basic tip is to use your viewfinder wisely. While you should do this with every shot, making sure you line up your subject properly and take into account everything you're shooting, it's even more important with low-angle shots.

This is because it is very easy to get the low angle shot wrong. If you miss the mark, the results will be disappointing. So make sure you have everything aligned and composed correctly by looking into the viewfinder before clicking the virtual shutter button.

## **Focus on a specific subject**

The best low-angle photos focus on a specific subject. Sure, you can include other elements in the photo, but the subject should be the clear star of the photo, with everything else playing a supporting role.



Low-angle photography adds drama to a photo, so there needs to be a main character in every photo. Use secondary elements to provide context and nuance without detracting from the grandeur of the main subject.

## **Take multiple photos from different angles**

Although all low-angle shots should obviously be taken from a low angle, there are many different angles that can be adjusted. When shooting from a low angle, always take multiple shots from slightly different positions.

This is because you can't always rely on the best view through the viewfinder. Get lower, aim higher, move the phone left and right, basically just take a bunch of shots and you can choose later.

## **Use interesting shapes and lines**

???????Last but not least, it's important to look for interesting lines and shapes when shooting from low angles. Both of these can help with the composition of any photo, but they're especially helpful when shooting low-angle shots.



Why? Because low-angle shots require the viewer to be drawn into the photo. Both leading lines and interesting shapes help with that, providing visual cues that the human eye naturally follows.

1. Large objects
2. Animal
3. Human
4. Nature
